

PARSON MALLROY.

Just as the oldest inhabitants of New York tell how it was there in the days of her childhood to gather mushrooms on Fourteenth street, so did Peter Bundy love to tell how he had seen New Boston grow from Butke's half-way house to a thriving town of four houses.

Two years since, to the chagrin of the people of New Boston, one of the great trans-continental railroads had been fit to overlook the greatness of this town, and lay the tracks of the new line to Marston some two miles distant.
