WHAT MAKES THE HORSE SHY.—A correspondent says there never was a shy horse that was not near sighted. Such horses do not see the object until getting right near to it. Nothing will break the horse of this habit unless the blinders are discarded and an open headstall used. Treat the horse kindly. Never whip him, but try to coax him up to the object, that he may smell of it. One of the worst shyers was broken by leading, riding and driving in a meadow among stone, stumps, boxes and buffalo robes in different positions every day, the horse being led up to them and allowed to eat the oats off the object. Let any one examine a well-behaved horse's eye and compare it with a "shyer's" eye, and note the difference.—*Michigan Farmer.*

THE USE OF THE LEMON.—A piece of lemon bound upon a corn will remove it in a day or so. It should be renewed night and morning. The free use of lemon-juice and sugar will always relieve a cough. A lemon eaten at breakfast every day for a week or two will entirely prevent that feeble lassitude peculiar to the approach of spring. Perhaps its most valuable property is its absolute power of detecting any of the injurious and even dangerous ingredients entering into the composition of so very many of the cosmetic face-powders in the market. Every lady should subject her toilet powder to this test. Place a tea-spoonful of the suspected powder in a glass, and add the juice of a lemon. If effervescence takes place it is an infallible proof that the powder is dangerous, and its use should be avoided, as it will ultimately destroy the skin and destroy the beauty of the complexion.

In the year 1881 there will be two Eclipses of the Sun and two of the Moon, and a transit of Mercury across the Sun's disc.

1. A partial Eclipse of the Sun, May 27, 1881, invisible at St. John. Begins on the Earth generally, May 27th, 5h. 21m. A, mean time at St. John, in longitude 104° 21m E, and latitude 39° 14m N.

Greatest Eclipse, May 27th, 7h 24m A, magnitude (Sun's diam. = 1) in longitude 13° 12m E, and latitude 68° 19m N.

Ends on the Earth generally, May 27th, 9h 28m A, in longitude 94° W, and latitude 46° 21m N.

2. A total Eclipse of the Moon, on the night of June 11th, 1881, visible at St. John.

First contact with Penumbra,	June 11th,	11h 51m A.

3. An annular Eclipse of the Sun, Nov. 21, 1881, invisible at St. John. Begins on the Earth generally, Nov. 21st, 9h 49m M, mean time at St. John, in longitude 137° 10m W, and latitude 26° 41m S.

Central Eclipse begins generally, Nov. 21, 11h 18m M, in longitude 35m W, and latitude 51° 54m S.

EXPLANATORY.

Apogee—That point of a Planet's orbit farthest from the Sun.

Perigee—That part of the Moon's orbit farthest from the Earth.

Astronomical Day is reckoned from noon to noon through the 24 hours. Thus July 21, 9h, is 9h A of July 21, and July 21, 15h, is 3h M of July 22.

Conjunction—A Planet directly between the Earth and the Sun is said to be in Inferior Conjunction with the Sun. A Planet with the Sun directly between it and the Earth is said to be in Superior Conjunction with the Sun. Planets are said to be in conjunction with each other, or with the Moon, when they are in the same sign and degree.

Altitude—The distance of a heavenly body from the Equinoctial, measured north or south, in degrees or minutes, on a Meridian.

Eclipse—The plane of the Earth's orbit, so called because Eclipses can take place only when the Moon is on or near it.

Distance—The distance of a Planet from the Sun as seen from the Earth.

Equinoctial—The circle in the heavens traced by the Earth's Equator.

Ascending Node—That part of the orbit of a heavenly body which intersects the Ecliptic if the body is passing from south to north, it is called the Ascending Node; if from north to south, the Descending.

Opposition—A Planet with the Earth directly between it and the Sun is said to be in Opposition to the Sun.

Penumbra—That portion of space around the shadow of the Earth, passing through which the Moon diminishes in brightness, in consequence of a part only of the Sun's rays reaching her surface.

Perigee—That part of the Moon's orbit nearest to the Earth.

Perihelion—That part of a Planet's orbit nearest to the Sun.

Quadrature—Two heavenly bodies are said to be in Quadrature when they are distant from each other by one-fourth of the Zodiac, or three signs apart.

Right Ascension—The Declination and fast or slow of clock are given for apparent noon, and the time of passing the Meridian of St. John.

Southing—The Moon's Southing is given in Astronomical time for the Meridian passage at St. John; and her Declination, when on the Meridian.

Phases—The rising of the Moon is given from Full Moon to New Moon; and the setting, from New Moon to Full Moon.

Tides—The Tides in the Calendar are the Morning and Afternoon Tides at St. John and Charlottetown. In the Tide Table (page 12) will be found Constants for finding the approximate time of High Water at each of the places given in the Table.

It will sometimes be found that when a Constant is added to the time of High Water at the Port of reference the sum exceeds 12 hours; in this case subtract 12 hours from the sum and the remainder will be the time of High Water at the required Port on the succeeding afternoon or morning, according as the Tide at Port of reference was a Morning or Afternoon Tide.

FORECASTING THE WEATHER.

Men have, from a very early period, studied the weather, on account of its great influence on their pursuits, in order if possible to predict its nature and prevent those losses to the Farmer and the Sailor which result from violent storms.

The earlier students based their predictions on the phases of the moon, but an examination of the Greenwich observations for more than half a century has shown that this theory is entirely unfounded. Weather prophets like Moore, Zadkiel and Vennor claim in their Almanacs to be able to forecast the weather day by day for a whole year; but meteorological science in the British Isles, and the Signal Service of the United States, with the Weather Bureau of the Dominion, does not claim to forecast, with any certainty, the weather for more than three or four days at the most.

If an observer could obtain, at regular and repeated intervals, readings of the Barometer at stations distributed over a large area, he would be enabled to trace the march of the storm, for it has been found that the wind always blows towards the place of the lowest barometer reading; and so, by means of the telegraph, he may warn those places the storm is approaching. Still, mistakes are often made, and the forecasts are not always infallible, so that much remains to be done before meteorology can be ranked among the exact sciences.

Goat Island; latitude 43° 21m 27s N; longitude 70° 25m 31s W; white tower; fixed white light, visible 11 miles; (harbor of refuge) on the north side of entrance to Cape Porpoise harbor (near Kennebunk); leave on port hand going in.

Boon Island; latitude 43° 7m 16s N; longitude 70° 28m 36s W; grey granite tower, 133 feet above high water; fixed white light, visible 18 miles; on York. Bearings—Cape Elizabeth lights bear N E by N, 30 miles; Matineer lights bear E by N, 80 miles; Cape Ann Lights bear S by W 3/4 W, 30 miles; Isle shoals light bears S W 1/2 S, 12 miles.

Isle of Shoals; latitude 42° 58m 0s N; longitude 70° 37m 25s W; white tower; light, flashing, red and white, visible 15 miles, flashing every 30 seconds on White Island, the most south western of the Isle of Shoals cluster, off Portsmouth, N. H. Bearings—Boon Island light bears N E 1/2 N, 12 miles; White Back light bears N W 1/2 N, 12 miles; Newburyport Bar bears W by S 1/2 S, 17 miles.

Whale's Back Light; latitude 43° 3m 30s N; longitude 70° 41m 48s W; tower white, new tower natural granite color; fixed light, varied by flashes, visible 13 miles; flashes once in 1 1/2 minutes. Fog trumpet giving blasts at intervals of 22 seconds. Also, a bell, struck by hand, both located on the old tower; both to be left on starboard hand going into Portsmouth harbor.

Portsmouth Harbor Light; white tower; fixed white light, visible 14 miles; on left side of inner entrance to Portsmouth harbor.

Newburyport Harbor Light; white tower; fixed white light, visible 12 miles.

Newburyport Upper Harbor; two lights (beacons); outer beacon, black tower, red light, visible 10 miles; inner beacon, red tower, fixed green light, visible 12 miles; both on Bailey's wharf, and to be left on port side passing the harbor.

Ipswich Lights; a main light, with a range light in front; main light fixed, shown by white flashes, visible 11 miles, flashing once in $1\frac{1}{2}$ minutes, shown by a white tower; range light, fixed, white, visible 8 miles, shown from a black tower; the lights are 625 feet apart, N E $\frac{1}{2}$ E and S W $\frac{1}{2}$ W; in range, guide to entrance of channel across Ipswich Bar in the best water; on the Neck, south side of entrance to Ipswich River.

Squam Light; white tower; fixed white light, visible 13 miles; a harbor of refuge for small vessels; on Wigwam Point, east side of entrance to Squam harbor; 6 feet of water on Squam Bar at low tide. To cross the bar, bring the light to bear south and run for it, leaving it on the port side; run far the Lobster Rock Beacon, and leave it on the port side also.

Sandy Bay Light; on south side of Sandy Bay, entrance to Rockport harbor; white tower; fixed white light, visible 11 miles; to be left on port hand when going to Rockport. Bad ledges lie off this light. Strangers should keep north shore of Sandy Bay best aboard on entering Rockport; shelter only for a few small vessels.

Cape Ann Lights; latitude $42^{\circ} 38m 15s$; longitude $70^{\circ} 34m 30s W$; two granite towers, 165 feet above sea level; fixed white light, visible 20 miles; the lights are 900 feet apart, in range at S S W and N N E; located on Thatcher's Island off Cape Ann, and the northern limit of Massachusetts; to be left on the starboard hand in going towards Boston. Bearings—Boston Shoals bears N, 17 miles; Boon Island N N E, 30 miles; Gloucester Light S W by W $\frac{1}{2}$ W, 6 miles; Long Island light S W by W 24 miles; Cod Highland Light S by E $\frac{3}{4}$ E, 43 miles; London Ledge S by E, $\frac{1}{2}$ mile; Salvage Ledge N N E, $1\frac{3}{4}$ miles. Also, a 10 inch steam whistle, giving each minute a blast of 8 seconds and a blast of 4 seconds, with an interval of 4 seconds between them.

Gloucester Harbor Light, on Eastern Point; on east side of entrance to Gloucester harbor; white tower; fixed red light, visible 9 miles. When coming from the Eastward, bound into Gloucester harbor, give the light a good berth near Eastern Point Ledge (spar buoy); then, when the light bears N E $\frac{3}{4}$ N, run N W $\frac{1}{2}$ N until the upper harbor light bears N E by N $\frac{1}{2}$ N, then run for and anchor $\frac{1}{2}$ mile S by W from the light. Also, a bell on Eastern Point, worked by machinery, striking two blows each half minute.

Gloucester Upper Harbor Light, on Ten Pound Island, east side of entrance to Gloucester harbor; white tower; fixed white light, visible 11 miles; to enter harbor, bring this light to bear N E by N $\frac{1}{2}$ N, and run for it until Eastern Harbor Light bears S $\frac{1}{4}$ W, then run N $\frac{1}{4}$ E till Ten Pound Island light bears N E (anchor), or run N E by E $\frac{3}{4}$ E to the inner harbor.

Thatcher's Island Lights; latitude $42^{\circ} 32m 10s N$; longitude $70^{\circ} 47m 10s W$;

Hospital Point ; grey tower ; fixed white light, visible 13 miles ; on Hospital Point, north side of entrance to Salem and Beverly harbor.

Fort Pickering Light ; red tower ; fixed white light, visible 10 miles ; on Winter Island, north side of entrance to Salem harbor. On entering Salem harbor from near Hospital Point, get Derby Wharf light in range with Pickering light to clear the Haste Shoal ; good anchorage half a mile S W from this light, with Derby Wharf light bearing W by S.

Derby Wharf Light ; on the end of Derby Wharf, Salem upper harbor ; tower ; fixed red light, visible 9 miles.

Marblehead Light, on Marblehead Neck, south side of entrance to Marblehead, and to Salem South Channel ; white tower ; fixed white light, visible 10 miles ; good anchorage half a mile W by S from this light. To enter harbor after passing Half-Way Rock, bring this light to bear W by N $\frac{1}{2}$ N and run until the light bears S W half a mile, then run N W until the light bears W by W, then run S W $\frac{1}{2}$ W into the harbor.

Egg Rock Light ; white tower ; fixed red light, visible 12 miles ; good anchorage at Swampscot anchorage and to Broad Sound. Leave it $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles on the starboard hand on entering Broad Sound.

Minot's Ledge Light ; latitude $42^{\circ} 16m 9s N$; longitude $70^{\circ} 45m 34s W$; entrance to Boston Bay ; granite tower, natural color, 100 feet high ; fixed white light, visible 17 miles. Davis' Ledge Buoy bears E by S ; Boston Light bears N W $\frac{1}{2}$ W, 7 miles. This course must be kept good, northerly, to Bell Boat, off the north side of the Hardings Ledge (about $4\frac{1}{2}$ miles from Minot's Ledge Light). A good mark to clear the Hardings Bell Boat, when passing Minot's light, is to keep Long Island Head light (fixed white light) open to the north of the Narrows light, which is a red light.

Boston Light ; latitude $42^{\circ} 19m 39s N$; longitude $70^{\circ} 53m 25s W$; on Brewster Island, north side of entrance to main ship channel to Boston ; tower ; white flash light, flashing once every half minute, visible 17 miles. When the light bears north one half mile, run west until Long Island Light opens out south of the Narrows light, then run for it leaving the Narrows light on the starboard hand. Also, an air trumpet, giving blasts of 7 seconds followed by interval of 43 seconds.

Narrows Light ; brown house ; fixed red light, on the right hand of the Narrows, in ship channel entrance to Boston harbor. When this light bears north, run N W $\frac{1}{2}$ W until the east side of Galloup's Island bears S by W, then run N W by N until Long Island light bears W by S $\frac{1}{2}$ S.

Long Island Light ; on the N E end of Long Island and southern side of



The Governor, the Chief Justice, and other Judges of the Supreme Court, the Members of the Executive Council, Judge of the Vice-Admiralty, the Provincial Secretary, Provincial Treasurer, Commander-in-Chief, Flag Officer, and Captains, and Commanders of Ships of War on this Station for the time being.

The Court sits at any place within the Province to be appointed by three of the members; the Governor, Chief Justice, or one of the Judges of the Supreme Court, or Judge of Admiralty, being one.

PROBATE COURT for the City and County of Saint John is held on Friday at three o'clock at the Registry Office.

County Courts.

The Courts are established by 30th Victoria, cap. 10, passed June 17, 1878. The Act authorizes the appointment of one Judge for the counties of Charlotte Carleton, and Victoria; one Judge for the counties of Albert, Westmorland, and Kent; one Judge for the counties of Northumberland, Gloucester, and Restigouche; and one Judge for the counties of Kings and St. John—provided that said Court for the county of St. John shall not have or exercise any jurisdiction in any cause in which the City Court in and for the city of St. John or the Police Court in the town of Portland, in the county of St. John, have claim jurisdiction.

The Act also authorizes the appointment of a Clerk for each Court, who shall be an Attorney. The sittings of the respective courts shall be held as near the County Court House in the shire town.

The County Courts have not cognizance of any action—

- a. When the title to land is brought in question; or,
- b. In which the validity of any devise, bequest, or limitation is disputed, except as hereinafter mentioned; or,
- c. For criminal conversation or seduction; or,
- d. For breach of promise of marriage; or,
- e. Of any action against a Justice of the Peace for anything done by him in the execution of his office.

Subject to the above, the County Courts have jurisdiction, and may hold pleas in all personal actions of debt, covenant, and assumpsit, when the debt or damages do not exceed the sum of two hundred dollars; and in actions on bail bonds given to a Sheriff in any case in a County Court, whatever may be the nature or amount sought to be recovered.

Sittings of the County Courts.

The Courts hold Terms every year in each County, which Terms annually commence as follows:

Charlotte County—On the second Tuesday in the month of June; on the fourth Tuesday in March and October.

Crileton County—On the second Tuesday in March and December, and the fourth Tuesday in July.

Victoria County—On the fourth Wednesday in June, and the third Wednesday in November; and on the first Tuesday in December for return of executions only.

York County—On the second Tuesday in January, third Tuesday in March, and first Tuesday in June and October.

Ambury County—On the third Tuesday in the months of January and June, and on the Wednesday next after the second Tuesday in October.

Queen's County—On the fourth Tuesday in January and June, and on the second Tuesday in October.

King's County—On the first Tuesday in January, April, July and October.

John County—On the fourth Tuesday in the months of January, April, July and October.

Albert County—On the fourth Tuesday in June, and on the second Tuesday in November.

Westmorland County—On the first Tuesday in June, and the second Tuesday in September and December, and on the first Tuesday in March; the March term only for return of executions.

Antigonish County—On the third Tuesday in January, on the last Tuesday in March, and on the first Tuesday in July, and fourth Tuesday in October.

Northumberland County—On the fourth Tuesday in January, the first Tuesday in April, the fourth Tuesday in July, and the third Tuesday in October.

Gloucester County—On the Third Tuesday in March, and second Tuesday in July, and the first Tuesday in November.

Antigonouche County—On the fourth Tuesday in March, the third Tuesday in July, and the second Tuesday in November.

Transient Newspapers and Periodicals addressed to places in Canada, Newfoundland and United States.

All Newspapers and Periodicals other than those specified above, the postage rate will be one cent per 4 ounces in weight, which must be prepaid by postage stamp.
 Newspapers and periodicals *published not less frequently than once a month* and weighing *less than one ounce* may be posted singly, if prepaid by postage stamp at *one half cent each*.
 Newspapers published in the United Kingdom, and re-mailed by News Agents to regular subscribers, may be re-mailed **FREE**. This will apply to newspapers only, and not to Periodicals.

Miscellaneous Postal Matter.

Pamphlets, Occasional Publications, Printed Circulars, Prices Currents, Handbills, Book and Newspaper Manuscript, Printers' Proofs, Maps, Prints, Engravings, Sheet Music, Photographs, Documents, wholly or partly printed or written, such as Deeds, Insurance Policies, Militia and School Returns, or other documents of like nature, wholly or partly printed or written when posted addressed to any place in Canada or the United States, and not exceeding 4 pounds in weight, 24 inches in length, and 12 inches in breadth or depth, must be prepaid by postage stamp at the rate of one cent per four ounces in weight, and must be put up so as to admit of inspection. Such books, papers, returns, etc., must not be accompanied by any instructions or directions. Bank notices, advices of goods in transit, and personal notices are liable to letter rate, because intended for the information of a particular person.

The rate of postage on Seeds, Cuttings, Bulbs and Roots is one cent per four ounces, the weight of a package not to exceed 4 lbs.

Book Packets.

Passing between places in the Dominion of Canada or to and from Newfoundland, and not exceeding 5 lbs in weight, 2 feet in length and one foot in breadth, must be prepaid by postage stamp at the rate of one cent per four ounces. Book Packets posted for delivery in the Dominion cannot be registered.

The limit of weight of Book Packets to the United Kingdom is 5 lbs; commercial papers, 4 lbs, 6 oz. Book Packets for France, Germany, Italy, Belgium, Netherland, Portugal, the Azores, Madeira, Denmark and Switzerland, must not exceed 4 lbs, 6 oz, in weight and 24 inches in length or 12 inches in breadth.

Pattern and Sample Post.

CANADA.

Patterns and samples of merchandize, not exceeding 24 ounces in weight when posted in Canada for places in Canada or Newfoundland, must be prepaid by postage stamps at the rate of *One Cent* per 4 ounces weight, and put up in such a manner as to admit inspection. Goods sent in execution of an Order, however small the quantity may be, or articles sent by one private individual to another, which are not actually Trade Patterns or Samples, are not admissible. Registration fee 5 cents.

UNITED STATES.

Patterns and Samples of Merchandize, posted for places in the United States will continue to be subject to the special rate of 10 cents each, pre-paid by postage stamp, and must not exceed 8 ounces in weight.

The prices or rates of fare to be taken and recovered by and paid owner, driver, or other person having charge of any licensed Hackney Car shall be as follows; that is to say: for conveying one passenger from public stand to any other part of the City, or from any one part of the to any other part thereof, the sum of thirty cents, and for every additional passenger of the same household, each twenty cents; other passengers, the same household, each thirty cents. When detained at any pace by passenger, there shall be an additional fare of fifty cents every half hour tion. When agreement for hire is made by the hour, the fare shall be sum of one dollar for each hour, and in that proportion for each division the quarter of the hour. In case any driver shall be required to cross ferry of the harbour to or from Carleton, he shall, in addition to the fare, receive twenty cents additional rate for one passenger, or more than of the same household; but if not of the same household, then twenty such additional fare for each passenger; and also in addition to the shall receive the ferriage charge for himself, his carriage and horses going and returning. Progress of Agriculture.

The progress made in scientific agriculture in this country is somethingvellous, though, as it is made step by step, it may not attract the eye. For instance, the processes of handling milk, one of our most important acts, and the old methods may be said to have been revolutionized withinast ten, it may almost be said within the last five, years. We had first was called the Hardin method, and then an improvement upon that, known only as the Cooley method, both of which entirely upset our old ns in regard to the temperature of setting milk for cream; and now comes t improvement, as it seems, upon both, by which the cream is completely ated from the water of milk by the centrifugal process, in an incredibly t time,—from eight to fifteen minutes,—so that it is now possible to take milk directly from the cow and convert it into first-class butter in less than our's time.

The utility of this method can hardly be fully appreciated without consider- the power which it gives of saving all the surplus supplies of milk sent to large cities, so that hereafter none need be lost. It is claimed, also, that ure or damaged milk can be treated by this process and wholly restored, ed, and utilized for the manufacture of butter. It is, perhaps, premature y that it is capable of doing all that is claimed for it by interested parties; so far as we can see now, it is a vast step in advance of anything we have in our methods of treating milk, and bids fair to be of untold advantage e producers of milk and to the whole country. It will give facilities for lling milk economically on a large scale, at comparatively little cost, while l machines, for use in small dairies, will vastly simplify and shorten the r which this business has always involved. It must be regarded, we think, ecomparably the most important step of progress that the past year has eessed.

hen, again, a simple process has been discovered by which fruits and vege- s can be preserved for a great length of time by coating them with a eless solution by which they are practically hermetically sealed, without y manner disfiguring them. We have seen green cucumbers preserved his way for many weeks, and, when cut open, showing all the freshness and r which they had when first coated in July. In fact, no one could have r from the external or internal appearance that they were not taken quite ly from the vines. In like manner water-melons, pine-apples, potatoes, e, grapes, peaches, and other fruits, were preserved, so that they had made oyage from Boston to Liverpool and back, and still retained apparently heir original freshness. If this simple and inexpensive process should e, on further experiment, to be all that it now promises, it will be of un- advantage to the growers of fruits and vegetables for sale, to commerce, to humanity.

ese examples, with many others that might be mentioned, serve to show great and tangible progress has recently been made in agricultural indus- and we may still continue to look for greater and even more astonishing ts in the future.
