To Can Conn.—Remove the skins from tomatoes; boil them for three hours in a porcelain lettle. Then take fresh, tender corn, cut if from the cob, being careful not to remove any of the cob with it; stir it into the tomatoes and boil another hour; then remove from the fire, can (in the cans), and sed immediately; keep in a cool place. When used, take a point of the mixture, abd a pint of fresh water, a teaspoonful of salt, one of butter and two of flour; mix well and boil 15 minutes, and you will have a palatable dish.

GINGER BEER. Take of white Jamaica ginger root four onness; pound it sufficiently to break the fibres; add to it three gallons of boiling water and two ounces of cream of tartar, boil it for five or ten minutes, then strain it and add two pounds of white sugar; stir it until all is dissolved, prictinto a pail, and add half an onnee of tartaric acid, and let it stand until lukewarm; pour in three tablespoonsful of yeast, and mix it well; let if rise from six to eight hours; then bottle, securing the corks tightly. In two or three days it will be good to drink, and can be drunk without injury in the hottlest weather. Six lemons can be substituted for the tartaric acid. Grate the peels and squeeze the juice into the boiling water when the ginger is first added.

Coal Mine Disaster.

TERRIBLE SCENES AT THE PIT'S MOUTH

New York, Aug. 15.—Special despatches state that the Pittston disaster is rivalled only by that of the West Pittston shaft on the 27th of May, but in this case it is certain that all the miners, with the exception of two or three who were at the bottom of the shaft, have perished. Entering the chamber in which the explosion occurred a fall of rock was first found, which hald nearthy upon a car, completely blocking chamber in which the exposion occurred a fall of rock was first found, which laid partly upon a car, completely blocking up one side and leaving a space on the other just sufficient for a man to force himself through. They are continually being brought up in an exhausted condition, but their places are immediately supplied by other volunteers and so the work goes on annehittingly. This the Hamilton directors have accomplished. We have no doubt North on and South Bruce will now get railway accomodation by properly sup-porting the W., G. & B. R. The preent route is the best yet selected; being he most direct one to the central marts and also the one which will be of most service to the largest per of the Northern Townships in County. The Township Council of rris has very wisely given up its intions to submit a sectional bonus to London line, and we hope East nosh, under the changed circum will come to a similar resolution onuses arranged to be voted upon present as follows:—Township of ace, \$10,000; Village of Listowel 000; Elma, \$30,000; Grey, \$35,000; ris, \$30,000; Turnberry, \$28,000; Wawanosh, \$18,000; East Wawa-\$18.000 : Kinloss, \$15,000 ; Ash-\$10,000. 

Tobacco Curss Scan.—Francis Whiting, Norristown, Pa.—For the comfert of Mr. Shaw, Surry, N. H., inform him that by the intrusion of a flock of strange sheep having scab, my flock became infected. This was in Autumn. When fected. This was in Autumn. When winter set in the disease began to appear. Whonever I observed a sheep gnawing itself, tobacco juice was applied to the diseased spot. Thus it was kept under, in good degree, till after shearing, when all the flock was dipped all over, except the eyes, in a large tub of tobacco juice, and cured. Next Winter seab appeared again; flock treated in like manner, and cured. A neighbor told une I could not get rid of it; but, after the second dip-

IN WHAT SHAPE SHALL WE MARKET GRAIN — It is unaccountable to me that so many farmers have not yet learned how to send hay and grain to market, as to make them fay the most profit. I see boat loads and car loads of such produce passing through my neighborhood on its way to your city, hundreds of miles distant. It brings prices that would make a Western farmer's pocket jingle merrily only that a large part of the money stops in the hands of the transporters, to pay freight, Now railroads and sand-boats are excellent institutions, but I have never yet found so good a way to send corn to market as on the four legs of a well-fattened animal. A bull-ock or a hog will pack away a few bashels of corn more snugly than any freight master could do, and it brings better prices, after they have worked it over into beef and pork, than in the rawstate. With the exception of wheat, and perhaps rye, I would not sell a peck of grain from my farm, except for seed.
