Chancellor of Exchequer Brings Down Budget in British **House of Commons.**

BIG INCREASE ON INCOME TAX PROPOSED.

To Lesson Burden of Man Who Spends Money for Improvements- National Income Must be Increased by \$49,000,000 this Year.

London, May 4—David Lloyd George, chancellor of the exchequer, introduced the budget in the House of Commons today, and estimated the deficit for 1914-15 at \$26,650,000. Adding to this a charge against the exchequer of \$21,090,000 arising from re-adjustment of the relations between imperial and local taxation and a necessary margin of \$1,000,000, the chancellor showed the need of increasing the national income for the coming year by about \$49,000,000.

Increase Income Tax

Mr. Llyod eGorgé's proposal to raise this money include a material increase in the rate of tax levied on earned and unearned incomes, and the raising of the death duties to the maximum of twenty per cent. He plans also to reduce the tax burden to the man who expends money on his property to improve in proportion to the amount so spent.





Federal Department of Public Works increasing the facilities along the coast-Dredge Fielding.

Recent allotments of contracts for public works in the way of wharf and dredging work provide for splendid increase of port facilities at Seal Cove Grand Manam and at Chocolate Cove, Deer Island. At Seal Cove the Federal Department of Public Works is building a breakwater 515 feet long, and averages 21 feet in height. This breakwater is a crib-work filled with rock ballast. It is being done by Contractor Charles A. Huntley. At Chocolate Cove, the Maritime Dredging and Construction Company is to dredge Construction Company is to dredge the bottom and build a wharf 350 feet

Construction Company is to dredge the bottom and build a wharf 350 feet long. The wharf will provide twelve feet of water at low tide. The wharf is of pile and crib work. The dredge Beacon Bar is now at work there. Wharf building will probably begin by the end of the month. When the wharf is completed, Chocolate Cove will be made a place of call by the steamer Viking.

As Fairhaven, Deer Island, Charles A. Huntley is finishing up a pier head extension on a contract allotted and begun last fall. F. G. Goodspeed, resident engineer, St. John, states that these constructions and increases of shipping facilities were considered very necessary by the Public Works Department. The fishery catches of that section were growing more valuable. Motor boat fishing equipment is made wharves necessary. With the Jold dorys, which are now obsolete in inshing, the fishermen could dock on the shore, but they cannot use the beach for motor boats now altogether used for fishing. The Department has kept pace in shipping facilities with te improvements in fishing methods. Mr. Goodspeed says that the dredge Fielding, which has returned here, will get her buckets during the next few days and then proceed to work on the lower channel.






