PROHIBITION BECOMES A FOUNDING IF NOT BACKED BY POLITICAL PARTY

Rev. Dr. Swallow, Presidential Candidate, Discusses Temperance Legislation as it is in the United States.

"The first party of the two prohibition movements in the United States, while it co-operates with the other, the Anti-Saloon League, yet holds that in the final analysis we should be compelled to consider this subject as a national subject, and elect men who are pledged in advance of elections to favor the enactment of a prohibitory law and recognize that it is necessary to have a party behind the movement. It has been demonstrated that a law secured by a vote of the people without a party behind it is as a rule left as a founding on the state house steps. The Democrats say the people passed the law, the Republicans like it, and the people say they elected me. In such a case, abstention from going to turn into a constabulary force. Then when the law falls under these conditions, those opposed to it are quick to say that prohibition doesn't prohibit. It is for the same reason that the right kind of law is called for to do the chopping."

So said Rev. Dr. Swallow, who as nominee for the presidency of the United States, secured an approximate vote of 300,000. In an interview with the World on Saturday evening, in which he also expressed himself as assured of the growth of the temperance cause in this country, he said he was not sufficiently well-informed of the situation in Canada to venture a decided opinion.

Cause is Growing.

"We have evidence of development," said Dr. Swallow, "in the church resolutions being passed declaring that no political party should receive the support of its members, and in the fact that it puts itself on record against the liquor traffic, and in the action of employers of labor in insisting upon the absence of their employees. About 500,000 out of 1,200,000 states are placed under prohibition.

"Yes, it applies to employees engaged in all departments of railroad work. The New York Central has gone even further and issued a ukase that its employees should not drink on duty, and the strictness with which this later mandate is being enforced, a fact which when George Gould appeared at a directors' meeting last week, he was told that he must turn it away."

STORM BRINGS DEATH TO 5

THEIR BOAT COAST HARD HIT

Four Members of Fishing Schooner Drown While Vessel Escapes to Safety.

Norfolk, Va., Dec. 11.—The three-masted schooner, Montana, from Baltimore for Charleston, stranded late last night during a gale at Pea Island, N.C., life-saving station, fifty miles north of Cape Hatteras. Within 30 minutes the vessel was full of water and was sinking. The crew, consisting of Capt. Boyce and six men, were forced to take to the rigging, where they remained until 2 p.m. to-day, when six of the seven men were rescued by the crews of three life-saving stations. On the Lucania there were 120 men, who left Russia to escape military duty. The Lucania was delayed outside the bar 16 hours. She brought the body of Elverson R. Oberlin, O., Dec. 11.—How Mrs. Chadwick managed to secure immense loans of money from the Citizens National Bank in Toledo in the confidence of President C. B. Beckwith to United States Marshal Chandlet.

The unequivocal statement is made that the means by which Mrs. Chadwick secured the loans was by a written promise delivered into the hands of the bank that the Citizens' Bank would be made the trustee of the \$500,000 loan.

The story of how Mrs. Chadwick played the two bankers after having them once in her power, as told by Beckwith, is absorbing in the intensity of its interest.

The picture was that of an uncle of Mrs. Chadwick. This uncle was wealthy, but regularly gave the Chadwick family supplied with money.

In spite of the fact that the claim of relationship with Chadwick had been made for some time before, the notes signed by the name of Andrew Carnegie were never seen by the Oberlin bankers until the following date when they heard, Jan. 7, 1904.

The explanation for having notes from Carnegie signed for such an amount was given by Mrs. Chadwick to the Oberlin bankers.

Trustees Managed Estate. The confusion of Beckwith goes into detail of the explanation made by Mrs. Chadwick as to the manner in which the estate was being handled.

Beckwith settled the problem by taking the cash, giving his personal note instead, a note which he later took up with the cash. The directors were of the firm belief that he had been on hand last Tuesday. The midnight raid was a terrible blow for, with the arrests vanished all hopes on the part of any of the children, a girl and a boy, aged 5 and 2 years respectively, who were the only occupants of the house at the time. **Chadwick Mystery of Millions is Ended
Carnegie's Name on Paper for \$13,700,000**

On Worthless Securities Loans to a Scoundrel Made Above \$1,000,000 Were Obtained by a Shrewd Woman.

Cleveland, Dec. 11.—The last vestige of the Chadwick bubble and its mythical millions was resolved into air yesterday. Attorney A. A. Stearns, representing Herbert D. Newton of Boston, made an authoritative statement that the securities found in the mysterious package left with Iri Reynolds by Mrs. Chadwick included paper of the face value of \$12,500,000 bearing the signature of "Andrew Carnegie," which regarded as worthless. This is the key to the situation, for on the securities supposed to be in this sealed package loans of an unknown amount—certainly more than \$1,000,000—were negotiated.

The details of Mr. Stearns' statement as to the securities are as follows: Package No. 1 contained a note made payable to Cassie L. Chadwick, dated May 20, 1902, for \$5,000,000, and payable in 15 months. It was signed with the name of Andrew Carnegie.

Receipt for \$7,500,000. In package No. 1 was also a trust agreement, dated Feb. 27, 1901, and signed Andrew Carnegie, purporting to be a receipt for securities dated to Andrew Carnegie by Frederick R. Mason, deceased, uncle of Cassie L. Chadwick, the value of the securities being placed at \$7,500,000, and to be productive of income. These securities purported to be bonds of the United States Steel Corporation, the Caledonian Railway of Scotland and the Great Western Railway of England.

Package No. 2 contained a duplicate copy of the trust agreement. Package No. 3 contained a promissory note for \$1900, signed by Emily and Daniel Pine and made payable to Cassie L. Chadwick, and a mortgage securing the same.

Total Now \$13,700,000.

With this revelation it is found that the signature of Andrew Carnegie has apparently been forged on notes and other papers to the total amount of \$13,700,000. The securities held by Reynolds, together with those that were held by the Citizens' National Bank of Oberlin and have already been made public, checked the Reynolds securities have been for the last three years the principal asset of the bank. Reynolds conducted her financial system.
