THIRTEENTH ANNUAL REPORT
OF
THE MANAGERS OF
THE ORPHAN'S HOME AND FEMALE AID SOCIETY.

The Managers, on resigning their office, beg to present to the members of this Association their Report for the preceding year; and, as little has occurred *during* the period out of the ordinary course, the subjects they have to remark on must necessarily be few: but it must always be a matter of congratulation to be able to state that, in every respect, the "Home" may be said to have continued to prosper, and to be prospering.

With the exception of whooping-cough, which, for a short time, made its appearance, and proved fatal to one child, the general health of the children has been good; and, where his attendance has been needed, the Managers have much pleasure in again noticing the kindness of Dr. Ogden, the attending physician.

The number of children at present in the "Home" is eighty-six, an increase of 32 upon the number at the close of the last year: sixty-one have been admitted; thirty have gone out, twelve of whom have been apprenticed, six adopted, nine have returned to their friends, one was enticed to leave the "Home;" one, having become insane, was placed in the Asylum, and one died.

The Treasurer's accounts, now presented, shew a satisfactory state of the finances for the past year—the sum of \$3,002 83, in gross, appearing as the amount received, including the balance from last year of \$433 77, and also the sum of \$100, presented by an anonymous benefactor, through the Rev. Mr. Grasett. The necessary expenditure for the year has been \$2,478 32, shewing a balance to the credit of the "Home" of \$524 51 at the end of the year.

The Managers have much pleasure in alluding to the handsome presentation, on the part of the Orangemen, of the east wing of the building, erected exclusively at their expense; the builder's receipt in full for which—\$1,537—was formally presented to the Managers,

in the month of February last, by the Rev. Dr. Lett. The sum of \$50 has since been given by Mr. A. Fleming, as part of the balance from the building fund.

It also affords the Managers pleasure to bring under favourable notice the matron, Mrs. Holmes, whose constant care and unremitting attention to the children cannot be too highly spoken of; and the progress they have made under their daily teacher, Miss Ann Scott, is also very satisfactory.

It is, too, a subject of pleasing reflection to know how liberally the many friends of the "Home" continue to aid its wants by their constant contributions: but, particularly, the Managers would desire to express their thanks to the butchers and market gardeners of the St. Lawrence and St. Patrick's markets, whose liberality will be at once seen on referring to the Treasurer's Report, where the whole amount paid for meat throughout the year has been only \$45 89; while from seventy to ninety persons have been maintained daily in the "Home" during that time.

In conclusion, the Managers feel that they have much cause for gratitude to the Father of the Fatherless, for the large amount of good which this Institution has been enabled to effect, not only in giving the blessings of a Home, food, raiment, and education to the numerous family of otherwise destitute little ones now under its roof, but also in having rescued from wretchedness, both bodily and spiritual, those other orphans who have from time to time been inmates of the "Home;" and who are now apprenticed to respectable farmers and others through the Province, and of whom the Managers continue to receive the most satisfactory accounts.

The Managers earnestly pray that the Disposer of the hearts of men will move His people still to sustain them in their humble efforts to rescue and provide for the Protestant orphan.

The resolution, upon being seconded, was put to the meeting, and carried amid applause.

A vote of thanks was then passed to the Mayor for his services in the chair.

His Lordship the Bishop pronounced the benediction, and the meeting closed.
