The Great Maritime Nations.

Canada stands fifth among the maritime countries of the world. The latest reports give the following number of vessels and tonnage to the chief commercial nations:

The United States are not here given the place they should have, as only vessels registered for ocean trade are accounted for. If licensed and enrolled vessels are included, the tonnage will reach \$414,457.

Even as it is, may we, with all possible respect and reverence, point out to our neighbors who tell us that Canada is more than one ton of shipping to each five of her inhabitants, while the United States have but one ton to each fifteen inhabitants?
