





The British pilot fired two hundred rounds into one of the hostile planes, which was seen to crash. His observer also got in a good burst of fire at another German at close range, with a similar result. That left two of the enemy, and they were joined by a third souting machine, which began firing at the British plane from above. The observer was shot and killed.

INSPECTION TRIP MADE

inling the promises made before they took office that the roads of the province would be put in good shape was demonstrated very clearly, with regard to the castern section of St. John and Kings counties, on Saturday afternoon, when an inspection, trip was made by Premier Foster and others. renting proper drainage and, during rainstorms, converting the roads into miniature rivers or lakes, which speedily did away with the effects of temporary repairs. On Saturday almost every section of the road was found to be well crowned with proper side grading to carry off the rainfall and properly ditched along the sides. This feature alone adds greatly to the wearing qualities of the roads and to their efficiency for traffic purposes.

Probably the poorest roads on the entire run were found in the section of St. John county between the city and Brookville, but the work now under way and that which has been planned will soon remedy that condition. The provincial government now is constructing a permanent highway of McAdam with tarvia surface from the city limits to the Three Mile House, and the work has progassed far enough to show what a fine job being made of it. Plans have been progased for extending the permanent road to the overhead bridge beyond Brookville, but whether this work will be done this year depends on several circumstances. Meanwhile, temporary repairs have made

Beyond Brookville is the stretch of McAdam road laid by the previous government, which was built of soft limestone—an experiment which has not proved overly successful, as the road already shows signs of wearing out. It has been found necessary to rebuild the shoulders of this section, as they had begun to fall off into the ditch.

As one enters Kings county the excellent results of the patrol system introduced this year are observed. By making prompt repairs as the need develops and keeping the loose stones raked off the surface, the roads are being kept in better conditions than ever before. Through Rothesay the roads are so good that they have proved too tempting for speeding, with the result that carowners who took advantage of them to crowd the speedometer indicator to the limit have been heavily fined. Until recently there was no temptation to risk such fines.

Over excellent roads through Quispamsis, one comes to the highway bridge erected by the late government. It is a fine bridge, but it was installed at right angles to the road on either side of the track, with a sharp and dangerous turn at each end. New concrete abutments have been built and the bridge will be moved to them, thus giving an almost straight road and doing away with the dangerous turns.
