London Monthly Trade Report.—The importations

of foreign and colonial produce during the

past month have been large; business transactions

in the early part and middle of the month were ex-  
tremely dull, and sales could only be effected by

submitting to lower rates; since however, the

markets opened on the 23rd ult., after the Easter

holidays, there has been a marked improvement in

the demand for colonial produce, dealers finding it

difficult to replenish their stocks, which have

been reduced to the lowest possible scale, conse-  
quently a large business has been done at rather

improved prices, but for articles consisting of the

raw materials for manufacturing purposes, which

have been in demand particularly those

which depend upon a foreign market, and prices

have in several instances further declined: an

improvement is however anticipated, as the ac-  
count from some of the manufacturing districts has

been more encouraging than they have been for

a considerable time past, and with an improved

state of the weather, which now appears to be set-  
tling in, a good home trade in manufactures is

anticipated. The continued unsettled state of the continent

almost totally impedes operations on foreign ac-  
count, and a considerable time must elapse, even

after tranquillity shall be restored, before com-  
mercial relations can be re-established on their

former footing.

In the money market capital has been abundant,

but the same disinclination exists to do business,

except for first-class paper of very short date, the

rate for which is now 3 1/2 per cent., for other paper

and securities there is but little doing, although

plenty are offering at high rates: the stock of bul-  
lion in the Bank has decreased about two millions

since our last, a large quantity having been ex-  
ported to the Continent, which, considering that

all confidence in bills has been lost, and the high

premium on gold, is no more than can be expected.

Commercial cities on the continent of Europe and

India, we are glad to state, are of an improved

state. There are but few failures to report—

Stocks, Produce, and Manufactures of other

countries are at a high price, and the demand

is high; although money is still difficult to obtain

upon the best description of security, yet there

has been more freedom in the European

market generally.

There has been more activity in the several

departments of trade and commerce during the

past week. The returns of the elections in France,

and the general tenor of the advices from all other

parts of the European continent, lead to the agree-  
able conclusion, that the political ferment which

has distracted the several kingdoms and states there,

will now gradually settle down, and will be

settled in a manner which will be to the benefit

of all. The accounts from the manufacturing

and other parts of the Continent are of an im-  
proved nature, and the demand for the various

articles of commerce is high, and the value

of most descriptions has experienced a further

advance.

The weather has set in delightfully fine, and is

now everything that can be expected or wished

for. The young crops are shooting forth with

the most promising appearance, and everything

looks rich, luxuriant, and seasonable harvest.

These circumstances have had a telling effect upon

the corn markets throughout the three kingdoms

during the week. We hear nothing yet of the

failure in the potato crop, but from what we

learn, the yield of potatoes this year will be

like that of wheat and other grain—very pro-  
ductive. At Market Lane on Monday, English Wheat

sold at a decline of 1s. to 2s. per quarter. Can-  
adian Flour sold at 22s. to 23s. per barrel. United

States 22s. to 27s. which rates are about

our last quotations, but at these prices the transac-  
tions are limited. The demand for Indian Corn

fell off, and there was not any transactions re-  
ported, although that article was offered at prices

varying from 25s. to 30s. per quarter. The following

In the House of Commons on Thursday, Lord

Palmerston said he had much pleasure in stating

that the offer of mediation by Great Britain had been

accepted by the Prussian Government, as an organ

of the German Confederation, on one hand, and

by Denmark on the other, and that communi-  
cations were going on to render that mediation ef-

fectual. The House then proceeded to attend

reading of the Jewish Disabilities Bill, which, after

long debate, was read a third time and passed.

The Charter Convention has resumed its sittings

in London, but the proceedings are not of much

general interest. There is not so large an atten-

dance as at the former sittings, and less confidence

seems to be placed in Mr. Pease, O'Connell, or

any of the members. Meetings in favour of the Charter continue to be

held throughout the provinces. At Birmingham,

two immense meetings have been held during the

week. That on the 21st was attended by about

2000 people, principally of the working classes.

The market for Railway Stock has, during the

last five days, been influenced by the improved

state of the market, and in consequence of the

large quantities of stock being put forward, and

of as much as £2 per share being attained in some

instances. There has been a large increase of

dealing, and the market has presented a more con-  
siderable time past.

Many ladies of rank and fashion have resolved

during the present season of distress, to

their persons exclusively to the manufacture of

textiles. The determination has been made

with the sanction and approval of her Majesty, and

a formal announcement of the fact will shortly be

made.

The mass of the people in this country is decid-

edly against war; and even if Government had

any inclination to meddle with continental affairs

(which is by no means likely), the people would

prevent it. The prospect of a war every where

wanted. Money is scarce throughout Europe just

now, and Government loans are out of the question

at a time when the non-fulfilment of existing con-

tracts is throwing the richest States into a state of

anxiety almost as day-long as the want of

money confers thereon no benefit to the world

—it prevents a general war. Little is to be

expected, but that they will remain con-

fined to the localities in which they are carried

out, and that peace may speedily be established

through friendly mediation.

The state of Europe generally has been more

settled during the week, though, from the advices

which continue to reach us, we cannot calculate

for any lengthened continuance of the partial

truce, and we are inclined to believe that

hostilities will be renewed in some of the

points of contact.

The cost to the Government of repressing the

movements of the Chartists, on the 10th ult., and

the defence of London for the day, is estimated at

£100,000.

The French provisional Government are buying

in England 25,000 horses to renouet their

cavalry.

The subscription to the Cobden testimonial has

at length closed, and after all drawings made

and the sum of £74,000 to be handed over to

the Duke of Wellington has completed his 70th

year.

The King of Bavaria has abolished the postage

tax on newspapers.

The wreck of the Hannibal, of Hull, a ship of

500 tons burthen, which was found on the coast

of Norway, with only one of her crew alive,

and the rest of her crew having been washed

overboard, is a singular occurrence.

The "New World" Packet, St. John's, N.B.,

arrived on Saturday night, for New York, with

her full complement of passengers, and second

class passengers.—Liverpool paper.

tralia and China, in a kind of fancy wood, termed

makers consider highly elegant and ornamental.

The Paris National announces that M. Guizot

was married in London three years since, to the

Princess de Nemours, daughter of the Duke of

Orleans, and that the marriage should be kept

secret as long as M. Guizot remained in office.

Private letters from Rome announce the arrival

Tau and the Bishop of Arezzo.

of the German troops.

Intelligence from Egypt, under date Alexan-

dra, 19th April, states that an army of 50,000 men

was on foot.

IRLAND.

Strangely unexpected, but at the same time most

important events have taken place in Ireland dur-

ing the last week. What their result will be is a

most difficult matter to tell. The spirit of dis-

affection is not yet tamed; Government has con-

ferred to grasp boldly with the Chartists, Repub-

licans. Proclamations are issued against the

election of the Council of Three Hundred, and the

formation of the National Guard. To this the

Old Guard, as well as the Young Irelanders, have

declared their determination to act in defiance of the

proclamations.

Since our last scene has taken place in Ireland

which cannot fall, with the other important events

occurring in Dublin and in the provinces, we have

a great, and we hope, pacific influence eventually

upon our excitable fellow-subjects. We stated in

our last that Mr. W. S. O'Brien had proceeded to

the South for the purpose of promoting the agri-

culture of the Young Ireland party, and the hon. gen-

tleman, with Mr. Mitchell and Mr. Meagher, visit-

ed Limerick with that object. The population of

that county had been greatly excited by inflam-

matory addresses circulated by the Old Ireland

party, stigmatising Mr. Mitchell as the "calumniator

of O'Connell," and as the "slenderer of the Cath-

olic religion," and the effigy of Mitchell was

burned in the streets of Limerick. In this state of

feeling of the Old Irelanders a soiree was given by the

Club Young Irelanders to Messrs. O'Brien, Mit-

chell, and Meagher. A frightful riot was the con-

sequence. The military and police were called

out; the members of the club fired, and one man

was killed. The house having been broken into by

the O'Connellites, the windows and doors were de-

molished, and Mr. O'Brien only escaped after hav-

ing received some violent contusions on the face.

Mitchell and Meagher contrived to elude the

police by getting away in disguise. In fact, it

did not need for the efforts of the military and

General Napier, who interfered between the par-

ties, the consequences would have been much more

serious.

Mr. John O'Connell, at the Monday's meeting of

the Repeal Association, indicated an intention to

present an address of condolence to Mr. O'Brien

respecting the late unhappy affair. The other

proceedings merely consisted of a long string of

resolutions, declaratory of confidence and approval

of Mr. John O'Connell's conduct, which had been

highly impugned in many quarters "for having

basely truckled to the Whigs." The result

was as follows:—

In consequence of the late riotous proceedings

at Limerick, the Lord Lieutenant has proclaimed

the county and the city of Limerick under the

act for the prevention of crime in Ireland; and fur-

ther, has issued a proclamation, warning the people

against taking part in the proposed Council of

Three Hundred, or the formation of the National

Guard, and that any person who shall be found

participating in either of the above-mentioned

acts, shall be liable to the penalties of the law.

Mr. Mitchell, in his reply to the address of the

magistrates of Dublin, intimates that it is not his

intention to "proclaim" the county and city of

Limerick, but that an important change has taken

place, and that a few turbulent and desperate

men, who have occasioned a great alarm, have

been found upon whom they relied,
