We omit the ordinary want of appreciation of cleanliness and thoroughness-the wastes from our stock, from our manure-heaps from our household .-Verily, a little thought will save to the farmer much, and the saving through this means, even in a small farm, will represent the interest and are in large part inexcusable; as well as those on a large capital .-The wastes arising from ignorance can very readily be diminished. arising from carelessness are not deserving of sympathy. ## Bedding.

In the barn of a model farmer bedding is about as essential as fod-It also keeps stock clean, dry, warm and comfortable, thereby saving fodder and grain and promoting the health, beauty and thrift of the animals. You can get along without bedding in your barns as you can i your house, but you can't afford to SPECIAL PUBLIC NOTICE do without it. To attempt it is slovenly, shiftless and expensive. The time to gather some kinds of bedding is now. There are brakes in your swamps, and weeds by the roadside which should be gathered and saved for your stock to sleep on next winter, and when you have got all these within your reach, you can find plenty of muck and earth which SMALL ADVANCE THE BEST AND CHEAPEST when dried, will make a good litter and increase your manure heap .-Later in the season there will be the forest leaves to gather, and if you can't get anything better, plenty of sawdust at the mill. Any and all of these will richly pay for getting. Don't be afraid of getting too much No animal was ever injured by having too good a bed, and we have pever heard of a manure-heap in this part of the country which was too large.

Value of a Good Stable. Describing a frost-proof stable the Agriculturist says: It was immedi ately over the basement, and had for one of its sides the bank wall. This was painted with cement. The other side was made of tongued and grooved inch pine boards, and battened the lumber well seasoned, and painted. The windows and doors are Confectionery from 17c. upw'ds. close-fitting, and there was no crevice left where the wind could creep through. The trap-doors through which the manure was passed below, were perfectly tight. We were surprised at the agreeable tenperature as we entered the barn on a bitter cold day. It seemed as if a stove or furnace must have been used in the building. But the proprietor said that the animals were the only stoves in use, and the manure had hardly been frozen in the zero nights. He spoke with great satisfaction of the economy of such a stable. It saves greatly in fodder. All the hay and grain that are used to keep up animal heat in the open air in winter goes, in such a stable to the production of flesh, fat, and milk.
