KINGSTON CRULLERS.

Cream one half pound of butter with three-fourths pound of powdered sugar. When smooth and light add one half-teaspoonful of mace, the same quantity of nutmeg and the well beaten yolks of six eggs. Stir in the stiffened whites of the eggs alternately with enough flour to make a dough that can be rolled out. Roll into a thin sheet, cut into circles or any shape desired, and drop, a few at a time, into deep boiling fat. Test the fat with a bit of dough before frying any crullers in it. When golden brown in color remove the crullers and lay in a heated colander to drain, sprinkling with powdered sugar.
