One bridge struck a dwelling house and Rev. S. W. Archer, D. Kirk, his wife and child, Mrs. Belle Dach and David Morse's child were drowned.

The Haldimand Petition. CALEDONIA, Aug. 27.—The action petition trial of J. W. Sheppard against Dr. Montague and Peter E. Hirschfeld will commence on Tuesday next at Cayuga. It is stated here that the petition has been withdrawn by consent of both parties.

A Terrible Storm in Trieste. VIENNA, Aug. 28.—A terrific storm has visited Trieste, causing great loss of life and property. Many wrecks are reported on the Adriatic Sea. The crews of several vessels have perished.
