


What Makes the Horse Shy.—A correspondent says there never shying horse that was not near sighted. Such horses do not see the duntil getting right near to it. Nothing will break the horse of this unless the blinders are discarded and an open headstall used. Treat the kindly. Never whip him, but try to coax him up to the object, that he smell of it. One of the worst shyers was broken by leading, riding driving in a meadow among stone, stumps, boxes and buffalo robes in dispositions every day, the horse being led up to them and allowed to eat oats off the object. Let any one examine a well-behaved horse's eye and a "shyer's" eye, and note the difference.—Michigan Farmer.

Greatest Eclipse, May 27th, 7h 24m A, magnitude (Sun's diam. =1)

in longitude 13° 12m E, and latitude 68° 19m N.

Ends on the Earth generally, May 27th, 9h 28m A, in longitude #W, and latitude 46° 21m N.

nation—The distance of a heavenly body from the Equinoctial, measured orth or south, in degrees or minutes, on a Meridian.

ic-The plane of the Earth's orbit, so called because Eclipses can take lace only when the Moon is on or near it.

ation—The distance of a Planet from the Sun as seen from the Earth. octial—The circle in the heavens traced by the Earth's Equator.

That part of the orbit of a heavenly body which intersects the Ecliptic. It the body is passing from south to north, it is called the Ascending lode; it from north to south, the Descending.

ition—A Planet with the Earth directly between it and the Sun is said be in Opposition to the Sun.

abra—That portion of space around the shadow of the Earth, passing reach which the Moon diminishes in brightness, in consequence of a

FORECASTING THE WEATHER.

Men have, from a very early period, studied the weather, on account of great influence on their pursuits, in order if possible to predict its nature and vent those losses to the Farmer and the Sailor which result from violent standard and the Sailor which results are standa

The earlier students based their predictions on the phases of the moon, an examination of the Greenwich observations for more than half a centhas shown that this theory is entirely unfounded. Weather prophets Moore, Zadkiel and Vennor claim in their Almanacs to be able to forecast weather day by day for a whole year; but meteorological science in the Bri Isles, and the Signal Service of the United States, with the Weather Bur of the Dominion, does not claim to forecast, with any certainty, the weather more than three or four days at the most.

If an observer could obtain, at regular and repeated intervals, readings of Barometer at stations distributed over a large area, he would be enabled trace the march of the storm, for it has been found that the wind always towards the place of the lowest barometer reading; and so, by means of telegraph, he may warn those places the storm is approaching. Still, mistare often made, and the forecasts are not always infallible, so that much mains to be done before meteorology can be ranked among the exact scients.

e progress made in scientific agriculture in this country is something ellous, though, as it is made step by step, it may not attract the eye. for instance, the processes of handling milk, one of our most important acts, and the old methods may be said to have been revolutionized within at ten, it may almost be said within the last five, years. We had first was called the Hardin method, and then an improvement upon that, nonly known as the Cooley method, both of which entirely upset our old as in regard to the temperature of setting milk for cream; and now comes improvement, as it seems, upon both, by which the cream is completely ated from the water of milk by the centrifugal process, in an incredibly time,—from eight to fifteen minutes,—so that it is now possible to take nilk directly from the cow and convert it into first-class butter in less than our's time.

the utility of this method can hardly be fully appreciated without considerable power which it gives of saving all the surplus supplies of milk sent to large cities, so that hereafter none need be lost. It is claimed, also, that are or damaged milk can be treated by this process and wholly restored, fied, and utilized for the manufacture of butter. It is, perhaps, premature y that it is capable of doing all that is claimed for it by interested parties; of far as we can see now, it is a vast step in advance of anything we have in our methods of treating milk, and bids fair to be of untold advantage e producers of milk and to the whole country. It will give facilities for ling milk economically on a large scale, at comparatively little cost, while machines, for use in small dairies, will vastly simplify and shorten the which this business has always involved. It must be regarded, we think, comparably the most important step of progress that the past year has essed.

hen, again, a simple process has been discovered by which fruits and veges can be preserved for a great length of time by coating them with a cless solution by which they are practically hermetically sealed, without any manner disfiguring them. We have seen green cucumbers preserved his way for many weeks, and, when cut open, showing all the freshness and or which they had when first coated in July. In fact, no one could have from the external or internal appearance that they were not taken quite ally from the vines. In like manner water-melons, pine-apples, potatoes, grapes, peaches, and other fruits, were preserved, so that they had made royage from Boston to Liverpool and back, and still retained apparently heir original freshness. If this simple and inexpensive process should e, on further experiment, to be all that it now promises, it will be of unadvantage to the growers of fruits and vegetables for sale, to commerce, to humanity.

hese examples, with many others that might be mentioned, serve to show great and tangible progress has recently been made in agricultural indusand we may still continue to look for greater and even more astonishing in the future.
