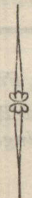

The Regimental Divisions of Prescott and Russell have been united Regimentally, and the Battalion to be furnished by them conjointly is so named. Under the Militia General Order of the 13th December, 1864, a Ballot was ordered to take place on the 30th of the same month, and 48,495 men were called for. The aggregate strength was apportioned amongst the various Regimental Divisions, and divided into 61 Regiments of Service Militia, consisting each of 795 Non-Commissioned Officers and Privates. In Upper Canada no appointments of Officers have yet been made to the Service Militia.

The Total number of Militia men in Upper Canada, as returned on the County Rolls in 1864, are, 1st Class, 85,081; 2nd Class, 130,553; Reserve men, 54,489; total, 270,123.

Sir,

There are two measures which appear to me to be desirable in every Corps of the Active Force.

The first is, that a well considered Code of By-laws in accordance with the 35th Clause of the Militia Act, be drawn up and submitted for approval of His Excellency the Commander-in-Chief.

The second is, that you should endeavour to establish Honorary Members to the Corps under your command, to consist of persons taking an interest in the Corps, not necessarily obliged either to uniform themselves or attend drill, but who will, as Honorary Members, contribute either an annual or monthly subscription, be it ever so trifling, towards the unavoidable contingent expenses of the Corps, and who will join it on festive or occasions of a like nature. If Honorary Members desire to uniform themselves or to drill, so much the better, but such requirements should not be compulsory on them.



This system has been adopted by one Company of Rifles in Upper Canada with signal success, and there is no doubt if adopted by others it would very much tend to increase the interest felt in the Corps, and to extend its influence and also materially to lessen expenses by dividing them amongst a larger number of persons.

I therefore earnestly request your attention to these points, being convinced that they will be of material benefit if judiciously acted upon.

A sketch of the By-laws adverted to herein for Honorary Members, is subjoined for your information, as they may be found suggestive to you in the event of your following the same course.

### HONORARY MEMBERS.

#### Rules.

1.—“All persons becoming *Honorary Members* of the Corps shall be entitled to acquire a knowledge of Military discipline, and will be allowed to fall in with the regularly enrolled men of the company, provided they are in the proper uniform of the company.

2.—“Many gentlemen may be disposed to become *Honorary Members*, merely to assist and forward the welfare and efficiency of the corps; consequently they need not, unless so disposed, render any Military services whatever.

3.—“All *Honorary Members* will be taxed the same as the *bonâ fide* members of the company; which tax, at present is per month, to meet contingencies.

4.—“*Honorary Members* desirous of doing duty with the company and acquiring a knowledge of the various duties of the soldier, while under arms or in uniform, will be subject to the by-laws, rules, regulations and discipline of the corps.

5.—“On all holidays, celebrations, balls, dinners and other convivial meetings of the corps, *Honorary Members* not in uniform, will be distinguished by a piece of scarlet ribbon, tied in the button hole, on the left breast.

6.—“No person can be placed on the list of *Honorary Members*, without the approval of the Commanding Officer.”

His Excellency the Governor General and Commander-in-Chief desires to remind Commanding Officers of Corps, and all Serjeant Majors of Batteries and Provincial Storekeepers and Caretakers of Armories, of their responsibility to the Government in reference to the Arms, Accoutrements and Ammunition of every kind in their charge, viz :

#### PUBLIC ARMORIES.

At all stations where there is a Commandant of the whole Force, the Arms, Ammunition and Stores of every kind are under his general control and superintendence, and he is held responsible to the Government for the safe custody of all such Arms and Stores; the Provincial Storekeepers and Caretakers of Armories are likewise responsible for the Arms and Stores in their charge, and are placed under the orders of the Commandants to carry out such instructions as they may consider necessary for the proper safety and security of the said Arms and Stores. The Provincial Storekeepers and Caretakers at Toronto and Montreal will also be available for such services as may be required of them by the Brigade Majors, in forwarding Arms, Ammunition, &c., to the several Corps.

The Serjeant Majors are responsible for the Stores of the Batteries,

under the orders of the Captain and the general instructions of the Commandant, and are charged with keeping the keys of the Store Houses.

The keys of the several Armories and Stores are kept by the Provincial Storekeepers, (or by the Caretaker at Stations where there is no Storekeeper) who are of course always ready to issue the Arms, &c., to the several Corps requiring them for Drill or for other duties detailed in Section 35, of the Militia Law; and the Volunteers are held responsible for such Arms, &c., while in their possession by the 2nd Clause of Section 34 of the aforesaid Law.

#### PRIVATE ARMORIES

At all the other detached Posts the Arms and Public Stores are kept in Private Armories, and the Captain of the Corps is held responsible for their use under Sections 34 and 35, as above.

His Excellency has been pleased to direct that no Guns—Arms—Stores or Ammunition of any kind belonging to the Government and in charge of the Militia, are to be handed over or loaned to any person whatever without special orders from this Department.

MILITIA GENERAL ORDER, No. 1.

His Excellency the Commander-in-Chief being of opinion that the Officers commanding corps of the Volunteer Force should have some progressive promotion in the Militia of the Province for long service and for the efficiency of their corps, has been pleased to establish the following regulations for this purpose, viz :

1st That all Captains commanding corps of the Active Force, who have served as such continuously since the year 1856, inclusive, and whose corps are at present efficient in every respect to the satisfaction of the Inspecting Officer, shall be promoted to the rank of Major in the Militia.

2nd. That henceforth, (except in special cases,) the rank of Major shall be granted after five years actual service as Captain of a corps which is fully uniformed and efficient in every respect to the satisfaction of the Inspecting Officer.

3rd. That henceforth, (except in special cases,) promotion to the rank of Lieutenant-Colonel in the Militia will be granted only to Officers who have served five years consecutively as Majors at the head of one or more corps who are fully uniformed and efficient in



every respect to the satisfaction of the Inspecting Officer,—thus requiring ten years to attain the rank of Lieutenant-Colonel from the period of the first appointment as Captain.

## STAFF.

4th. His Excellency has also been pleased to direct that the rank of Major shall be granted to Captains after five years service consecutively as "Major of Brigade," to the satisfaction of the Officer on whose Staff they have served: and,

5th. That the rank of Lieutenant-Colonel shall be granted to Majors holding the following Staff appointments for five years consecutively to the satisfaction of the Officers on whose Staff they have served, viz:

Assistant Adjutant General, Assistant Quarter Master General, and Major of Brigade, thus requiring ten years for Captains to attain the rank of Lieutenant Colonel from the period of their first appointment to the Staff of the Active Force.

His Excellency the Commander-in-Chief desires to acquaint all Officers Commanding Field Batteries, that the "Reserve or Service Ammunition" originally issued with the Batteries, is not to be used on any account whatever—not even for a temporary purpose with the intention of being subsequently replaced—without previous authority from this Department,—and the Inspecting Field Officers will specially report on this subject during their Annual Inspections of the present year, with a view to the expense of any deficiency in such "Reserve Ammunition" being charged to the Corps.

## No. 2.

Commanding Officers of Rifle Corps are reminded at the same time that the 10 rounds per Rifle of "Service Ammunition," ordered to be kept in reserve for emergencies, are not to be used for practice or any ordinary purpose—and the Inspecting Field Officers are requested to report to this Department any infringement of this order.

## No. 3.

With reference to the General Order of the 22nd May last, fixing the number of Men and Horses to be allowed pay for Drill for the present year, His Excellency has been pleased to direct that no Cavalry, Foot Artillery or Rifle Corps shall henceforward proceed to Drill as a Corps, so as to be allowed to draw pay for such Drill, unless Thirty Men, *at the least*, have attended according to law.

## MILITIA GENERAL ORDER.

His Excellency the Commander-in-Chief cannot leave Canada without addressing a few words to the officers and men of the Militia which he has had for nearly seven years the honor to command, more especially to that portion of such Militia organized as the Active Force.

The Volunteer Force has been formed since His Excellency assumed the Government of this Colony, and he now desires to thank the officers and men composing that force for the readiness with which they have listened to advice and suggestions on his part, for the zeal which they have shewn in the service generally, and for the

energy with which they have turned out to aid the Civil Power or to shew honor to the Governor General himself or to more distinguished strangers.

His Excellency confidently believes that the whole Militia of Canada, Sedentary and Active, will be ready at all times to defend their Homes and support the Crown of England as their Fathers have done before them—but he would exhort them not to slacken in their exertions—perseverance in their Drill and practice with their Rifles will make Canadians as fit and able to protect their Country as any Soldiers in the world, and the strength of the British Empire will, in case of emergency, be exerted with two-fold energy and two-fold heartiness in support of a people thus qualified to fight in their own cause.

In saying this His Excellency earnestly trusts that no war will touch the frontiers of Canada, and that peace and good will towards those with whom we have no cause for quarrel, will continue to bless our borders as they have done for many years—With this prayer he bids the Militia of Canada heartily farewell.

MILITIA GENERAL ORDER, No. 2.

His Excellency the Commander-in-Chief has had under his consideration the obvious disadvantages which must exist in the event of any Militia corps being dressed in uniforms different from any of those worn by Her Majesty's regular Troops with whom they may be required to act.

His Excellency therefore has ordered the re-publication of the Circular Letter from the office of the Adjutant General of Militia, of the 19th May, 1860, by which the uniform of the Active Militia Force is prescribed, in accordance with the Militia Law; and His Excellency strongly urges the attention of officers in command of corps of the Active Force to the necessity of a strict compliance with such General Order.

“SIR,—In accordance with section 31, of the Consolidated Militia Laws, His Excellency the Commander-in-Chief has been pleased to



prescribe the following pattern for all clothing to be furnished in future by the Volunteer Force of the Province, viz :

*Field Batteries and Foot Companies of Artillery.*

“ Blue Tunics and Trowsers, the same as the Royal Artillery.

*Cavalry.*

“ Blue Tunics, single breasted, with Scarlet facings and white cord :	} Officers to wear Silver Lace.
“ Blue Trowsers, with white stripes down the legs :	

*Rifle Corps or Companies.*

“ Rifle Green Tunics, single breasted, with Scarlet Facings and Black Cord Shoulder Strap ; collar and cuffs slightly braided.

“ Rifle Green Trowsers, with two stripes of Black Braid on a scarlet stripe down the legs : the Highland Companies are recommended to wear Tunics, or Jackets, and Trews the same as those used in the regular service, the material and facings of the Tunic or Jacket to be in uniform with the other Rifle Corps.

“ The Buttons of the Tunics of each Arm of the Force to be of the same description as those worn in the regular service, encircled with the words, “ Volunteer Militia Canada.”

*Head Dress.*

“ His Excellency is pleased to leave the description of the future Head Dress to be decided by the Force themselves : but, with a view to uniformity at each Station, it must be so arranged that each Arm of the Service will always appear on Parade with the same style of Head Dress—the Highland Companies however will continue to wear such Head Dress as may be considered most suitable to themselves.

“ In thus prescribing a Uniform for the Force, His Excellency earnestly desires to impress upon the Commanding Officers and all others concerned, the expediency of keeping the expense of the uniform of the Volunteer Corps as low as possible—His Excellency is satisfied that the most simple uniform will be the most serviceable, and that the several Corps will be maintained in a more efficient state by diminishing the cost of the soldier’s outfit.”

With reference to the General Order, No. 2, of the 22nd March, 1861, His Excellency the Commander-in-Chief is pleased to direct that the revised "Field Exercise and Evolutions of Infantry," approved of by the General Order, dated Horse Guards, January, 1862, be adopted by the Active Force and the Militia of Canada, and all Infantry Drill Instructors of the Militia will be governed accordingly. No. 5.

His Excellency the Governor General and Commander-in-Chief having obtained from His Excellency the Lieutenant General Commanding Her Majesty's Forces, the services of the non-commissioned officers of Her Majesty's Service sent from England for the purpose of drill and instruction to the Militia, is pleased to place the same at the disposal of the Militia.

His Excellency desires to impress strongly on the officers under whose orders Drill Instructors are or may be placed, that these Drill Instructors are furnished, free of expense, to those whom they instruct; and that such officers are to endeavour, as far as possible, to make the services of such Instructors available, not only for the Corps of the Active Force already in existence, but also for such others as may be hereafter organized in their respective localities, and gazetted; and further, for instruction to such of the Sedentary Militia or Drill Associations within their neighbourhood as may desire to procure military instruction. It will be therefore incumbent on the officers, under whose orders the Drill Instructors are so placed, to make such arrangements as that the convenience of the several Corps or Drill Associations shall be consulted, at the same time with the economy of transport of the Instructors from one place to another, and the making of their services the most available.

The Commander-in-Chief is also pleased to call the attention of the Militia to the fact that the Drill Instructors being only temporarily resident in the Province for the special service assigned to them, it is especially incumbent on officers and non-commissioned officers, both of the Active and Sedentary Militia, to acquire such a knowledge of and proficiency in their drill and military duties, as will enable them on the departure of the Drill Instructors to impart, from time to time, the knowledge thus acquired to those who may be under their command.

## MILITIA GENERAL ORDER, No. 1.

His Excellency the Commander-in-Chief has been pleased to promulgate the following orders for the information and guidance of the Militia of the Province, respecting the appointment and duties of Brigade Majors under the provisions of the existing Militia Law, viz:

1. A Brigade Major in accordance with the amended Militia Act of last Session, will be appointed and stationed at such place in each Military District, as the Commander-in-Chief may direct, and be subject to removal within that, or to any other District, at his discretion.

2. The Brigade Majors of each District will superintend the Drill and Instruction of all Volunteer Companies within his District, furnishing Monthly Reports thereof to the Adjutant General's Department, as to their state of discipline and efficiency, and average attendance at Drill.



3. He will inspect not less than once a quarter, and as often as he may be directed, the arms, accoutrements, great coats and other stores issued to each Company within his District, and forward to the Adjutant General's Department, Quarterly Returns thereof, or Special Reports, when required, as to their general state, and deficiencies, when such occur.

4. The Drill Instructors in each District will be placed under his sole control, he will distribute them through the districts and detail them for their respective duties as occasion may require.

5. He will be required to organize Drill Associations amongst the officers and non-commissioned officers of each Battalion of Sedentary Militia within his district, with a view to their acquiring such a knowledge of and proficiency in their drill and military duties as will enable them to impart, as occasion may require, the knowledge thus obtained to those under their command. This branch of his duty will also include the control and supervision of the organisations for drill contemplated by the 11th clause of the amended Militia Act of last Session.

6. It will further be his duty to secure the enrolment of such quota as may be ordered, from time to time, among First Class Service men within his district—first into Companies, and whenever practicable, next into Battalions, under officers qualified to command them.

7. He will further be subject to such orders and regulations as the Commander-in-Chief may see fit, from time to time, to issue for his guidance and instruction. He will report direct to Head Quarters, and be the channel of all communications therewith in each Military District, for the Militia, both Sedentary and Active.

8. On appointment he will be expected to devote his undivided attention to the duties of his office, more especially for the first six months after such appointment, and until he has initiated the system, and brought his district into working order.

9. Brigade Majors to rank as Majors in the Militia, and wear the uniform of their rank, and in accordance with the Militia Regulations on that head

With reference to paragraph No. 9, of Militia General Order No. 1, of 17th November instant, and with a view of saving unnecessary outlay and expense to Brigade Majors of Military Districts, His Excellency the Commander-in-Chief is pleased to state that he does not desire it to be incumbent on such Brigade Majors to obtain the full uniform of their rank: but that, until further orders, it will suffice that they are in possession of the undress uniform of the rank of Brigade Majors (being Field Officers) as laid down in the regulations for the dress of Her Majesty's Army, 1857, and consisting of frock coat, undress trousers, waistcoat, forage cap and great coat, spurs, sword, scabbard, sword knot, sword belt and plate, boots and gloves: and that the lace and ornaments or embroidery and appointments thereof where of gold or gilt in Her Majesty's service, shall be of silver according to the Militia Regulations

His Excellency the Commander-in-Chief having ordered a Court of Inquiry, composed of the Officers named in the Margin, to assemble at Quebec, to examine into, and report upon a complaint made by the Brigade Major of the Seventh Military District of Lower Canada, against the Second Company, (Captain Knight's,) of the Eighth Battalion or Stadacona Militia Rifles, Quebec, is hereby pleased to approve of the "Finding" of the said Court, to the following effect, viz :

" The Court having duly considered the evidence brought  
 " forward in support of the prosecution, as well as what has  
 " been adduced in mitigation by Dr. Wolff, on the part of the  
 " Second Company, Eighth Battalion Volunteer Militia Rifles,  
 " are of opinion that the Company in not accepting the Officer,  
 " who was sent by Major Campbell to command them, was  
 " guilty of an act of disobedience, which was a breach  
 " of good order, and highly subversive of military discipline.  
 " Whilst the Court are of opinion, that nothing can justify the  
 " commission of such an act of insubordination, they consider  
 " that the Company may have possibly thus behaved, in some  
 " measure, from ignorance and inexperience, and from a mis-  
 " taken belief that the Company, although now one of a Battalion,  
 " had its own Officers, by whom alone it should be commanded.  
 " The Court also desire to express their regret, that the Company  
 " was left, by the absence of two Officers in England, and one  
 " from sickness, to the very anomalous position of being com-  
 " manded by the Surgeon. The Court further entertain the  
 " opinion, that disobedience of orders should be dealt with,  
 " rather under the provisions of the Militia Law for the time  
 " being, instead of resort, as in this case, being had to an extreme  
 " measure, the propriety of, or indeed the authority for which, is  
 " very doubtful.

" With regard to the charge brought against Major Campbell  
 " of having refused to obey the orders of Colonel Sewell, the  
 " Commandant, this has not been proven in evidence, and he is  
 " therefore exonerated therefrom. But the Court cannot here  
 " avoid remarking that the use by that Officer, to his superior,  
 " of the expression, ' Colonel Sewell, I command here and will  
 " admit of no interference,' shewed an absence of the true  
 " appreciation of their respective military positions. Implicit  
 " and ready obedience, at all times, and under any circum-  
 " stances, to all lawful orders, on the part of Officers and Men  
 " of the Volunteer Force, is a duty of the first importance, and  
 " is the foundation on which their character as a military organ-  
 " isation must be built."

The Commander-in-Chief agrees with the opinion of the Court  
 of Inquiry, that the conduct of Number Two Company, Eighth  
 Battalion, on the evening of March Third, was of a nature  
 entirely subversive of the principle of implicit obedience to the  
 command of a superior, the observance of which is essential  
 to the efficiency of all military organisations, whether the men  
 composing the force be civilians or regular soldiers.

Volunteers must never forget that if their services are to be of



any practical use to their country, they are bound equally with professional soldiers to make, when on duty, a complete surrender of their individual freedom of action.

Unless this sacrifice is thoroughly and cordially made, mere technical drill is worthless, and discipline, for any useful purpose, cannot with truth be said to exist.

The Commander-in-Chief regrets very much that the men of so fine a Company as Number Two, Eighth Battalion, should have been betrayed into conduct reflecting so much discredit upon themselves, and exhibiting such forgetfulness of the fundamental principle of military discipline.

Under all the circumstances however the Commander-in-Chief is satisfied to accept the apology offered before the Court of Inquiry on the part of the Company, namely, that the men acted in ignorance and without a premeditated intention of insubordination.

The Commander-in-Chief however would fail in his duty towards the Force if he did not warn the Company that any—the slightest recurrence of such unsoldierlike conduct—will be visited with severe punishment.

The conduct of Major Campbell, in addressing to his superior Officer the words which he himself admits he used, was reprehensible, and Major Campbell must be admonished to be in future more careful in his language when speaking to his superiors.

The Commander-in-Chief concurs with the opinion of the Court of Inquiry, that an error in judgment was committed in giving to the men of the Company an order to lay down their arms, &c., and instead of putting in force against the disobedient the provisions of the Militia Law.

The following General Order No. 2, of the 10th January, 1862, respecting Great Coats, is re-published for the information and strict guidance of Officers Commanding Corps of the Volunteer Force and all others concerned, viz :

“The Commander-in-Chief desires to impress upon Officers commanding Corps of the Active Force, that the Great Coats



now being issued to the Force are public property, and should, in all cases, be treated in exactly the same manner, as regards use and custody, with the Arms and Accoutrements of the men. They should be kept in the building appointed for keeping the Arms, and should not, on any pretence, be worn, except when the men are engaged in Drill or on duty. Commanding Officers will be held personally responsible for the enforcement of this Order.”

His Excellency desires at the same time to acquaint the Officers of the Volunteer Force, that if any of them desire to wear the Great Coats issued to the Volunteers, they will be permitted specially to do so upon paying their value, at the rate of four dollars per Coat, into the Bank of Upper Canada, to the credit of the Receiver General, forwarding the “Deposit Receipt” therefor to this Department, through their Brigade Major,—but it will be necessary in all cases to receive previous authority for such issues from Head Quarters.

4. Instances having occurred of Brigade Majors having drawn from the Provincial Stores, arms, accoutrements, &c., &c., on

various authorities, I have to acquaint you that under no circumstance should arms, or any other Government stores, be issued to any person whatever, without a regular requisition, previously approved by this Department ; for it is manifest that any other system of issue must necessarily lead to confusion in the store accounts of the Department.

## MEMO.

1. The annual allowance (due 1st April) for all Corps armed with Enfield Rifles, is 60 Rounds Ball and 40 Rounds Blank for each man actually effective.

2. The requisition, when filled up by the Captain, will be sent by him to the Brigade Major of the Division for certificate, who will then forward it *direct* to the Militia Department at Head Quarters for approval. All Ammunition must be issued in *kegs or barrels*, and the issuing Officers are on no account to issue Ammunition in quantities *less* than a quarter-barrel.

*Extra Ammunition.*  
—

3. Officers in command of Corps, who may require extra Ball Ammunition, are informed that the quarter-barrel contains seven hundred (700) rounds of Ball Cartridges, with the proportion of Caps; and such ammunition will, in future, be issued in quarter-barrels only. Officers making application for *extra* ammunition will therefore, in future, calculate the quantity asked for in quarter-barrels, taking care that the quantity demanded corresponds with the entire contents of one or more quarter-barrels.

4. *Extra Ammunition* is issued on application *direct* to the Militia Department at Head Quarters, by the Officer requiring it, and payment therefore is to be made by the Officer making the application for such extra ammunition, depositing the money in the Bank of Montreal, to the credit of the Receiver General, and transmitting the Certificate of Deposit for the same to the Militia Department. The price of a quarter-barrel of Ball Ammunition, with Caps complete, is \$11 $\frac{6}{100}$ .

*Extract Circular to Commanding Officers.*

“His Excellency the Commander-in-Chief desires me to acquaint you at the same time, that the great object he has in view is the efficiency of the Volunteers in Rifle shooting, and to this end he desires that no Volunteer shall be permitted to fire more than his allotted share (60 rounds) of the Government allowance of ball ammunition, and that it is the duty of the Officer commanding to take care that every Volunteer on the strength of the Company shall, within the year, fire at the target that number of rounds (60) of ball ammunition, at such times as may be most convenient: for it is manifest that, if the whole of the Government allowance is shot away at Rifle Matches by a

few Volunteers from each Company—a practice at present frequently followed—His Excellency's object cannot be attained.”

GENERAL ORDER, No. 1.

His Excellency the Commander-in-Chief has before him a report of the proceedings of a meeting held at Levis on the 4th instant, at which the following resolution was passed :

“ Moved by Captain Thompson, seconded by Captain Haughton—

“ That the Officers and Non-Commissioned Officers of the 17th Battalion of Levis Volunteer Militia Infantry regret to learn the summary dismissal of Brigade Major de Bellefeuille, on the plea of retrenchment ; and while deeply sympathising with him, condemn, in the strongest terms, such a proceeding, as being detrimental to the organization and effectiveness of the force of the 3rd Military District.”

His Excellency has also before him a letter from Lieutenant-Colonel Blanchet, who was represented to have taken the chair at the meeting referred to, admitting that the report of this resolution is correct.

His Excellency feels bound to express his strongest condemnation of the conduct of Lieutenant-Colonel Blanchet and the other Officers of the 17th Battalion who took part in the proceeding of that meeting, as exhibiting on their part a total absence of any sense of discipline or subordination to superior authority.

A Volunteer does not, by joining the Force, abdicate his functions as a Citizen, nor does he give up any portion of his right in his private capacity to discuss, and, if he see fit, to condemn the action of the Government or any branch of it.

But that an Officer Commanding a Battalion should assemble his subordinates and proceed with them in their character as a Military organization to sit in judgment upon, and condemn the orders of the Commander-in-Chief is a proceeding which, for the sake of the efficiency of the service, if for no other consideration, cannot be tolerated.

Without strict attention to discipline and subordination to superior authority, a Military body of any description will soon degenerate to the condition of an armed mob, and if the Volun-

teer Force desires really to become an efficient organization, its members cannot keep too much before their minds the principle that unquestioning obedience to authority is no less the duty in his Military character of the volunteer, than of the regular soldier.

As Lieutenant-Colonel Blanchet has disclaimed any intention of infringing the rules of Military discipline, His Excellency is willing to attribute his conduct and that of his Officers on this occasion to ignorance of their obligations in that respect, and will not take any further proceedings against them than by expressing his grave censure of their proceedings, but in the interest of the Volunteer Force generally, and for the information of those who compose that force, His Excellency is pleased to direct that this *memorandum* should be published in General Orders.

## GENERAL ORDERS.

1. The General Orders of the 12th February and 9th August, 1864, are hereby cancelled:

2. His Excellency the Commander-in-Chief is pleased to order the several Corps of Volunteers in the Province, to complete the course of sixteen days annual drill, authorized to be paid for under the provisions of section 4 of the Volunteer Militia Law, at such times as may be most convenient, in respect to which the following regulations have been adopted:

3. An efficient Volunteer Battalion shall consist of at least six efficient companies, except in the case of such Provisional Battalions as may be sanctioned by His Excellency the Commander in Chief, and which may consist of four companies. A Squadron of Cavalry consisting of two troops, or a Battery of Field Artillery will be allowed to count as a Battalion.

4. An efficient Volunteer Corps shall be taken to mean a Company, the whole of whose members unless prevented by illness or other reasonable or unavoidable cause, which shall be specially certified by the Officer commanding the Company or Battalion, shall have complied with the requirements in respect to attendance at drill and target practice hereinafter laid down, and which shall, except for cause certified as above, parade its full actual strength at inspection, and shall at such inspection perform the exercises hereinafter appointed *under the command of its own Officers*, to the satisfaction of the Inspecting Officer, and whose clothing, arms, accoutrements and equipments shall be reported to be in proper condition.

5. No pay will be allowed to any individual Volunteer whose Company is not efficient.

*Drill.*

6. Each Volunteer for whom payment is demanded shall have attended since the 1st day of April, 1864, at least sixteen days

drill. Each days drill to consist of 2 drills of  $1\frac{1}{2}$  hour each, or if found more convenient to the men a drill of  $1\frac{1}{2}$  hour will be allowed to count for half a day's drill, at which drills not less than one half the actual strength and at least one commissioned Officer of the Company shall have attended.

7. When a Brigade Field day shall have been ordered it shall be allowed to count as two drills of  $1\frac{1}{2}$  hour each for all non-commissioned officers and privates attending; provided that not less than one half the strength of the Battalion or Company shall attend.

8. Not more than two Brigade Field days shall be allowed to count for each non-commissioned officer or man during the year.

9. Each non-commissioned officer and man who performs the course of target practice hereinafter appointed shall be allowed to count such target practice as four drills of  $1\frac{1}{2}$  hour each.

10. In future the year for the purposes of Militia drill and pay, shall commence on July 1, in each year.

11. The course of drill in which each arm of the service must, in order to qualify at the Inspection, display a satisfactory amount of proficiency, will be as follows :

*For Artillery.*

12. Squad and Company drill including the Manual and Platoon Exercise and Gun drill, in cases where Artillery corps are supplied with guns.

*For Cavalry.*

13. Cavalry Sword Exercise and mounted and dismounted Troop and Squadron drill as laid down in the Cavalry regulations.

*For Infantry and Rifles.*

14. Squad and Company drill with the exception of marching in slow time, including the Manual and Platoon Exercise, skirmishing as a Company, and simple manœuvres in Battalion Drill as laid down in the "Field Exercises of Infantry."

*Target Practice.*

15. In cases where ranges are provided all Battalions and Companies of Volunteer Militia shall in accordance with the General Order of October the 2nd, 1863, have expended thirty rounds per man of ball ammunition, and the Officers commanding such Battalions or Companies shall keep careful and accurate returns of all Target Practice in accordance with forms which will be provided from the office of the Adjutant General of Militia.



*Horses.*

16. Pay will be allowed for 16 days drill of 3 hours each, or for 32 drills of 1½ hour each for the horses of the non-commissioned officers and men and guns of the Field Batteries of Artillery and for the horses of the non-commissioned officers and men of the Troops of Cavalry, provided that at least one half the strength of the Field Battery or Troop of Cavalry and at least one Commissioned Officer shall attend each such drill.

17. Brigade Field days when ordered to the extent of two for each year will be allowed to count as two drills of 1½ hour each.

18. The pay for horses will be allowed at the rate of seventy-five cents per horse for each drill of three hours, for the number of horses actually and necessarily present at each such drill not exceeding forty-five for each Field Battery of Artillery, and the number of horses actually and necessarily present at each such drill for each Troop of Cavalry.

19. The course of drill required of each arm of the service by this order, will be certified according to forms which will be supplied from the office of the Adjutant General of Militia; the forms as to the Company drill being certified and signed by the Captain or Officer in command of the Company, and those as to Battalion Drill being certified and signed by the Officer commanding the Battalion.

20. Any sum of money which His Excellency may order to be paid over to the commanding officer of a Volunteer Battalion deemed efficient, under the 16th section of the Volunteer Militia Law, will be so paid over after the annual inspection by officers of Her Majesty's Service.

21. A careful compliance with the provisions of the preceding paragraphs is required, as furnishing proof or evidence of an "Efficient Volunteer Battalion" upon which His Excellency may decide as to the appropriation of any money, under the sixteenth section of the Volunteer Militia Law.

22. The annual Inspection to entitle the force to receive pay will take place at any time before the 15th December, 1864—at which the Brigade Majors shall notify the Deputy Adjutant General that the several Corps within their respective districts have completed their course of drill.

23. No notification can be received after the 15th November for this inspection as the state of the weather after the middle of December would render it impossible to have an effective inspection.



24. Corps which cannot qualify so as to enable the Brigade Majors to give notice before the 15th November, cannot be inspected, and consequently cannot become entitled to their pay for the year 1864-65 until after the disappearance of the snow in the spring of 1865.

The arrangement heretofore existing for the supply of instructors from the Regular Army for duty in the Cities of Quebec, Montreal, Kingston and Toronto, at 40 cents per day, to be continued as far as the same may be practicable.

Instructors employed for duty outside the above named Cities, shall be paid quarterly at the following rates, according to the number of Companies actually instructed by each instructor.

No charge for transport or travelling expenses to be allowed.

The certificate to be required before payment for services of instructor, will be signed by the Officer in Command of each Company, and the instruction will be supervised, and the certificate countersigned, by the Brigade Major.

In the employment of instructors for Troops or Companies outside the Cities of Quebec, Montreal, Kingston or Toronto, His Excellency desires that Commissioned Officers of Volunteers, who have passed Examination, and obtained First Class Certificates, shall be employed as instructors for their respective



Companies, always upon the understanding that they are willing to assume the responsibility of such instruction, and to perform the duty in a manner satisfactory to the Department.

In instances where such Commissioned Officers of Companies decline to act as instructors for their respective Corps, His Excellency has been pleased to direct that a preference shall be given to qualified passed Candidates from the Military Schools, who have obtained First Class Certificates.

GENERAL ORDER.

1. Referring to the General Order of December 19th, His Excellency the Commander in Chief is pleased to call out for actual service the following Companies of the Volunteer Force.

\* \* \* \* \*

6. In calling out for actual service this portion of the Volunteer Force, the Commander in Chief desires to express the gratification he has experienced at the numerous offers of service he has received from Volunteer Companies all through the Province, as soon as it became known that men were required for permanent duty.

7. The Commander in Chief desires to impress upon the officers, non-commissioned officers and men of the force called out for duty, that they are embodied not for the purpose of warfare, but with the object of aiding the Civil power in its efforts to prevent aggression on the territories of a friendly State, on the part of persons enjoying the right of asylum in Her Majesty's dominions, and to maintain, as regards Canada, that complete neutrality with respect to the war now existing in the United States, which Her Majesty enjoined on all her subjects.

8. With these objects in view, it will be the duty of all Officers commanding Detachments on the frontier, to take special care that the territorial rights of the Government of the United States shall be carefully respected, and that no infringement by the men under their command shall, under any circumstances, take place of such regulations for the security of their borders as may be made from time to time by that Government.



9. It will be the duty of Officers, should suspicious circumstances be brought under their observation, immediately to report any such to the Civil authorities, and to place themselves under their guidance.

*Extracts from the Volunteer Militia Act.*

*Section 18.* The Volunteers shall be liable to be called out in aid of the ordinary Civil Power in case of riot or other emergency requiring such services, and shall, when so employed, receive from the Municipality in which their services are required, the following rates of pay, that is to say: Officers, such pay as is the daily pay in Her Majesty's Service of Officers of corresponding rank, with an additional sum to each mounted Officer of two dollars per day, and non-commissioned Officers and Privates the sum of one dollar each per day, with an additional sum of one dollar per day for each horse actually and necessarily used or employed on such occasion, and shall be also provided with proper lodging by such Municipality;—And the said sums, and the value of such lodging, if not furnished by the Municipality, may be recovered from it by the Officer Commanding the Corps, in his own name, and when received or recovered shall be paid over to the Officers and men entitled thereto.

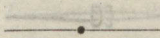
*Section 19.* It shall be the duty of the Officer commanding any Corps of Volunteers to call out the same, or such portion thereof as is necessary, for the purpose of quelling any Riot, when thereunto required in writing by the Mayor, Warden or other Head of the Municipality in which such Riot takes place, or by any two Magistrates therein, and to obey such instructions as may be lawfully given him by any Magistrate in regard to the mode of quelling such Riot;—And every Officer, non-commissioned Officer and man of such Corps shall, on every such occasion, obey the orders of his Commanding Officer;—And the Officers and men when so called out shall, without any further or other appointment, and without taking any oath of office, be special constables and shall act as such so long as they remain so called out.
