TORONTO BELT LINE RAILWAY

THE PROMOTERS INTEND TO PUBLISH ITS CONSTRUCTION.

DEATH RATE STILL HIGH.

There Were 970 Interments in February—An Increase of 19 Per Cent.—Many Victims of Lung Disease.

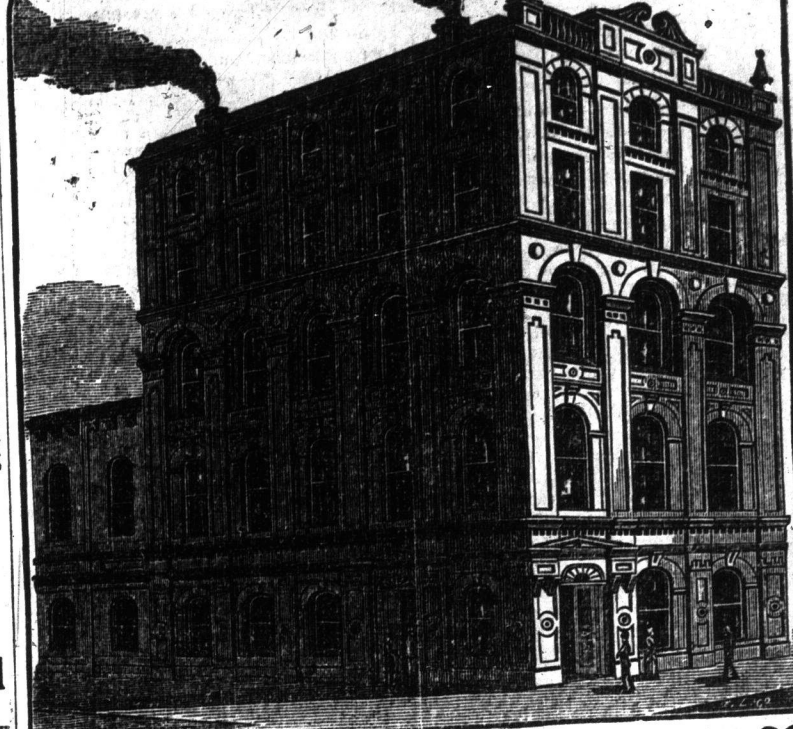
