It is absolutely necessary that no article on exhibition be touched or handled, as the Committee wish to deliver the specimens to their respective owners in the best possible condition:
The Committee cannot be accountable for the redelivery of any article, if not claimed within the time specified by the Committee ; from 8 to 10, A. M., on the morning after the show.
The Judges to have the liberty of cutting any article that has to be decided by the taste, and to have the option of refusing Premiums for any article they do not consider worthy.
It is not competent for the Judges to rectify errors in entering articles for exhibition.
Parties entering articles under the wrong class must suffer the loss of their prize.
Discretionary prizes are fixed; first, at 5s., second, at 2 s . 6 d .
