By Way of Introduction



THE visitor to Hamilton is usually taken to the brow of Mount Hamilton and permitted a bird's-eye view of the city. He sees the large factory buildings with their numerous stacks, each bearing witness to a tremendous industrial activity ; he distinguishes many imposing buildings--churches, schools, civic institutions and business structures ; the parks, the well paved streets are pointed out to him--also the beautiful scene of bay and beach in the distance.


