APPLE PROMISE LITTLE GLEANING.

The season is now so far along that even in the most northern part of the apple belt the blossoming period is over, the set of fruit determined, and for that matter the June drop generally well over.

As indicated, the outlook for winter apples is not particularly brilliant in the northern and eastern states. Our latest advice confirms this and emphasizes the fact of shortage in Baldwin.
