JUSTICE OLIVE'S CASE.

rying out of the second. The case of Justice Olive of Fairville, which has been receiving some attention in the columns of the Gazerie, for the past two days, is one that demands a strict investigation and immediate action. Mr. Olive is a purish court commissioner for Lancaster and dispenses law and alleged justice in the interesting village of Fairville. He has been engaged in this work for years and has been fining delinquents brought before him at his own sweet will, yet in all these years he has never remitted one dollar to the county treasury of the fines received by him. Under the law all parish court commissioners are required to make a return to the clerk of the peace at least once a year, giving the particulars of the criminal cases dealt with by them, the date of the conviction, the amount of the fine or penalty, the date of receiving the fine and the manner of disposing of it. The case of Justice Olive of Fairville

A justice failing to make a return is liable to a penalty of from \$5 to \$20. Justice Olive has made but one return since 1883 and that was in October 1888 when he reported five cases tried but no fines imposed. Those who had cases before Justice Olive knew that it is quite unusual for him to be so lenient and may be disposed to regard the non-imposition of any fines in the five cases reported as quite remarkable. It seems to the GAMETTE that the proper course to pursue with regard to Justice Olive wend be to cancel his appointment after enforcing the penalties agains him for failure to make returns.

Justice Olive's case brings up the whole question of the administration of justices by parish court commissioners and justices of the peace. It is unfortunate that so many men have been appointed to these offices who have not even the ordinary quality of honesty to recommend them. A radical change will have to be made in the entire system and it cannot be made too soon.
