THE WAR CLOUD IS AGAIN LOWERING OVER THE FAR EASTERN HORIZON. GREAT BRITAIN AND RUSSIA Appear Likely to Come to Blows Yet Over the Question of the Open Door.

Britain's Difficulties With the Chinese Foreign Office Due to the Coercive Tactics of Russia—Britain Must Lead in Reaching an Agreement Respecting the Future of China—Threatening Situation Which Must Be Faced.

The issue has been avoided chiefly because of the natural hesitancy of the Chinese to discuss such a subject, possibly revealing irreconcilable antagonisms, but, fortunately, danger may be, it will only gather intensity by postponement.

RUSSIA POURING IN TROOPS. With 50000 Men in Port Arthur and Talien-Wan. Vancouver, B. C., March 9.—Arrivals from China by the Empress of India say the Russian Government is pouring more troops into Port Arthur and Talien-Wan, under the pretence that the force now garrisoning these places will be necessary to meet the apparent discontent of the inhabitants of Liaoning Peninsula, who have within the last two months risen against the Russian in thirteen different townships and districts. Further, no less than 9000 men have landed at Port Arthur and Talien-Wan, making the full strength of the garrisons of 15,000 men for Port Arthur and 9000 for Talien-Wan.

THE PROHIBITIONISTS ARE THROWN DOWN AT OTTAWA

What Will They Do Now That Sir Wilfrid Has Coldly Cast Them Aside?—The Premier's Letter to Ald. Spence, Who Says That the Liberals Are Not Entitled to Power Under Sir Wilfrid's Principle.

Dear Mr. Spence,—When the delegation of the Dominion Alliance waited upon the Government last fall to ask as a consequence of the plebiscite the introduction of prohibitory legislation, they based their demand upon the fact that, on the total of the vote cast, there was a majority in favor of the principle of prohibition. The exact figures of the votes recorded were not at that time accurately known, but the official figures, which we have now, show that on the question put to the electors 278,487 voted yes and 294,511 voted no.

Mr. Spence was naturally perturbed when he received the foregoing letter from the Premier of Canada. At once he called a meeting of the executive of the Dominion Alliance for Tuesday night, and until the executive speaks we have not yet made an announcement as to what action will be taken. But he spoke personally on the question. Personally Mr. Spence is of the opinion that the "people" will strongly resent the action of Sir Wilfrid and his Government. It was the Liberal Government, said, and not the prohibitionists who had proposed the plebiscite, and before taking this action the Liberal Government had made no suggestion that the side which polled the largest vote should be counted as the losers.

Alleged Fraud in Quebec. Mr. Spence further said that had evidence that the majority in Quebec had been obtained by the most outrageous ballot-stuffing and fraud, Sir Wilfrid himself had told the deputation that under the circumstances he considered the vote a very large one. Outside of Quebec, Mr. Spence also claimed, the prohibitionists had carried 20 seats out of 148 seats with a large majority.

"IT IS NOT SATISFACTORY." Says Dr. J. J. Maclearen, Chairman of the Executive of the Dominion Alliance. Dr. J. J. Maclearen, chairman of the Executive Committee of the Dominion Alliance, and another supporter of the Liberal Government, was seen by The World last night, and said that the Premier's letter was "not satisfactory." The temperance people hoped for something better. The persons who were added to speak for the Government had set the temperance people on to expect something different. The vote was sufficiently large to make the prohibitionists hope for a different answer.

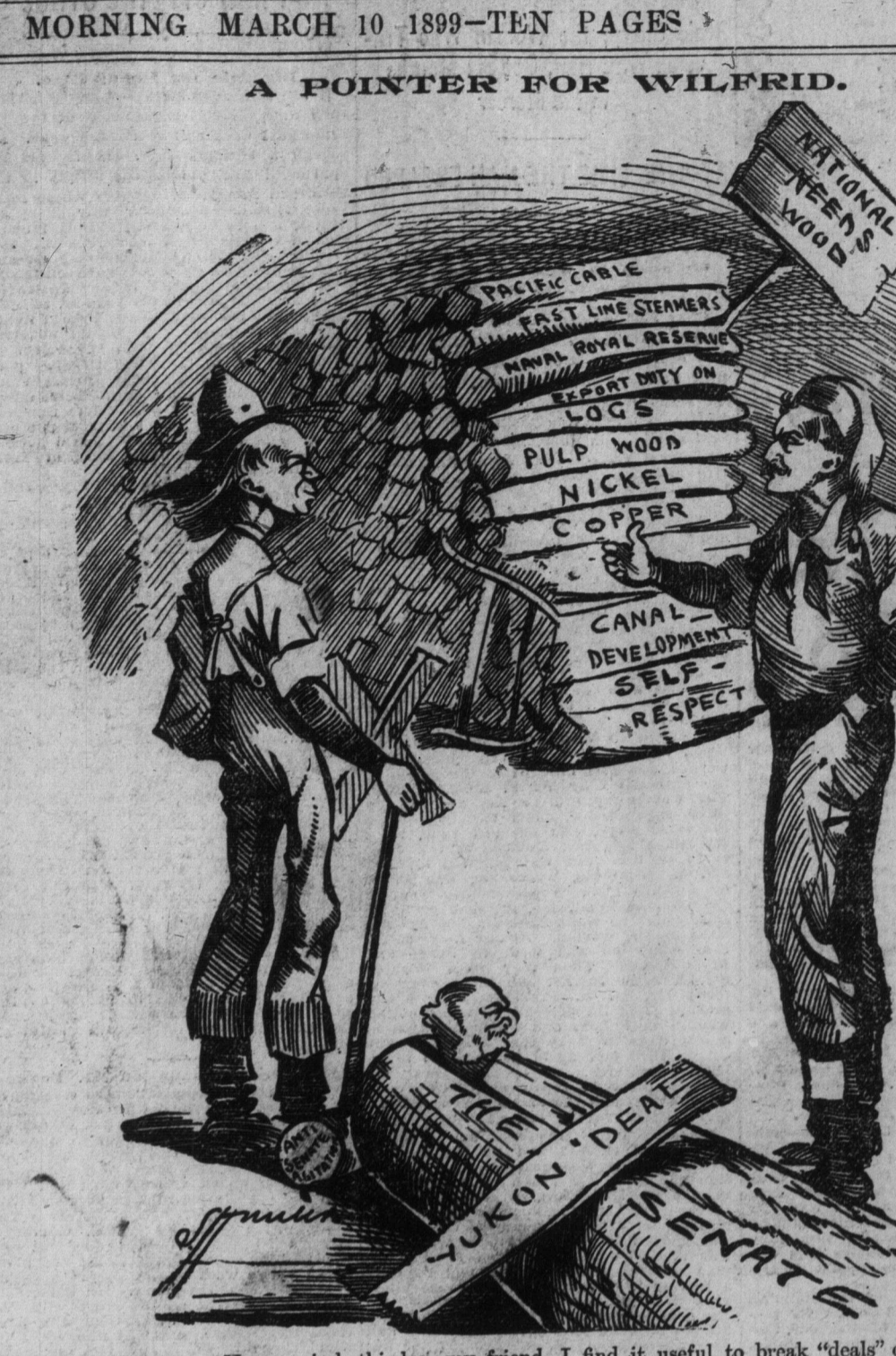

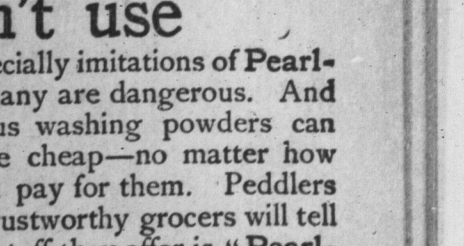
