BANGOR, July, 1860.

The Church government of this interesting people is peculiar. There is, first, the Private Society, or church, which is composed of those professing conversion, and their children. These societies are under the superintendence of two or more leaders, elected by their members, answering in nearly all respects to Presbyterian elders.

Their ministers are thus selected:—Any persons thought to possess suitable qualifications are recommended by the Private to the Monthly Societies; and when approved by them, they are recommended to the Quarterly Association; and when there approved, they are by them sent apart to the work of the ministry by prayer, and by the laying up of their hands, not by the laying on of hands.

Such, in brief, are the history, the doctrines, the polity of the Welsh Calvinistic Methodists; a people upon whom the Lord is even now pouring out richly of his Spirit.
