REPORTS OF COMMITTEES.

REPORT OF STATISTICAL COMMITTEE.

1. Your Committee on Statistics report that they are thankful for the measure of success which the Head of the Church has been pleased to bestow on the labors of His servants in connection with the Conference during the past year.

2. We find that the present membership is 4,879, being an increase of 148.

3. There has been raised for connexional funds \$7,645, being an increase of \$1,910.00, of which increase \$652.70 was in the Missionary Fund.

4. The amount raised for circuit purposes is \$49,231 70, showing an increase of \$10,098.81.

5. The amount raised for ministerial support is \$19,451.00, an increase of \$1,898.00.

6. The grand total for all purposes, \$75,858.30, showing an increase of \$13,470.94.

7. We find that our church property is valued at \$380,818.00; that we have 101 churches and 53 parsonages.

8. A great deal of extra work has been caused by inaccuracies in the schedules which ought to have been corrected by the Audit Committee of the several districts.

9. We recommend that the Statistical Committee meet the day before Conference, so as to have the district schedules ready at the opening of Conference. And also that each district secretary be required to bring to Conference the Circuit Schedules for reference in case of mistakes.

10. We recommend that the General Conference be memorialized with regard to providing a set of ruled books for the purpose of preserving a permanent record of district statistics, and thus obviate the necessity for hand ruling.

11. We also recommend that a like set of books be provided for the permanent records of the Annual Conferences.

REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE ON THE STATE OF THE WORK.

Your Committee on the State of the Work beg leave to report as follows :

We rejoice that during the past year the Church in British Columbia has realized in many places gracious revivals of religion resulting in the quickening of believers and the conversion of sinners to God. We also believe that many of our churches have seen the power of God manifested in the regular means of grace. Let us remember that we may always avail ourselves of the Divine help, and expect conversions in every service. We emphasize the need of keeping the doctrine of scriptural holiness constantly before our people, and urge the gracious privilege of every believer to attain it now.

We note with pleasure that, during the year, 1,097 persons have been received on trial and that the net increase of members is 148. We again urge the importance of the necessity of sustaining our own publications, and recommend that every minister do his utmost to increase the circulation of the *Christian Guardian* and *Methodist Magazine*. Our papers are as cheap in price as any, and second to none in quality. Their careful reading will increase religious life and denominational loyalty.

We again commend to our people the time-honored class-meeting, so largely needed, especially in the care of young converts and the development of religious experience. Let our leaders be carefully chosen, and their work recognized and heartily appreciated. We would also recommend the formation of catechism classes for children, especially where there are no Junior Epworth Leagues. If these classes are committed to the care of consecrated women, we may look for great blessing from them.

We gratefully recognize the valuable help of the Epworth League wherever it has been organized. We believe that it may prove a great power in the Church, if organized and carried out strictly according to the Constitution in the Discipline. The Sunday Schools have prospered during the year, and we are glad to note that from the Sunday School has come a number of the additions to Church membership.

Finally, let us, as a Church, give ourselves to prayer, that the Holy Spirit may come upon us anointing us with power, with love and a sound mind, that multitudes may be led this year to forsake sin and come to God.

REPORT OF SABBATH SCHOOL COMMITTEE.

Your Committee beg leave to report as follows :

There is throughout the Conference a total of 72 Schools, comprising a membership of 5,121 pupils, 575 officers and teachers ; of these latter, 476 are members of the Methodist Church. The total average attendance is 3,534.

The increase for the year is as follows :

In number of Schools, 8 ; in pupils, 408 ; in officers and teachers, 25 ; in average attendance, 455.

Our Schools raised for School purposes during the year, \$4,068.00, an increase of \$767.00 ; for Connexional Funds, \$460.00, an increase of \$25.00.

While these results are of a gratifying nature, there are certain departments of the work which call for special attention. It is a standing reproach to our connexion that only fifteen per cent. of the pupils of our Schools are studying the Methodist Catechism. This is a fault which calls for immediate correction.

We are of the opinion that the attention of our Sabbath School workers should be called to the field of usefulness opened up by the Home Department, and would recommend that every endeavor be put forth to reach and instruct, by this means, those children who are not able to attend regularly the Sabbath School.

Further, we would call attention to that which we consider a serious weakness in prevailing methods of Sabbath School work. Out of a total of 5,121 pupils, only 779 are members of the Methodist Church, and but 144 have united with the Church during the year. We are convinced that these results are too meagre, and that special emphasis should be placed upon evangelistic effort among the children.

We would recommend, in this connection, that earnest efforts should be made to form Junior Society classes.

And we also recommend that the Pastors be directed to see that this report be submitted to the Committees of Management of the respective Schools.

We further recommend that the ministers on our circuits and domestic missions do give more attention to the organizing and carrying on of Epworth League work.

As our Epworth Leagues are supposed to be in sympathy with all our Church work, we recommend that they consider the importance of our Missionary and Educational Funds.

Whereas provisions are made in the Discipline of our Church for the holding of a District Epworth League and Sabbath School Convention in connection with the annual Financial District Meeting, we recommend that the chairmen of the respective districts, where practicable, make arrangements for such Conventions.

Your Committee on Sabbath Observance beg to report as follows:

We are pleased to say that we believe that the faithful teaching and steady influence of the Christian churches are contributing to a better observance of the Lord's Day in this Province; yet lovers of the Sabbath cannot afford to relax any effort, but are called upon to exercise an increase of vigilance in resisting the insidious influence of greed and pleasure seeking.

We deeply regret the manner in which the sanctity of the Sabbath has been invaded by the carrying on of public works. We refer particularly to the operating of mines and canneries on the Lord's Day.

We feel that it would be well to bring to the notice of owners and large shareholders the importance of using their influence to keep down such desecration.

We also deem it wise to do our best as a Church to discontinue pleasure seeking on Sunday by means of bicycles and other conveyances.

And, furthermore, as we have no Sabbath law in operation in our Province, we think that this Conference should bring pressure to bear upon our local legislature in order that we may secure some law in the matter.

REPORT OF TEMPERANCE COMMITTEE.

To the President and Members of the Methodist Conference :

Your Committee beg to report as follows :

We desire to draw the attention of the Conference to the report of the Indian agent for the North-West Coast District, published in the Government Blue Books, in which he states that the drinking of intoxicating liquors is on the decrease among the Indians, owing to the fact that they have learned to use all kinds of liquor, and now use them in moderation ; your Committee believe that such a statement is either a perversion of the facts of the case, or a confession of incompetence or unwillingness on the part of the Government to enforce prohibition among the native tribes of this Province, and we call upon the authorities to investigate this statement, and enforce the laws that have been enacted in that behalf.

We note with pleasure the formation of a branch of the National Prohibition Federation in this Province, and we express the hope that all temperance organizations and all our ministers and congregations throughout the Province, will co-operate with and assist this organization in every way possible.

In view of the fact that the Government of Canada has brought down a bill for the submission of the straight question of prohibition unencumbered with any other issue, and the latest report is that the bill has passed its second reading by the House of Commons, and that we may look for the vote to be taken early in the month of September next, we need to at once make preparation for the conflict. Money will be required to carry on the campaign, and we appeal to all temperance men throughout the Church to do all they can in this matter.

We appreciate the value of literature in this work, and recommend that our ministers take advantage of the publications provided by the Dominion Alliance, and the offer made by the *Templar* to publish special editions during the campaign, all of which are supplied at a very cheap rate.

The Methodist Church is committed to prohibition by all its past history, by the repeated deliverances of its courts, and to fail now would only bring disgrace on our honored name, and we must use every effort to record the vote of every elector on the side of prohibition.

We desire to record our appreciation of the step taken by his Honor the Lieutenant-Governor and Mrs. McInnes in the stand they have taken to banish intoxicating liquors from their table at Carey Castle.

We believe that where our people have connection with agricultural societies and other organizations that hold public banquets, they should use their influence against the use of alcoholic liquors in the offering of toasts.

REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON CHURCH PROPERTY.

Your Committee recommend :

1. In regard to the recommendation from the Kootenay District, *re* the Church property at Ainsworth, that permission be granted to sell the property with the consent of the Chairman and Financial Secretary of the Kootenay District, and the Superintendent of Kaslo, and that the surplus, if any, be applied to the Conference Church and Parsonage Fund.

2. That the recommendation from the Simpson District, that permission be granted to take down the church and mission house at Kitzegucla, and to use the material in the erection of a church at the village, be adopted.

3. That the recommendation from the Simpson District, that the consent of Conference be granted for the removal of the church at Clew village, and to use the same to enlarge the church at Skidegate, be adopted.

4. That the recommendation from the Simpson District, that the Indians of the village of Lak Kalyap be allowed to appropriate the rear

half of the mission lot for building purposes, subject to the direction of the Missionary and Chairman of the District.

5. In regard to the matter of securing titles to church property, it is recommended (1) That the chairman of each district be directed to collect all available deeds of connexional property within the bounds of his district. (2) To forward to the Secretary of Conference a complete list of all such deeds. (3) That in cases where deeds are lacking, or incomplete, they be secured and registered without delay. (4) That all available deeds, together with a complete list of those not available, be deposited in the Registrar's Office at Victoria and that a suitable box be provided for the purpose. (5) That the President and Secretary of the Conference be the joint custodians of the deeds. (6) That the list of deeds be revised at each Annual Conference by the Church Property Committee.

CHURCH AND PARSONAGE FUND COMMITTEE.

To the President and Members of British Columbia Conference :

BRETHREN,—We, appointed as a Church and Parsonage Fund Committee, report as follows :

Whereas, the sum of \$367 has been collected by the Rev. C. Ladner as a nucleus to a fund (\$200 of which has been loaned Trustee Board at Rossland, and \$100 to Trustee Board at Trail, and \$67 to Trustee Board at Sandon, subject as to repayment and rate of interest to the decision of this Conference at its session of 1898), and for the further aid for the collections and dispositions of such collections we recommend :

1. That a fund be established to be known as the British Columbia Conference Church and Parsonage Aid Fund.

2. That the Rev. C. Ladner be authorized to solicit aid for this fund in British Columbia and in the East.

3. That this fund be placed in the hands of a standing committee with power to act in the granting or refusing of applications for loans from this fund.

4. That applications for loans from circuits and missions be made to the secretary of this committee, who shall present them for approval to the committee. Upon obtaining such approval loans may then be made, bearing interest not exceeding 5 per cent. per annum, payable half-yearly.

CHURCH AND PARSONAGE FUND STANDING COMMITTEE.

The Standing Committee on the Church and Parsonage Fund of the British Columbia Conference met in the Conference room, May 18, 1898. Rev. C. Ladner was appointed chairman, Rev. S. J. Thompson, secretary, and D. Spencer, Esq., treasurer of the fund.

Whereas, out of the sum of \$367, collected by Rev. C. Ladner, there has been loaned to Rossland \$200, Trail \$100, and Sandon \$67, subject to such conditions as might be enacted at this Conference ;

We recommend (1) that these trustee boards be informed that they shall be expected to pay interest at the rate of one per cent. per annum on such loans ; (2) that the Rossland board be instructed to repay to the Treasurer the sum of \$25, Trail \$15, and Sandon \$10, on the first day of November, 1898, with interest and a similar amount on the first of May, 1899 ; (3) that as soon as the sum of \$50 shall be in the hands of Treasurer it shall be loaned to the Trust Board at Ymir to aid in the erection of a parsonage ; (4) that any further amounts which may be paid into the fund shall be retained by the Treasurer until next Conference.

SUPERANNUATION FUND.

*Report of the Board of the Superannuation Fund, for the Year ending
July 31st, 1897.*

To provide against an increase of indebtedness ten per cent. has been deducted from the annuities.

The estimated receipts, carefully made at the beginning of the year, have fallen below the actual expenditure, \$3,373. The falling-off in receipts, as compared with the estimates, is largely due to the payment of a less amount from certain Circuits, the Book-Room, and the Missionary Society than was anticipated.

The returns show that the Circuits and ministers generally are loyally sustaining the Fund.

The arrearages during the last two years, amounting to over \$5,000, are chargeable principally to probationers.

The Board would remind Chairmen of Districts that probationers are under obligation to pay their subscriptions to the Fund annually, according to the years travelled, without regard to the credit given them in their studies.

The Permanent Fund has been increased during the year, \$8,230.

REPORT OF SUB-COMMITTEE.

Resolved,—That the doctrines taught in Columbian Methodist College in its education of students in Theology, shall be those of the Methodist Church contained in the twenty-five articles of religion as contained in the Book of Discipline of the Methodist Church and taught by the Rev. John Wesley, M.A., in his notes on the New Testament, and in the first fifty-two sermons of the first series of his discourses published during his lifetime.

REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON MISSIONS.

The Committee recommend as follows :

1. That the Report of the Boys' Industrial Institute at Port Simpson be received and published in the Minutes.
2. That the Conference recommend the General Board of Missions to renew their grant of \$500 towards the maintenance of this institute, and in addition grant \$300 for the salary of a matron.
3. That as the Woman's Missionary Society has granted \$500 for the commencement of industrial school work at Hugwilget, Upper Skeena, the Conference request the General Board of Missions to give its consent in order that the work may be commenced, though on a small scale.
4. That the President of the Conference and Revs. T. Crosby and C. M. Tate be a committee to investigate the census returns of Indian population in this Province, gather all possible information on the matter, and report to the Mission Rooms.
5. That the Conference recommend the General Board of Missions to form the Japanese work in Victoria into a new mission.
6. That the Conference hereby memorialize the General Conference *
 - (1) To consider carefully the whole question of the division of the Missionary Fund.
 - (2) That strict measures be adopted to correct such abuses as the unnecessary division of circuits; the creating of new missions to support superfluous men: the too rapid introduction of men into our ministry who, though confined to particular Conferences, entail a claim on the whole connexion, and to prevent such abuses by limiting all missions to such fields as are absolutely needed to render the work of the Church effective and aggressive, and to limit the number of new men to the actual demands of the work.
 - (3) That there be a vigorous superintendency of all Home Missions by means of a General Superintendent with additional powers, or a Mission Superintendent with powers to see that the above principles are enforced with a view to raise every mission, as soon as possible, into self-support.
 - (4) That when the claims have been reduced to a minimum, the *pro rata* amount required to raise a sum sufficient to meet the need be apportioned to each circuit and mission as the minimum amount that should be raised therein, and to raise which every effort should be made.
 - (5) That for foreign (non-English) missions there be a complete system of superintendency covering the whole field of activity from general oversight to the details of the work.
 - (6) That definite legislation be enacted relating to the management of mission fields, councils, districts and conferences which shall give to them the largest possible amount of local control and initiative within defined limitations, and safeguarded by the superintendency above indicated.
 - (7) That the General Secretary be relieved of office work and financial responsibility and shall give his whole time to administrative functions.
 - (8) That there be a field secretary whose chief duty shall be to inform, arouse and inspire the Church to an intelligent enthusiasm in the whole so as to gradually and surely raise the tide of giving for missions.
 - (9) That the number of members on the General Board be greatly reduced, and continuity of action secured by less frequent change of *personnel*.

* Some think that the Conference changed this, and recommended that there be no division of the Missionary Fund.

7. That we call the attention of the General Conference to the whole matter of the appropriation of the Mission Fund, urging that some means be devised to provide more amply for Domestic Missionaries.

8. That the requests for a teacher at Nootka, a lay agent at Kilsimat, and a preacher for Bella Coola be referred to the General Board of Missions.

9. That we recommend the General Board of Missions to consider carefully the appointment of a medical missionary to the west coast of Vancouver Island, such a missionary being urgently needed.

10. That we recommend the General Board of Missions to appoint a lady teacher to Cape Mudge in addition to the present lay agent.

11. That the Committee on Statistics of Indian Schools be permitted to postpone their report till next Conference.

12. That permission be granted to remove the old Clew church from Clew to Skidegate; also to remove the church from New Kitzegucla to Old Kitzegucla.

13. That we recommend to the General Board of Missions that a medical missionary be sent to the Forks of the Skeena, such a missionary being urgently needed.

14. Whereas the Woman's Missionary Society has already provided for the maintenance of a Girls' Home at Kitamaat, and whereas it is desirable that a like home be established for the boys of that and surrounding villages—Resolved, that we urge upon the Missionary Board the importance of establishing a regular boarding school for boys and girls at that place, providing that the Government will give the per capita grant usual in such cases.

15. That the Conference request the Missionary Society to assist the Japanese Hospital at Steveston to secure the services of medical help for the summer months, and that this request be referred to the executive of the General Board for immediate action.

16. That we request the Missionary Society to seek for and secure a suitable man to superintend the Chinese work in this Province.

17. That the Conference recommend the General Conference to form the whole of the work in this Province into a Missionary District.

18. That we recommend the General Conference to take into careful consideration the whole question in reference to Indian population and schools and the subject-matter of the address presented to the Hon. C. Sifton, Minister of Interior, by the Conference Special Committee.

19. That we recommend the General Board of Missions to pay the debt of \$260.04 on account of the mission steamer *Glad Tidings*.

20. That the committee appointed to prepare the course of study for Indian and lay agents be granted time to prepare a report, and that they send it on to the General Conference.

21. That the question of the disposal of the *Glad Tidings* for the ensuing year be referred to the Stationing Committee, and that the Rev. J. C. Speer, Sheriff McMillan and David Spencer, Esq., be a committee of reference for the *Glad Tidings*.

22. Whereas some native Indian agents and white lay agents are laboring as missionaries in localities remotely situated from ordained ministers, and whereas, if invested with limited ministerial authority,

their influence and usefulness among the people would be greatly increased; therefore Resolved, that this Conference memorialize the General Conference to provide such legislation as shall empower this Conference to ordain such brethren for the Indian work after having given evidence of such qualification, educational and otherwise, as may hereafter be imposed, such ordination to be characterized by such limitations as may, in the judgment of the General Conference, be deemed necessary and advisable for the protection of the Church.

REPORT OF MISSION BOAT "GLAD TIDINGS."

The visits of the boat over the Bella Bella District have been made a great blessing during the past year. Early in the fall we had her on the ways, and had some much-needed repairs done. Her keel and some of her plank had not been removed since she was on the rocks some years ago, so we had a new keel put on her, also a new rudder, stempost and some new planking. Mr. Turpel, the ship-builder, who saw the timbers when the planks were off, says she is now as good as ever she was, as there is no sign of decay in her timbers. We also had her shaft up and lined, and her engines put in good order, so that on her last trip of 1,300 miles she made good time on very little fuel. We think now a man should be placed on board of her, and be allowed to go all along the coast and preach the Gospel to every creature, and take warm-hearted evangelists from place to place. By this means he could help to build up our old missions, and, when the Church is ready, plant new ones amongst the thousands on the west coast of Vancouver Island, and amongst the Fort Rupert's and Knight's Inlet, on the main shore.

REPORT OF COQUALEETZA INDUSTRIAL INSTITUTE.

We are able to report an average increase of eight in attendance for the year ending March 31st, over the previous year, with present attendance of 102. Thirty have been received during the year, and twenty discharged. The work of the institute has been faithfully maintained, and the progress of the children in their studies has been quite marked. It is touching to witness the sorrow, even to tears, which the pupils sometimes evince if their recitations are not perfect. A Dressmaking Department has been added during the year, in which the large girls display a very creditable proficiency. In the matter of sewing, our girls took a large number of prizes at the agricultural exhibitions, last autumn, at Chilliwack and New Westminster. The band is making progress that calls forth general expressions of commendation from lovers of music throughout the community. The health of the children has been on the whole better than last year, although we have had to sorrow for the loss of three little girls and one boy. Their child faith and dying testimonies have been a benediction to all. We have been cheered by the interest in divine things which has been shown in a marked degree during the year. As a result of a few weeks of special services, nearly all except the very smallest children gave their hearts to God. On Sabbath evening, May 1st, fifteen children were publicly received on probation for membership, twenty are counted as catechumens, and six are returned as full members, having served a probation much beyond the limit assigned by Discipline, until those who watched over them were fully satisfied with their piety and Christian steadfastness. The children display a gratifying interest in our missionary offerings, and at our anniversary contributed from their very small earnings no less than \$34.15, besides collecting on card from friends outside the Institute, \$13.00 more; and giving to the Mission Band \$6.25. Four of the larger girls are members of the local Woman's Missionary Society, and paid their annual dues of \$1.00 each. We are doing a great work, and are devoutly thankful for the privilege of laboring for the Master in this field of widening possibilities.

FROM STATIONING COMMITTEE.

Resolution *re* ministers left without station at their own request:

"That whereas certain ministers of this Conference have committed themselves to certain secular projects, no doubt with laudable objects in view, either to relieve themselves of financial embarrassment, or to procure means to further equip them for their work;

"And whereas these brethren have requested to be left for the present year without appointments that they may be able to execute the purpose, therefore

"*Resolved*,—That this Conference cannot fail to recognize the inconsistency involved in these requests, if indeed it may not proceed to the length of questioning the power of either the Stationing Committee or Conference to comply with such requests, especially in view of the principles clearly expressed in par. 238 of our Book of Discipline.

"And further, this committee, aside from considerations of disciplinary requirement, would seek to discountenance a practice which is in danger of growing, and calculated to bring the work and office of the ministry into disrepute, and otherwise decrease the influence of the Church.

"While this committee sympathizes with the brethren referred to in the peculiar circumstances in which they are placed, it very strongly expresses the hope that they will, as soon as may be, report for duty and thus again bring themselves into harmony with their ordination vows, and the important and clearly expressed principles of our Church in reference to the devotion of its ministry to its high and sacred calling."

MEMORIALS TO GENERAL CONFERENCE.

1. On motion, Resolved that whereas the provisions made by our Church for the support of its worn-out ministers, and for the widows and children of deceased ministers is, at best, only inadequate; and whereas these claimants have failed to secure, without a serious discount, the full amount of their present disciplinary allowance, this Conference earnestly memorializes the General Conference to enact such legislation as shall secure that these claims be met without abatement.

2. On motion, Resolved that whereas there is an increasing objection to the course now pursued in raising the portion of the Superannuation Fund income paid by circuits and missions, which includes an assessment at the rate of five per cent. on account of missionary money collected from each circuit and mission, thereby placing an impediment in the way of attaining increase of missionary income; therefore this Conference respectfully memorializes the General Conference to so amend that part of the Discipline governing the sources of income for superannuation, as not to make income for the Missionary Society a basis of assessment.

3. On motion, resolved that we memorialize the General Conference to place women on a parity with lay delegates in our ecclesiastical polity.

4. On motion, resolved that we hereby memorialize the General Conference to so amend the Discipline as to make the pastoral term five years instead of the present law, which makes the term three years with a possible four or five, as stated in sec. 6, par. 140, sub-sec. 4 of the Discipline.

MISCELLANEOUS RESOLUTIONS.

1. *Re* CHAN SING KAI.

In Ministerial Session, on motion, *Resolved*, That Bro. Chau Sing Kai, having been a probationer in this Conference from the year 1891, and having completed his course of study prior to the Conference of 1897, was entitled to be received into full connection with the Conference one year ago; but his examination papers having to be sent to San Francisco to be passed upon by the examiners, the Conference did not learn that Bro. Chan Sing Kai had passed the prescribed course of study in time to enable them to receive him into full connection last year.

The Conference, recognizing that Bro. Chan Sing Kai was in no way responsible for this, feels that it would be very unjust that he should lose the claim on the Superannuated Ministers' Fund for the past Conference year, which he would regularly have had but for this delay in his being received into full connection, asks that the Board of Management of the Superannuation Fund, in computing Bro. Chan Sing Kai's period of annuity, count the Conference year 1897-8 in his term of effective service, after the completion of his probation, although his reception into full connection was delayed for that year for the reason which has been assigned.

2. CORRESPONDING MEMBERS.

On motion, the Rev. Dr. Sutherland, General Secretary of Missions; Rev. Jas. Woodsworth, Superintendent of Missions; Rev. Principal Sipprell, and Rev. G. F. Swinnerton were granted the privileges of corresponding members of the Conference.

3. COLLEGE SUBSCRIPTIONS.

On consideration of ways and means of continuing the work of Columbian Methodist College, it was

Resolved, That an appeal be made throughout the Province for at least four thousand dollars, in fifty dollar shares. To inaugurate the scheme a subscription list was opened and thirty-one shares taken amounting to fifteen hundred and fifty dollars.

4. COLLEGE SCHOLARSHIPS.

Resolved, That a subscriber of \$50.00 to College Fund, paid during the ensuing College year, shall be entitled to a certificate good for a collegiate course for a year for one student, whether the student be a member of subscriber's family or not, provided the name of the student be written on said certificate, which certificate shall not be negotiable.

Also *Resolved*, That the details of arrangement as to time during which the certificate for one year's collegiate fees shall be allowed, be relegated to the Board of Directors.

5. COLLEGE STAFF.

Re the number of the teaching staff it was, on motion,

Resolved, That the recommendation of the report be adopted, but in case the Board of Directors find it necessary to increase the staff, owing to the increase of students, they shall be authorized to do so.

6. CARE OF "GLAD TIDINGS."

On report of the Stationing Committee it was

Resolved, To recommend the General Board of Missions to make a sufficient grant on account of the *Glad Tidings* to meet the expense of the care of the boat during the ensuing year.

7. REDUCED RATES.

On motion, *Resolved*, That in the matter of half-fare permits and passes from the railway and steamboat companies in this Province to the ministers and probationers of this Conference, each Chairman of District be a committee of one to communicate with these companies on behalf of the men in his district, and that the Secretary of Conference be a committee of one to arrange with said companies for special rates of travel to our Conference gatherings.

8. MINUTES OF CONFERENCE.

On motion, *Resolved*, That the Secretary of Conference be authorized to engage not more than one hundred copies of the Minutes, unless a larger number is ordered by members of the Conference or others, each subscriber to be personally responsible to the Book Room.

9. BILLETING FUND.

On motion, *Resolved*, That all members of Conference receiving billets at the next Annual Conference, shall pay the sum of two dollars each into a billeting fund, the surplus of which, after all expenses and bills are paid, shall go to the Sustentation Fund of the Conference. Also on motion, *Resolved*, That the hotel expenses of the wives of ministers attending Conference be paid for this year, but that such expenses shall not be a charge on the Billeting Fund hereafter.

10. W. M. S. SUNDAY.

On motion, *Resolved*, That the following memorial from the B. C. Branch of the W. M. S. be received and referred to the favorable consideration of all the superintendents of our circuits and missions :

"Whereas a large percentage of the women of our churches are still uninterested in the work of the W. M. S., and, believing as we do, that in most cases want of interest is due to want of knowledge, we would respectfully ask the B. C. Conference to appoint one Sunday in the year to be observed as 'W. M. S. day in all our churches.'"

11. SUPPLY OF CIRCUITS.

On motion, *Resolved*, That each minister and probationer be responsible for his last year's circuit for two Sundays after the rise of Conference, and for his new circuit on the third Sunday.

12. VOTES OF THANKS.

Cordial votes of thanks were tendered by resolution of the Conference as follows :

To the ex-President, Rev. Thos. Crosby, for the faithful performance of the duties of his office during the past year, and for his earnest discourse on Conference Sunday.

To the ex-Secretary and his assistants for the efficient performance of their work.

To the Rev. Dr. Wilson, of the Reformed Episcopal Church, for his gift to the members of the Conference of his excellent pamphlet on Spiritualism, entitled "Jannes and Jambres."

To the Conference reporters and the press of Victoria for the full and accurate reports published daily.

To Rev. G. F. Swinnerton, for his services in attending to the mail of the Conference.

To the steamboat and railroad companies for reduced fares to delegates to the Conference.

To the Q. O. B. of the Metropolitan Church for the use of the church for its sessions.

To the citizens of Victoria, who have entertained so hospitably members of the Conference.

GENERAL CONFERENCE OFFICERS.

The Conference had much pleasure in welcoming the Rev. Dr. Sutherland, General Secretary of Missions, and the Rev. Jas. Woodworth, Superintendent of Missions in the North-West and British Columbia.

On request of the Conference, these General Conference officers gave interesting and exhaustive addresses dealing with the various aspects and prospects of the mission work of the Church as it is represented in their different departments.

VISITORS.

During its sessions the Rev. Dr. Wilson, of the Reformed Episcopal Church, the Rev. Dr. Campbell and Messrs. McRae, Winchester, Clay and Foster of the Presbyterian Church, and the Rev. Messrs. Trotter and Kendall of the Baptist Church visited the Conference.

DEPUTATION FROM W. M. S. AND W. C. T. U.

The members of the British Columbia Branch of the Woman's Missionary Society waited upon the Conference, and Mrs. S. Chapman was introduced to address the Conference on behalf of the interests of the Woman's Missionary Society and the Woman's Christian Temperance Union in this Province.

It was on motion Resolved, That this Conference, having heard the able and eloquent speech of Mrs. Chapman, rejoice in the progress of the great work in which these organizations are engaged, and pledge ourselves to assist as far as possible in their great missionary and temperance work, in which we heartily wish them God-speed.

CONVERSATION ON THE WORK OF GOD.

A very earnest discussion took place on the best methods of promoting the work of God in which examples of good being done by the labors of travelling evangelists were stated, yet it seemed to be generally thought that more permanent results would follow special united efforts by our own ministers.

ADDRESS TO THE LIEUTENANT-GOVERNOR.

The President and Secretary of the Conference, with the Revs. J. Hall and R. Whittington, M.A., B.Sc., and Messrs. D. Spencer and J. Jessop were appointed as a deputation to wait on His Honor the Lieutenant-Governor and present an address in behalf of the Conference. His Honor gave a very cordial reception to the deputation, and in an impromptu speech expressed great pleasure and deep interest.

At the public Temperance meeting the President, Rev. J. F. Betts, presided. The Rev. A. E. Green, Miss Bowes, Rev. W. H. Barraclough, B.A., and Rev. Dr. Sutherland, General Secretary of Missions, addressed the meeting.

MISSIONARY.

The Conference Missionary meeting opened at 8 p.m., of May 12th, with the President in the chair. After devotional exercises the meeting was addressed by Rev. C. Ladner, Dr. Bolton, Rev. Jas. Woodsworth, and Rev. Dr. Sutherland.

SABBATH SCHOOL AND EPWORTH LEAGUE.

The public Sabbath School and Epworth League meeting was held on Tuesday, May 17th, at 8.30 p.m., Rev. John Robson, B.A., in the chair. Addresses were given by Revs. W. H. Pierce, Goro Kaburagi and W. L. Hall, and Bro. Tom Chue Tom.

Collection for General Funds, \$4.15.

MEMORIAL SERVICE.

A public Memorial Service was held on Friday, May 13th, at 8 p.m., the President of the Conference in the chair. After the usual opening exercises of our public worship, the obituary of our deceased brother, Coverdale Watson, was read and, on motion, adopted. (See Obituary.)

All the senior ministers of the Conference and several other ministers and laymen took part in the exercises, and gave expression to many

touching memories of the brotherly kindness and ministerial faithfulness of our departed brother.

On request of the President, the Rev. Dr. Sutherland addressed the Conference, and gave a glowing tribute to the memory of Bro. Watson, cheering our hearts and inspiring our minds.

THEOLOGICAL UNION.

On the afternoon of Saturday, May 14th, the Annual Lecture was given by Rev. R. Whittington, M.A., B.Sc. Subject: "Love and Duty."

SUNDAY SERVICES.

OBITUARY.

COVERDALE WATSON

Was born near Whitby, Yorkshire, England, March 16, 1847. When about ten years of age his parents came to Canada, settling in the Township of Walpole, Haldimand County, Ontario, where, with his only brother, now Joseph Watson, he grew to manhood. He was from infancy surrounded by intensely religious and Methodistic influences, and early gave his heart to God. Being endowed with natural gifts of a high order, and possessing a studious disposition and fervent religious temperament, it was not surprising that he was led by his own convictions, confirmed by the advice of judicious friends, to devote himself to the Christian ministry. For his chosen life-work he prepared himself with conscientious care, laying the foundation of a broad and liberal education at the Scotland High School, and later at Victoria University, Cobourg.

Brother Watson entered the ministry in 1869, and was stationed successively at Teeswater, Londesboro' and Holmesville, and Mitchell. After a year at college he was sent to the old St. John Church, Hamilton, Ontario, as the colleague of the late Rev. Wm. Stevenson, being received into full connection and ordained in 1874. From the commencement of his ministerial life he was recognized as being a man of unusual promise, and rapidly rose in the confidence and esteem of the Church. Following his ordination he was sent to Yorkville, then to Peterboro' and to Spadina Avenue, Toronto. He was married in 1881 to Miss Mary Nichols, daughter of the late Rev. Matthew Nichols, of Brampton. The marriage was a most happy one, and his widow with three children survives to mourn her irreparable loss. In the same year he was appointed to succeed the late Rev. R. H. Smith, as chairman of the then British Columbia District, which position he retained until the organization of the British Columbia Conference in 1887, filling in the meantime successful pastorates at Pandora Avenue, Victoria, and at New Westminster. In response to a hearty invitation from Central Church, Toronto, he then returned to Ontario, where he spent three years. But his heart was in the West, and he gladly acceded to the warm request of the people of his old charge in Victoria, who were about to enter their magnificent new church, of which he became the first pastor. Of his work in the Metropolitan, in Homer Street, Vancouver, and in a second appointment to New Westminster, it is needless to write. Thousands can testify to his power as a preacher, his fidelity as a pastor, and his love and sympathy as a friend.

For several years it has been apparent to all that Brother Watson's health was seriously impaired, but he maintained his labors with

wonderful persistency and courage. During the sessions of the District Meeting held in his own church in New Westminster, May, 1897, he was attacked by a succession of severe hemorrhages which brought him to the verge of death, inasmuch that his family and physician not only despaired of life, but even said "he is dead." He rallied, however, and for several months was able to walk about, maintaining a lively interest in the home, in the work of the Church and in current events. Indeed for a time his strength appeared to increase, when appendicitis ensued. An operation was performed, but his enfeebled body could not bear the shock. He sank rapidly, and three days later, on February 21, 1898, his sanctified spirit was released from his earthly tabernacle and mortality was changed for life.

Bro. Watson was a man of large and varied gifts. His life as a student was marked by thoroughness, and his reading, especially along theological lines, was extensive and discriminating. He was naturally an investigator, and possessed a decidedly metaphysical mind which delighted in pursuing a subject to its ultimate analysis. No man was more keen in detecting, or more merciless in exposing a fallacy. He could be severe in denouncing the specious and false maxims by which current evils are defended or wrong principles maintained. His preaching was intellectual, and his sermons were marked by powerful appeals to the conscience, delivered in a manner and with a tone that rendered them peculiarly impressive. Intense spirituality, fearlessness and faithfulness characterized his pulpit efforts. He recognized vividly the high standard of scriptural holiness which Christianity demands, and earnestly pressed believers to its attainment. As a man he was upright, as a Christian saintly, strong in faith and mighty in intercession, as a friend tender, faithful and charitable, as a minister dignified, earnest and successful.

He held a very warm place in the affection and esteem of his brethren, among whom his memory will long be cherished. Our Conference has been bereaved of one of its most beloved and honored members and the Methodist Church of one of its foremost preachers and pastors. But "we sorrow not as those who have no hope." "He was not, for God took him."

One more of the militant host whose ranks are multiplying in every land, has joined the disembodied throngs who unceasingly celebrate the praises of the Lamb in the anthems of the skies.

" Oh, may we triumph so

PASTORAL ADDRESS.

The British Columbia Conference in session assembled at Victoria, to the churches scattered over this wide Province, greeting :

Grace and peace be multiplied unto you through the knowledge of God and Christ Jesus our Lord.

During the sessions of Conference, from the beginning to the end, we have been favored with much of the presence of Almighty God. We thank you for your prayers, believing the prayers of the righteous avail much.

During the year past our ranks have been broken. Death has taken from us our dear brother, the Rev. Coverdale Watson, whom we loved for his deep piety, esteemed for his wide knowledge of the Word of God, and for his ability to deal with the souls of men in leading them from darkness into light. Let us commend his widow and his fatherless children to the care of our heavenly Father

The Rev. A. Sutherland, D.D., the General Secretary of Missions, and the Rev. James Woodsworth, Superintendent of Missions for the Manitoba and North-West and British Columbia Conferences, have been with us. Their presence, their wise counsels, their inspiring addresses so full of the spirit of Christ, have added much to our enjoyment and have given a great impetus to our work.

The growth of the work of God in our older circuits and missions and its great expansion in the mining districts, call forth expressions of gratitude to Almighty God, and are ground for encouragement and increased zeal in the Master's cause.

Our missionary work amongst the native and foreign population of this great Province has been carried on with great vigor and success.

The gold fields of the Yukon district to which vast crowds of men have made their way from all parts of the world demand our immediate attention. A call was made for suitable men to enter those fields to dispense the word of truth. Our Brother James Turner responded to this call of the Church and has gone to the Yukon. Let us follow him not only with our prayers but with good financial support.

Your prayers are still asked for that God may send more laborers into His vineyard; for the harvest truly is plenteous but the laborers are few.

There are Macedonian calls on every hand, "Come over and help us." We do pray that God will raise up faithful and skilled workers, so that in every part of this great land none may be deprived of the privileges of the means of grace. To this end you as stewards of God's bounty are required to give liberally.

When we come to stand before the judgment-seat of Christ and see how much has been left undone, we shall deeply regret how little we have done to spread the knowledge of the kingdom of our Saviour. That we may hear the sentence, "Well done, thou good and faithful servant," let

us make the pound that has been given each of us ten pounds. Let us not hide our pound in a napkin.

The interest in our educational work is not abated. The Columbian College is making real advancement under its present energetic and learned principal, the Rev. W. J. Sippell, B.A., E.D. It demands not only your moral, but also your hearty and liberal financial support. The education of your sons and daughters is a duty you must not evade. Mere secular training is only partial in its results. To make true men and women the whole nature must be developed—the physical, the moral, and the spiritual. In our Columbian College such an education can be obtained.

Brethren, take a deep interest in the educational work of our Church. The year on which we are about to enter will be one of the most important in our history. It will either mark the time of our country's desire to cast off the chains that have bound a large portion of our fellow-men in abject slavery—and to destroy the evil that has been the source of three-quarters of the crime that has filled our prisons with our fellow-men, who, but for the intoxicating cup would be following the peaceful avocations of life—or it will show to the world that our religion is too much a sentiment and not a purpose to reform and lift up the human family to the highest plane which God has made for it to stand upon. We refer to the plebiscite to be taken this year for or against the devastating liquor traffic. With the true Christian, with the philanthropist, with him who has the spirit of Christ, there can only be one voice: Rid our country of this greatest curse. Brethren, vote as you pray: "Thy will be done on earth as it is done in heaven."

We would heartily recommend to you our "Revised Catechism," which embodies in a concise form the doctrines of our Church, which are the great principles of our gracious Lord. Learn these doctrines yourselves. Teach them to your children, and so open up the way for a glorious future for this great country, remembering that righteousness exalteth a nation, but ignorance is a crime.

This is an age of excitement. The rush for wealth is great. Men are leaving the steady avocations of life, and are hastening amidst trials and great hardships to distant gold fields, spending their savings from years of hard labor, with the hope of becoming suddenly rich. Let us remember the Word of God, which says, "But they that would be rich fall into temptation, and a snare, and into many foolish and hurtful lusts which drown men in destruction and perdition."

Brethren, keep up family prayer and the reading of the sacred Scriptures. Encourage and strengthen our Sabbath Schools and our Young People's Societies. Remember the Sabbath Day to keep it holy. Support with your liberal contributions all the departments of Christian work.

Live near to God. Often commune with Him in prayer. Be pure in heart, for then you shall see God. Remember the word of St. James: "Pure religion and undefiled before God and the Father is this, To visit the fatherless and the widows in their affliction and to keep himself unspotted from the world."
