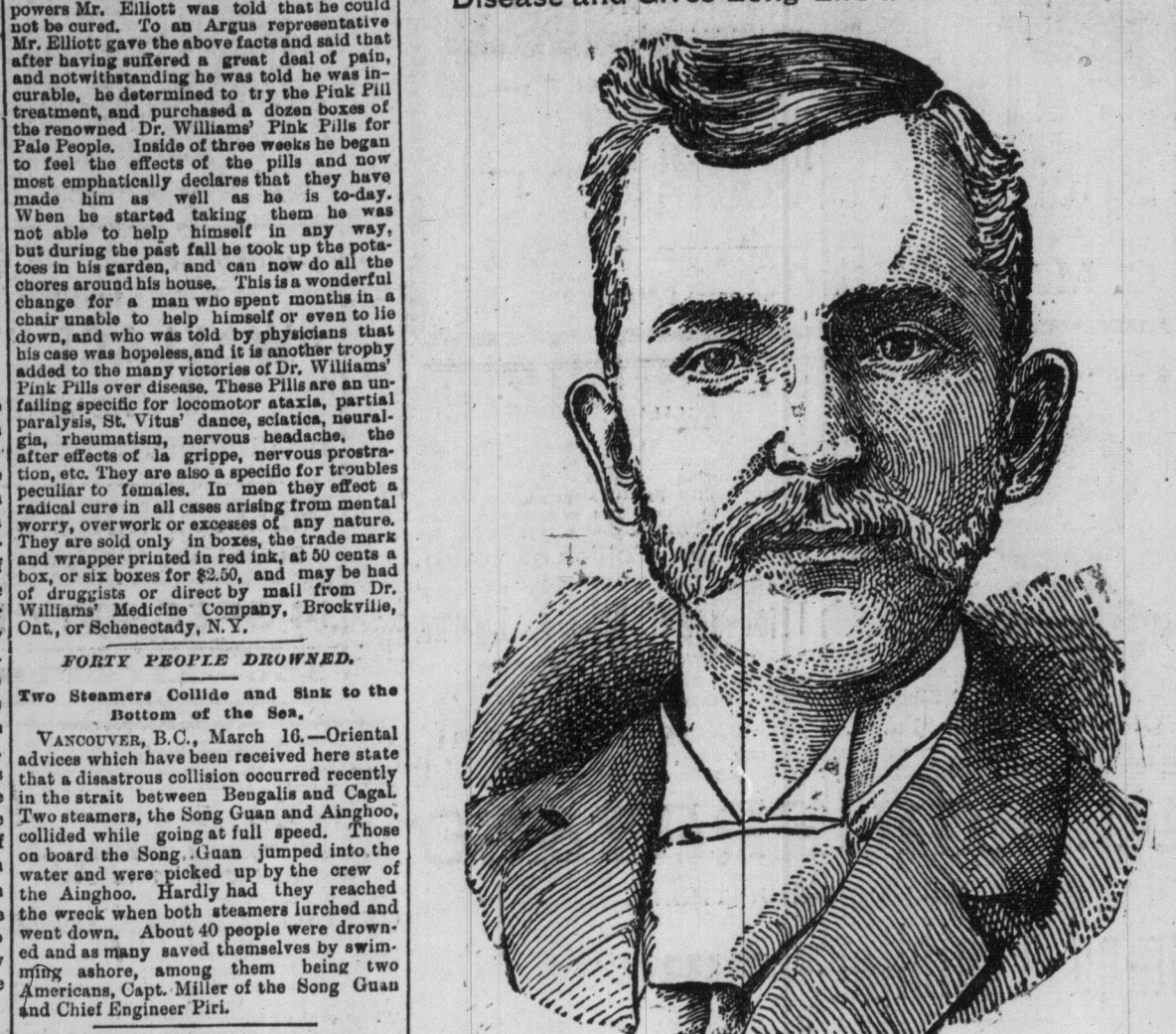

A committee consisting of Ald. Thompson and Lamb was appointed to wait on the different underwriters in the city and see if something cannot be done to lower the insurance rates.

After the Assessors' Meeting. Ald. Thompson reported that he could not carry on the work of the department with fewer assistants than he now has.

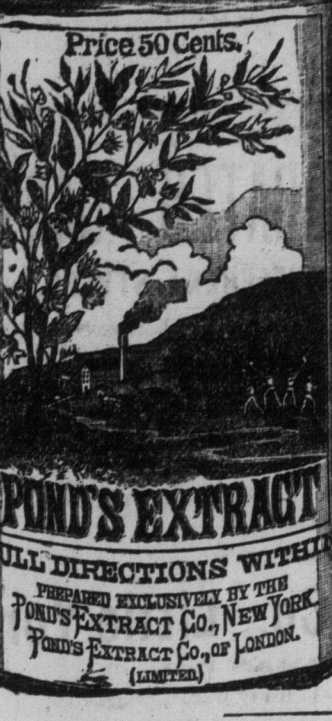
