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CONSTITUTION

OF THE

DIOCESAN CHURCH SOCIETY

OF

NOVA SCOTIA.

ACT OF INCORPORATION.

(Passed the 31st. day of March, A. D., 1851.)

Be it enacted, by the Lieutenant-Governor, Council, and Assembly, as follows:

I. The persons hereinafter named, that is to say, the Bishop of the Diocese for the time being, the Venble. Archdeacon Willis, the Reverend Fitzgerald Uniacke, the Reverend Edwin Gilpin, the Honorables Brenton Halliburton, William B. Bliss, Charles R. Prescott, Henry H. Cogswell, and John Spry Morris, John W. Ritchie, Samuel P. Fairbanks, Lawrence Hartshorne, Henry Pryor, and all such other persons as now are Members of the Society called "The Diocesan Church Society of Nova Scotia," and their Successors, shall be a Body Corporate by the name of the "Diocesan Church Society of Nova Scotia," of which Corporation the Bishop of the Diocese shall be the President.

II. The Corporation may hold Real Estate not exceeding at any one time the annual value of Twelve Hundred Pounds, and the rents and Profits arising from such Real Estate shall be applied for the uses and purposes of the Church or Churches, or of Religious or Educational Institutions connected with the Church of England in this Province. The Corporation shall have power to sell such Real Estate, and to purchase other Real Estate not to exceed the value hereinbefore mentioned.

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III. All persons when admitted pursuant to the Bye-Laws of the Corporation, shall be Members of the Society.

IV. The Society shall be governed and its affairs managed by a Committee of not less than twenty-five persons, comprising a President, Vice Presidents, a Secretary, an Assistant Secretary and Treasurer, the Committee to be henceforth called the Executive Committee, and such other officers as the Society may deem proper.

V. The persons who now hold the offices of the Vice Presidents, Committee, Secretary, Assistant Secretary, and Treasurer, shall continue to hold such offices until their Successors shall be elected under this Act.

VI. All donations to the Society shall be invested or disposed of under the direction of the Executive Committee for the benefit of the Society, and the Executive Committee shall be bound to account to the Society for all their acts, receipts and expenditures, and to make annual report to the Society at its general meeting, of the progress and state of the Society, and of its affairs generally.

VII. A general meeting of the Society shall be held once in each year, and as much oftener as may be directed by any Rule or Bye-Law of the Society.

VIII. The Executive Committee shall be summoned to meet as often as the President or two of the Vice Presidents may deem it necessary, or as often as may hereafter be directed by any Rule or Bye-Law of the Society.

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BYE-LAWS.

Passed at the Fourteenth Annual Meeting of the Society, in Halifax, February 18th, 1852.

1st. Ar all Meetings of the Society or its Committees, before entering upon business, the "appointed prayers" shall be said.

2nd. It is Excellency the Lieutenant Governor for the time being, if a member of the Church of England, shall be respectfully requested to be joint Patron of his Society, with the Societies for the Propagation of the Gospel and for Promoting Christian Knowledge.

3rd. The Bishop of the Diocese shall be President of the Society, with a control over all its proceedings, and no alteration shall be made in the Bye-Laws without his approval.

4th. The Archdeacon of Nova Scotia shall be the first of the Vice Presidents, whose number shall be limited to seven. There shall be also a Secretary, an Assistant-Secretary and a Treasurer.

5th. All Members of the Church are invited to unite with this Society as Subscribers; and every Clergyman licensed by the Bishop, and all Lay-members of the Church of England subscribing not less than Five Shillings annually, or Ten Pounds at one payment, shall be Members of the Incorporated Society, and entitled to vote at all meetings of the same. But no Subscriber shall enjoy any of the privileges of an Incorporated Member, whose subscription is more than one year in arrear. The annual subscriptions shall be considered due upon the first day of January in each year.

6th. The Executive Committee shall consist of the President, Vice Presidents, Secretary, Assistant Secretary, and Treasurer of the Society, who shall fill the same offices in the Committee; of all Clergymen licensed by the Bishop of the Diocese; together with twenty Laymen to be chosen as hereafter provided; and such other members of the Society as may be chosen by the Local Committees, according to the ninth Bye-Law.

7th. An Annual meeting of the Society shall be held at Halifax on the Second Thursday in February, at which the twenty Lay-members of the Executive Committee, together with the Secretaries and Treasurer shall be elec-

ted, and any vacancies in the number of Vice Presidents may be filled up at the pleasure of the Society. A Special General Meeting may be called at any time when the President, or, in his absence, two or more Vice Presidents, or the Executive Committee, shall consider it desirable to appoint such Special General Meeting.

8th. The Executive Committee shall meet monthly during the year, with the exception of the months of July, August and September; and a Special Meeting may be called by the President, or, in his absence, by a Vice President.

9th. The Members of the Church in every part of the Province are invited to co-operate with the Diocesan Church Society, by forming Local Committees under the direction of their respective Clergymen, either in each Mission or Parish, or in more than one Mission or Parish united, as shall be deemed most convenient, and in strict accordance with the designs and rules of the Diocesan Church Society. Every Rural Local Committee shall have the power of appointing one of its members, resident within its district, to be a member of the Executive Committee. It is recommended to the Local Committees to forward their funds, as they may be collected, to the Executive Committee, who will faithfully apply them to the general objects of the Society: but when the Local Committees desire it, they shall receive Books at cost and charges, to the amount of one-fourth of their remittances, or the said one-fourth may be placed in the hands of the Endowment Sub-Committee, for the benefit of the Parish or Mission where the money was contributed.

10th. The following objects shall more particularly engage the attention of the Society, as soon as their means may enable them to afford such attention:

- 1 .- Provision for Assistant Missionaries.
- Missionary visits to neglected and destitute places, under the direction of the Bishop.
- 3.—Assistance to the Endowment of Parishes.
- Assistance to the erection or enlargement of Churches and Chapels belonging to the Church of England, in peculiar or extreme cases.
- 5.—Supplies of Books and Tracts published by the Society for Promoting Christian Knowledge, and such other Books and Tracts in strict conformity with the principles of the Church of England, as, having been first carefully examined and approved by a Committee of Revision, to be appointed by the Executive Committee, shall then have received the approval of the Executive Committee, and lastly the written approbation of the Bishop.
- 6.—Assistance to the erection of Parsonage Houses.
- Assistance to deserving young men, desirous of being qualified for the Ministry of the Church, but requiring aid in pursuing their studies at the Collegiate Establishment at Windsor.

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- 8.—Aid to Sunday and other Schools, in which due attention is paid to instruction in the principles of the Church of England.
- 9.—Encouragement to the instruction and training of respectable Teachers for Sunday and Daily Schools.
- Upholding, by all possible and proper means, the Collegiate Establishments at Windsor.
- 11.—It shall also be one of the objects of the Society to provide for the widows and orphans of deceased Clergymen, but no part of the Society's funds shall be appropriated to this object, except such as shall be specifically given and paid into the Society therefor:

To these objects, generally, the contributions will be applied; while those who desire it may have their individual contributions scrupulously confined to any one or more of these objects. And as some Members of the Church, who are not unmindful of the great spiritual wants in their own neighborhood, still feel constrained, in pious gratitude for the blessings they enjoy, to allot something, however small, from the means with which a gracious Providence has blessed them, towards the spread of the glorious Gospel among the nations which still sit in darkness—

11th. This Society will gladly receive and forward to the Society for the Propagation of the Gospel, whatever sums may be given for the conversion and instruction of the Heathen; to which object such sums will be strictly confined by the East India Committee of that Society.

12th. The Accounts of the Society shall be closed on the 31st December in each year, and shall be audited in one month from that time, by auditors to be appointed by the Executive Committee.

13th. An Annual Sermon shall be preached before the Society. The Preacher, time and place, to be appointed by the President.

14th. None of the above Bye-Laws shall be altered except at a general meeting of the Incorporated Society; and a full year's notice of a proposal to change any of them must be given previous to the meeting at which the proposed alteration is to be effected.

PRAYERS

"Appointed" to be used at "all Meetings of the Society, and of the Committees," before they commence business.

PREVENT us, O, Lord, in all our doings, with Thy most gracious favour; and further us with Thy continual help; that in all our works, begun, con-

tinued, and ended in Thee, we may glorify Thy holy name, and finally by Thy mercy obtain everlasting life, through Jesus Christ our Lord. AMEN.

O God, from whom all holy desires, all good counsels, and all works of picty and charity do proceed, we beseech Thee to visit with Thy favour our Sovereign Lady, Queen Victoria; and so rule her heart that she may in all things seek Thy honour and glory. Prosper with Thy blessing the designs of this Society. Comfort with Thy grace those benefactors who contribute to its support. Bless the ministry of Thy servants, the Clergy; the endeavours of all who are engaged in promoting the knowledge of true religion in the parent Kingdom, and the labours of those Missionaries who are spreading the same in the Colonies of the Empire. And may Thy Holy Spirit direct all our consultations to the advancement of Thy Glory and the good of Thy Church, through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

O MERCIFUL God, who has made all men, and hatest nothing that Thou hast made, nor wouldest the death of a sinner, but that he should be converted and live: Have mercy upon all Jews, Turks, Infidels, and Heretics, and take from them all ignorance, hardness of heart, and contempt of Thy Word; and so fetch them home, blessed Lord, to Thy flock, that they may be saved among the remnant of the true Israelites, and be made one fold under one Shepherd, Jesus Christ our Lord, who liveth and reigneth with Thee and the Holy Spirit, one God, world without end.

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ANNUAL MEETING.

THE 15th Annual Meeting of the Society was held at the National School, on Thursday, Feb'y. 10th, 1853.

The Right Reverend the Lord Bishop took the Chair at 101 A.M.

After Prayers, the President having opened the meeting, directed the Secretary to read the Report of the Executive Committee for the past year.

It was moved by Mr. William Morton, delegate from Aylesford, seconded by the Revd. W. Snyder, and

Resolved, That the Report now read be adopted by the Society, and printed and circulated under the direction of the Executive Committee.

The Secretary submitted a statement of the probable income of the Society for 1853, also a memo. of unpaid grants. The former shewed that (exclusive of the debt now due to the Treasurer, £147–16s. 0d.) the funds of the Society would probably be more than sufficient to meet all its responsibilities.

It was moved by the Rev. J. C. Cochran, seconded by the Rev. W. Bullock, and

Resolved, That all grants of more than two years standing, to Churches, must be called for within six months from the 1st April next.

It was also

Resolved, That in future all grants shall be made on the following terms.—Viz:—That the first moiety must be called for within one year, and the second within two years from the date of the grant.

The grants in aid of Assistant Missionaries, which by a late Resolution of the Executive Committee were declared annual, were then considered.

The following were continued for the ensuing year :-

Truro and Stewiacke, Wilmot, Westport and Digby Neck, Annapolis, Pugwash and Liverpool.

The consideration of the grant to Tusket was referred to the Executive Committee.

It was the opinion of the Society that the grant to Albion Mines should be continued until the expiration of the time for which it was granted, viz., 3 years.

It was

Resolved, That the grant to Chester be continued for one year, solely in consequence of the failure of the Fisheries, the money to be paid under the direction of the Bishop.

The grants were continued to the Rev. J. Breading, Salmon River, Eastern Shore, and also for a Travelling Missionary.

It was

Resolved, That the following Lay Members of the Society be the Executive Committee for the ensuing year.

(See List of " Officers of the Society.")

Notice was given that at the next Annual Meeting the following would be proposed as a Bye-law of the Society,-

"That at the annual meeting of D. C. S. the first five on the Committee shall go out of office, but that all or any of them shall, on having a majority of votes, be eligible to be re-elected, and shall be placed at the bottom of the list."

A vote of thanks was passed to the Secretary, Asst. Secretary, and Treasurer, for their services during the past year.

Resolved, That L. Hartshorne, Esq., be the Treasurer, H. Pryor, Esq., A. M., Asst. Secretary, and the Rev. Edwin Gilpin, Jr., A. M., Secretary for the en-

ANNUAL PUBLIC MEETING.

THE 15th Annual Public Meeting of the Society was held in the Tempe-

The platform was occupied by members of the Executive Committee and Delegates from several Local Committees, while the Hall was well filled with an attentive and interested audience.

Moved by the Rev. C. Elliott, seconded by B. Zwicker, Esq. M.P.P. and Resolved, That we cannot allow the present occasion to pass without again acknowledging our debt of gratitude to the Venble. Societies P. G. and P. C. K. for their past benefits and present support.

Moved by Major Norton, U. S. Consul at Pietou, seconded by W. M. Brown, Esq., and

Resolved, That while we express our sympathy with the efforts of our Sister Societies in other Dioceses, we acknowledge that their greater success should stimulate and encourage us in renewing our exertions.

The Right Reverend the President, then left the Chair, and the Venble. the Archdeacon took it, when a vote of thanks to His Lordship was proposed by the Rev. J. T. Twining, D. D., seconded by Mr. Thomas Whitford, delegate from Chester.

The Doxology was then sung, and the meeting dismissed with the Episcopal Benediction.

FIFTEENTH ANNUAL REPORT

OF THE

INCORPORATED

DIOCESAN CHURCH SOCIETY.

OF NOVA SCOTIA.

ADOPTED AT THE ANNUAL MEETING IN HALIFAX, Feb'y 10th, 1853.

Ir has pleased Almighty God that we should again meet together to review the proceedings of our Society during the year that is gone, and to make such preparation for that which is to come as may, with the Divine blessing, be productive of greater success. Such retrospection upon our past labors may indeed afford some cause for regret and disappointment that we have not effected all that we desired. It may shew where we have been negligent in duty, or where zeal may have wrought without knowledge. It may evince errors in judgment or short comings in practice, yet will it furnish abundant grounds for hope and rejoicing, that we have proceeded thus far in the duty which is laid upon us as members of Christ's Church Militant. We will, no doubt, be taught still farther to distrust ourselves and our own efforts, yet will we be encouraged to lean more and more upon One that is mighty, and that has promised to be with his Church throughout all time.

True it is, that we are in no way responsible for, or anxious about, the ultimate success of our labors. That depends upon the will of unsearchable Wisdom, whose decree is immutable, and whose promise is unchangeable.—But we are, individually and collectively, responsible for, and anxious about, the proper discharge of the sacred duty imposed upon us, of spreading abroad through our own generation, and handing down to the succeeding, a knowledge of our great privileges as children of God. We believe this Society to be a means given us by the Divine head of the Church for the promotion of this great work, and as such it demands our most earnest support. Narrowed within no party limits—supporting no contracted views of our Church doctrines, it is based upon the broad foundation of the "Everlasting Gospel," and subjected to the influence of that authority in the Church which is most scriptural, and which the experience of ages has proved to be most beneficial. Thus it invites our most implicit confidence, It is moreover peculiarly our

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own Society, being originated and wholly supported within this Diocese. It is subjected to no control beyond the Church as it exists among ourselves, and thus it excites our especial interest.

Now that the Society has turned its attention so entirely to the support of Missionaries, it is impossible that the Report of its proceedings can furnish much variety of matter. But it is to be hoped that the deep interest which it always felt in the living voice of the Church, and the kind sympathy which is ever shewn with the labors of the Missionary, will learn with greater pleasure

the progress of this most favorite object.

The efforts of the Society to support the Missionary character which it has assumed, have indeed been greater than the present amount of its income can sustain. It now proceeds with its work in the earnest hope that its funds may be increased in proportion to the greater necessity. To meet the demands of the past year it has been necessary to borrow money, and the Treasurer's Account shews the Society to be in debt more than £140. In anticipation of this difficulty, and with the hope that their example might be followed, several members of your Executive Committee lately attended to a recommendation in the last Report, and doubled their annual subscriptions. It is confidently expected that many throughout the Diocese will be ready to do the same. Your Committee are glad to report that the contributions for the present year evince a warmer interest in the Society's progress; but there is absolute necessity for still greater exertion if the eleven Missionaries are to be continued. For our encouragement, let us remember that the Society for the Propagation of the Gospel still continues its favor and liberal support. We annually receive from that Society, for the payment of Missionaries, not less than £550 sterling. In addition to which, they pay yearly to this Diocese a sum of more than £4000 for the support of Missionaries who are not aided by our Diocesan Church Society. Indeed the obligations we are under to the Venerable Societies P. G. and P. C. K. are beyond computation. They first established the Church upon our shores, and through the years of its long infancy have nourished it with fostering care. Neither do they now quite desert the child of their adoption, but gradually teach it to go alone. Hardly a Church has been built or a Parsouage house erected without aid There is scarcely a Missionary in this Diocese who has from their liberality. not at some time past, or does not now receive assistance from the Bounty of the former. While many a Parochial Library, and many a Reading Desk and Communion Table, will bear witness to the generosity of the latter Society.

The Jubilee of the S. P. G. was celebrated throughout this Diocese in the past year. The offerings of the Church among us were indeed small upon that occasion, and it was thought expedient, on account of our great necessity, to apply them to some local object. Society accepted the trust, now amounts to £1520,* the interest arising from this sum up to the 31st Dec. 1852, has been disposed of according to the intention of the fund.

As a collateral means for the furtherance of the great work in which we are engaged, a good Church Paper in the Diocese is of great importance; both for the purpose of conveying quiet and useful instruction, and for communicating matters of general Church interest with which many would otherwise be totally unacquainted. The funds of the D. C. S. cannot be in any way expended upon its maintenance; but a conviction of its usefulness, even with relation to the prosperity of this Society, leads your Committee warmly to

recommend its support.

Another object to which your attention should be seriously turned, is a provision for the Widows and Orphans of the Clergy. The incomes on which many are now obliged to live, are barely sufficient for daily necessity, and it is impossible for them to make any provision against their removal. knowledge that their departure would not reduce to absolute want those who are dependent upon them, would relieve many a mind of much care and anxiety. We observe in the sister Societies around us this object has been brought even more prominently forward and with very great advantage. It should be our endeavor to emulate them in this as well as in many other matters, in which their greater success evinces more zeal and self-denial.

With the earnest prayer to the Divine head of the Church that the review of our past labours may stimulate and encourage us to greater exertions, your Committee proceed to lay before you the general features of their proceedings

during the past year.

The annual responsibility of the Society, thus incurred, is £625 0 0;* and it is for the support of this most important object that an earnest appeal

is made to every member of the Church in this Province.

The Society has to lament the loss during the past year of the Rev. J. Bartlett, assistant Missionary at Annapolis, recently sent to this Diocese by the Society P. G. "He was taken away," writes the Rector of Annapolis, "in the very midst of his present usefulness and while he was acquiring that ripeness and experience which promised still more abundant fruit. He was most exemplary in his life, and devoted to the duties of his sacred calling. By his removal I have lost a valued fellow labourer, the Mission of Annapolis an able and faithful Minister of God's word, and the D. C. S. a valuable instrument of their pious designs."

The Rev. J. J. Ritchie has been appointed by the Bishop to succeed Mr.

The people at Walton and Maitland felt themselves unable any longer to fulfil their engagements for the support of an Assistant Missionary. Bishop therefore removed the Rev. W. Stewart, and the Executive Committee transferred thence to Digby the Society's grant of £50 per annum. In October last, the Right Rev. the President informed the Committee that the Rev. John Griffiths, lately sent out by the S. P. G. had been ordained, and was then diligently performing his duties as Asst. Missionary at Digby Neck and Brier Island.

The £50 formerly granted by the Society for an Assistant, under peculiar circumstances, at St. Margaret's Bay, was placed by the Executive Committee at the disposal of the Bishop of the Diocese. His Lordship has thought it advisable that the grant should be given toward the payment of a Missionary at Pugwash, to which place he has appointed the Rev. F. D. Ruddle.

The following extract from a Letter by the Rev. H. Spike, is worthy of attention, both as an indication of the good success attending that Missionary's labour, and also as an instance of generosity and self denial worthy of imitation :

"I fear our subscription will not be quite as large this year as last; for there have been several subscriptions this year collected for improvements connected with the Church. We have had to repair a leak in the tower of the Church. At my Ordination in Yarmouth a collection was taken for the purchase of a Communion Service for the Tusket Church. Since then we have raised over £20 for a Bell for our Church. We have it up, and its cheering sound is quite refreshing on the Sabbath morning. It weighs about 250lbs, and was purchased at Hooper's and Co.; Boston, it came with yoke and frame complete. Our Communion Service we purchased in Boston, a flagon, cup and plate for £4 10. These together with my salary have pretty well tested their liberality. Nearly £180 have been raised for Church purposes in this Mission during the past year. But our friends in Yarmouth have not been backward in giving us assistance. There seems to be some apprehension that the Society will not be able to maintain the Missionary work already engaged in. When the Clergy met in Halifax two years ago, you may have understood that there was an intended proposition to reduce the Assistant Missionaries' salaries, as they were nearly all unmarried, and as some of the present Rectors who have families to provide for, do not receive as much as the Assistant Missionaries, It was then merely talked about, but at present there seems to be an absolute necessity for such a proposition; it would relieve the Society from present embarrassment—and enable the Committee to extend furthero perations. If they receive £40 instead of £50 from D. C. S. it would make our salary £152 10. It remains of course with the Committee and the President of D. C. S. to consider these things. I may say for my own part, I find my present expenses consume all I have, but rather than any of the Society's operations should be diminished, I thus bring the subject before you that you may know my views as one of the Missionaries interested in the welfare of the Society, I would be willing to make some sacrifice."

The following Letter will be of interest to many, as showing some incidents in the routine of Missionary duty, and the progress of the Church in the wilder and more destitute parts of the Diocese:—

" St. Stephen's Parish, Feb'y. 2nd, 1853.

"REV. AND DEAR SIR,

"In accordance with your wish expressed in a lateNo. of the Church Times, I now send you some account of my Missionary proceedings during the past week, which, though it may not afford matter of very deep interest, may yet give some idea of the nature of

idea of the nature of the work in this extensive Mission.

"On Saturday 22d ult., I procured a boat, but not without much difficulty at this season of the year, in order to meet my appointment for the following day at Blandford, one of our most important out-stations. The day was fine but cold—and wind and tide somewhat adverse. After a few hours bard rowing we reached our place of destination. Blandford is a thriving little settlement situated on a rocky peninsula of some 10 or 12 miles in extent, and lying about S. East of the Town of Chester, from which it is about nine miles distant by water. Nearly 3 miles from Blandford at the back of the peninsula, there is another smaller settlement called Sandy Beaches. The Inhabitants of these places are of German origin, and with exception of a few Lutherans, who are not unfavorable, appear to be deeply attached to the services of the Church. They subsist by farming and fishing—are remarkable for their industry, of which their snug farms, literally dug out of the rocks, which thread the shore, afford convincing testimony; and for their

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ant Missine income kindness and hospitality, of which I was again reminded by the hearty grasp of the friendly hand of my good old host, who had come to meet me on the Beach.

"On the following day, Sunday, I held a full service and had one Baptism at Blandford in the morning, and a full service at Sandy Beaches in the afternoon; both services were well attended. I am happy to be able to state that the facilities and arrangements for Divine Service at the latter place, have been the accomplishments of the past year. On my first visits to this settlement, I frequently urged the importance and propriety of a good School, the preparatory step to which should be the building of a comfortable School House. Two out of three owners of undivided lands expressed a willingness to give up their claim to a piece suitable for this desirable object, but the third hesitated on the ground that, as he had no children to send he could derive no benefit. Consequently that all might co-operate in the undertaking and be benefited by it, I agreed by increasing my own exertions, to devote a regular Sunday Service, once a month, to this settlement. Accordingly I had the satisfaction to see the lines drawn out forthwith, and active exertions begun, for effecting what I had so much desired.

"The House was not long in building, so that on my next visit I entered upon my new plan, that is, instead of two services at B. to hold but one there and the second at S. B's. During the week I held one evening service, with lecture,—visited upward of 20 families scattered throughout an extent of 6 or 7 miles at Blandford, and 11 families throughout an extent of 3 miles at Sandy Beaches. Returning to B. from latter place on Saturday morning, 29th ult., I occupied myself in preparing for the solemn duties of the morrow, which being a fifth Sunday and at my discosal, I determined to devote to this sometimes unavoidably neglected out station, I again repeated the Services as on the former Sunday,

with a Baptism at each place, and congregations unusually large."

"May the blessing of Almighty God attend all our honest endeavors in his cause—may He "prosper our handy work" and send an abundant increase.

It however gladly embraces the present opportunity of congratulating the Executive Committee upon the steady increase of this Fund, and of expressing its undiminished interest in this Branch of the Society's operations.

The amount committed to the care of this Sub Committee, in 52, including interest-on the money invested, is £129 18 1, a small part of which arises from special donations. In consequence, probably, of the great exertions which have been made in the various parishes and missions for other objects, the applications for assistance have not been so many as in the previous year. Neither have the funds at your Committee's disposal been of sufficient amount to give much encouragement to local efforts. The balance remaining of the General Endowment fund being only £11 15 10.

S., and £173 19 2 now deposited in the Savings Bank.

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ENDOWMENT RULES.

THE following Rules for the guidance of the Endowment Sub Committee, were adopted by the Standing Committee, May 17th, 1850:—

I. The investment of Endowments may be made in lands, houses, stock in banks, or other companies, money invested in mortgages, or other securities, to be approved of by the Endowment Sub-Committee, and to be conveyed and held for the benefit of the incumbent or resident missionary, for the time being, of any Parish or Mission for which they are designed, the said incumbent or resident missionary to receive the yearly proceeds only of the interest or rents arising from such Endowment.

II. The conveyance or trust of such Endowment may be made either to the Society for the Propagation of the Gospel, or to the Church Corporation of the Parish, or to the Diocesan Church Society, if it should hereafter be-

come incorporated.

III. When real property is purchased and conveyed for Endowment, it

shall be free from any debt or incumbrance.

IV. The annual proceeds arising from such Endowments shall be withheld from any incumbent or resident missionary of any Parish or Mission, who may be suspented by the Bishop of the Diocese from performing public services in the Churches in his Parish or Mission during the continuance of such suspension.

V. The Endowment Sub Committee shall hold any sums contributed toward the Endowment of any Parish or Mission, as well as the reserved one-fourth of any contribution, that may be made by any Parish or Mission, in trust for such Parish or Mission, and obtain such a rate of interest for the money as may be practicable consistent with safety, until an opportunity shall arise of investing it for the permanent endowment of such Parish or Mission; and if in the judgment of the Endowment Sub Committee, such opportunity or proposition for Endowment shall come within the true intent and scope of the foregoing regulations, they shall authorise the said one-fourth to be paid to the Parish or Mission so applying for it.

VI. If any difficulty shall arise as to whether any opportunity or proposition for endowment be agreeable to the foregoing Rules, or if any other point relative thereto shall be disputed or doubted, the question shall be referred to the Standing Committee of the Diocesan Church Society, at their next meeting

then ensuing.

VII. All applications from any Parish or Mission to the Endowment Sub Committee for aid, shall be signed by the Rector and Church Wardens of such Parish, or by the resident Missionary, accompanied by a Resolution of the Local Committee of the Diocesan Church Society in its favour, in such Mission; and shall state the nature, situation, value, and annual profits of the investment desired to be made, the names of those in whose behalf it is to be made, the office where it should be duly registered, the sums that are contributed for its purchase, and all other particulars which may enable the Endowment Sub Committee to form a correct judgment. All such applications to

be made to the Secretary of the Diocesan Church Society, who is ex-officion Secretary of the Endowment Sub Committee.

Every application for aid in the erection of a Church, must contain the following information:

1.—The precise situation, especially with reference to the nearest Church, and to the amount of population within five miles of the Church.

2.—The Title of the Ground on which the Building is to be erected.

3.—The size of the Building; the numbers it can accommodate; and probable amount of the Congregation that will usually attend it.

4.—The supposed cost of the Building; the progress it has made toward completion; and the amount of contributions on the spot in money or labour.

With reference to a Resolution authorizing the employment of Assistant Missionaries, it was Resolved on the 17th August, 1849:

"That no part of the Funds of this Society shall be paid under that Resolution until the first and each subsequent Quarterly payment of the £50 to be provided by the People in such cases, is actually paid in advance to the Treasurer of the Local Committee."

A question having arsien whether a Member of the Society might devote his annual subscription to any particular object of the Society, the matter was referred to the Executive Committee on the 19th March, 1852; and the following opinion was expressed:

"Resolved,—That it is the opinion of the Executive Committee, that it is the intention of the fifth Bye Law, that the annual payment of five shillings to the general objects of the Society constitutes a Member; but that any person may devote his money to any particular object which is recognized by the Society." *

A Sub Committee, consisting of the Honble. M. B. Almon, L. Hartshorne, Esq., H. Pryer, Esq. and A. M. Uniacke, Esq. has been appointed to invest the funds collected for the Endowment of this Bishopric.

The Endowment Sub Committee of D. C. S. is directed to pay annually to the Rector of Digby the Interest arising from Miss Totten's donation.

In July, 1852, it was Resolved,—

"That the Sum collected for the 'Jubilee Fund,' be invested as the commencement of a permanent Endowment for the support of a Theological Professor at Windsor."

In October last, it was Resolved,-

" That all Grants made by this Society are Annual."

In November the following Resolution was adopted:-

FIRST REPORT

OF THE

N. S. FOREIGN DISTRICT COMMITTEE

OF THE

SOCIETY FOR PROMOTING CHRISTIAN KNOWLEDGE.

The Nova Scotia Foreign District Committee of S. P. C. K. have much satisfaction in presenting their First Annual Report. They gladly embrace this opportunity of acknowledging the great obligations this Diocese is under to the Parent Society, and of expressing their warm sympathy in all its labours, and their implicit confidence in its management. In the early part of the past year it was thought advisable by some members of the Church here, to renew that direct connexion between this Diocese and the Venble. S. P. C. K. which was somewhat interrupted in 1838 by the Society's transfer of its Depository in Halifax to the Diocesan Church Society of Nova Scotia.

Accordingly, the Lord Bishop of the Diocese, together with the Venble. the Archicecon, formed a Foreign District Committee of S. P. C. K.

To this Committee the Diocesan Church Society, by Resolution of 19th March, 1852, re-transferred the Depository, consisting at that time of Books to the value of about £400 currency, and money in the Treasurer's hands, amounting to £302 16 2.

The Committee are fully aware of the great importance of these valuable Books in the Diocese, as a means for conveying sound instruction in Church principles, at a time when the public mind is surcharged with uncertain and erroneous teaching.

It will be the endeavour of the Committee both to evince as far as possible their gratitude to the parent Society, and to improve to the best advantage the valuable trust committed to their management.

They invite all members of the Church in this Diocese to unite with them in a work of so much importance.

During the past year the Depository has received two additions to its stock, in value about £100 currency. It has distributed 125 Bibles, 285 Testaments, 947 Prayer Books, 5115 Tracts, and 179 miscellaneous Publications, amounting to about £130.
