Dahomey, as we all know, is situated on the northwest coast of Africa, not far from the mouth of the Riger. It has this distinctive character, that it may be considered as inhabited by an army rather than by a nation. The source of its revenue is neither agriculture nor any kind of in fatry, but proceeds absolutely from a Nature, as Impotency, Sterility, Varicocele,


