Incorporated Synod of the Diocese of Ontario.

TWENTY-THIRD SESSION.

KINGSTON, June 9th, 1885.

The Twenty-Third Session of the Incorporated Synod of the Diocese of Ontario opened this day.

DIVINE SERVICE.

Morning Prayer was said at 8 A.M. in St. George's Cathedral by the Rev. A. W. Cooke, Curate.

At 10:30 A.M. the Holy Communion was celebrated by the Lord Bishop, assisted by the Archdeacon of Kingston, who read the Epistle, the Archdeacon of Ottawa, the Rev. B. B. Smith, M.A., Assistant Rector of St. George's Cathedral, and the Rev. J. W. Forsythe, M.A., Incumbent of Pembroke, by whom the Sermon was preached from 1 Timothy, iii. 15,—

"That thou mayest know how thou oughtest to behave thyself in the house of God, which is the Church of the living God, the pillar and ground of the truth."

The collection at the Offertory was in aid of the Mission Fund, and amounted to \$18.03.

At 2:30 P.M. the Lay Secretary and a Committee consisting of D. Collins, Esq., of Augusta, and James Shannon, Esq., of Kingston, were in attendance in the Synod Hall to receive and examine the certificates of the Lay Representatives.

PETITIONS AND CORRESPONDENCE.

The Rev. Rural Dean Nesbitt, in behalf of the Incumbent and parishioners of Beachburg, asked that the sanction of the Synod be given to the mortgaging of the parsonage of that Mission, the matter having been already brought before the Executive Committee and approved of by them.

Both matters were referred to a Committee on Memorials consisting of the Chancellor, Judge McDonald, and Messrs. Reynolds and Matheson.

By Rev. Canon Bleasdel—

That the present position of the Parish of Hillier in the County of Prince Edward is an anomalous one and is causing much scandal and remark in that vicinity by it, in its relations to the Church and its authorities; a committee, therefore, be appointed to enquire into the causes of this distressing state of things, with a view to provide some effectual remedy for it, if possible, and report thereon in the course of this session of Synod.

PROPOSED CANON ON AUDIT AND ACCOUNTS.

Mr. Walkem, Q.C., moved, seconded by the Clerical Secretary, the adoption of the Canon on the Keeping and Auditing of the Synod Accounts, as printed on pp. 2156-7, Journal of 21st Session.

The hour of one o'clock having arrived, the Synod adjourned to 3 P.M.

Afternoon Session.

The Synod re-assembled at 3 P.M.

The discussion of the proposed Canon on Keeping and Auditing of the Synod Accounts was resumed.

The Canon was considered clause by clause, and after discussion and some slight amendment was carried in the following form:—

CANON .—ON THE KEEPING AND AUDITING OF THE SYNOD ACCOUNTS.

Whereas it is expedient and necessary to provide regulations for the keeping and auditing of the accounts connected with the Funds of the Synod of this Diocese, be it enacted as follows:—

1. The accounts of the Synod shall be kept and audited under the direction and supervision of a Committee, to be called the Audit and Accounts Committee, which shall be composed of two Laymen and one Clergyman, members of the Synod, and shall be elected at each annual meeting of Synod, after the adoption of the report of the Audit and Accounts Committee.
2. It shall be the duty of this Committee, as occasion may require, to frame rules respecting the keeping of the books and accounts by the officer charged with that duty, which rules shall, before coming into force, be submitted to and approved of by the Executive Committee.
3. It shall be the duty of the said Committee to frame rules respecting the acknowledgement of moneys received, the precautions to be taken to insure an effective audit of the accounts, and the mode in which the audit shall be conducted, which rules shall, before coming into force, be submitted to and approved of by the Executive Committee.
4. It shall be the duty of the said Committee to receive the report of the Auditors to be appointed as hereinafter provided, to examine the same and the statements submitted therewith, and to examine all the securities belonging to the Synod, prior to the annual meeting thereof, and compare the same with the said statements, and to submit the said Auditors' Report, together with their own report on such examinations, and on the state of the accounts

generally, to the Synod at its annual meeting. The said Report shall be printed and ready for distribution at the opening of the Synod.

5. Full statements of the transactions in connection with each Fund during the past year, with list of the securities belonging thereto, and a balance sheet, shall be submitted by the Clerical Secretary to the Auditors immediately after the close of each financial year.

6. The accounts of the Synod shall be audited annually by two skilled accountants, who shall be appointed annually by the Executive Committee at their first meeting after the meeting of Synod. They shall make a thorough examination of the accounts, and submit their report and statement to the Chairman of the Audit and Accounts Committee within three weeks after the close of the financial year.

7. No Auditor shall be eligible for more than two years in succession.

8. Each Auditor shall receive for his services the sum of \$50 per annum, or such sum as the Executive Committee may from time to time determine, and it shall be his duty to attend the meeting of the Audit and Accounts Committee, and the meeting of Synod while the Auditors' report is under discussion.

9. Two members of the Audit and Accounts Committee shall be a quorum for all purposes.

10. Each fiscal year shall terminate on the 30th day of April, and the accounts, statements and audit shall be made up to and cover that day, and all the Synod accounts shall be closed and balanced up to that date.

11. The existing Canon XXIV on Audit, and all other provisions of the several Canons inconsistent herewith, are hereby repealed.

AMENDMENTS OF THE CONSTITUTION.

Mr. Walkem moved, seconded by the Clerical Secretary, the adoption of the Amendments of the Constitution, printed on pp. 2157-8, Journal of 21st Session.

The amendments were adopted and embodied in a Canon as follows :

CANON .—TO AMEND SECTIONS 10 AND 11 OF THE CONSTITUTION.

1. That the following be substituted for the second paragraph of Section 10 of the Constitution :—

That all moneys payable to the Synod shall be paid to the Clerical Secretary or other officer for the time being authorized by the Synod to receive the same, and shall be acknowledged in such manner as may be prescribed by the regulations in force from time to time with reference thereto.

2. That in Section 10 of the Constitution the following shall be substituted for the words "the Clerical Secretary" :—

An Audit and Accounts Committee, as prescribed in the Regulations for the Accounts."

3. That in the Constitution the following words be added after the word "therefor" :—

That the banking of the Synod be conducted by "The Incorporated Bank of the Synod," belonging to each of the Dioceses, and shall be distinguished from the accounts of the Synod by the word "Diocesan."

That the banking account of the said Synod shall be kept in the name of "The Incorporated Synod of the Diocese of Ontario," and the accounts belonging to each Fund shall be kept separate and distinct in the bank, and shall be distinguished by the name of the Fund to which they respectively belong.

CANONS OF SYNOD.

Moved by the Rev. A. Jarvis, seconded by Mr. Reynolds,

That the Chancellor and Secretaries be instructed to have printed a corrected edition of 500 copies of the Canons of the Diocese of Ontario, with all Acts of Parliament bearing upon the affairs of the Diocese, together with all resolutions of Synod now in force.

That copies of the same be kept for sale at the Synod office, but that every Clergyman shall receive a copy on his first presentation to the Cure of souls in this Diocese.—*Carried.*

APPOINTMENT AND REMOVAL OF CLERGYMEN.

Mr. Walkem's motion respecting the appointment and removal of clergymen was allowed to stand over until to-morrow.

ST. GEORGE'S CATHEDRAL.

Moved by the Rev. Rural Dean Lewis,

That in the event of a vacancy in the Rectory of St. George's, Kingston, the appointment shall be vested in the Synod of the Diocese, and it shall appoint thereto the Bishop of the Diocese, provided he is willing to contribute \$500 for the support of a competent Curate for the same, and hand over to Trustees appointed by the Synod Episcopal Fund securities sufficient to yield a yearly interest of \$2,000 for the support of a Bishop, who shall reside in Ottawa.

There being no seconder, the motion was declared *lost*.

COMMITTEE ON PRINTING.

That the Lord Bishop be requested to appoint a Standing Committee of this Synod on Printing.—*Carried.*

CLERGY SUPERANNUATION FUND.

The Archdeacon of Kingston moved the adoption of the Canon on the Clergy Superannuation Fund as printed on pp. 55-6, Journal of 22d Session.

The Canon was considered clause by clause.

The preamble and section 1 were *carried*.

In amendment to Section 2, it was moved by the Rev. H. Pollard, seconded by the Rev. W. B. Carey,

That the words "Advent Sunday" be substituted for the words "the 13th Sunday after Trinity" in Clause 2.—*Lost.*

Clause 2 was then *carried* in the following form:—

2. That this Fund be constituted by sums received from the following sources, viz.:—1st. An annual collection to be made on the Thirteenth Sunday after Trinity, or on one of the two following Sundays; 2nd. Benefactions and bequests; and 3rd. Subscriptions of the Clergy as hereinafter described.

After some discussion, Section 3 was amended and *carried* in the form following:—

3. This Fund shall be controlled and managed by a Committee consisting of the Bishop and four Clerical and four Lay members of the Synod to be appointed annually by the Bishop.

In amendment to Section 4, it was moved by Mr. Reynolds, seconded by the Rev. E. P. Crawford,

That Section 4 be amended thus:—

4. Any Clergyman who has served 25 years in this Diocese, is in good standing, and has complied with the requirements of this Canon, and who has also reached the age of 65 years, shall be entitled to claim superannuation.—*Carried.*

Section 5 was amended and *carried* as follows:

5. Any clergyman of this Diocese incapacitated by age or infirmity, and unable by reason of such age or infirmity to minister beneficially to the Church, shall be placed on the list of Superannuated Clergy at the discretion of the Committee.

The Superannuation allowance made to any Clergyman under this Canon shall be in proportion to his length of service in the Diocese, due regard being had to the amount and condition of the Fund; such allowance not to exceed the sum of \$200 per annum for a clergyman in receipt of an annuity from the Clergy Trust Fund, and \$400 per annum for a clergyman not receiving such annuity.

7. No Clergyman shall be placed on the Superannuated list unless he shall have paid annually before the 30th day of April in each year the sums on the following scale, according to the age at which he entered upon service in this Diocese under license from the Lord Bishop, the first payment to be made before the 30th day of April next after this Canon shall have come into force, or after the date of his being licensed by the Lord Bishop as a Clergyman of the Diocese. Provided that all Clergymen who were licensed or appointed in the Diocese at its formation shall pay \$5 annually.

By his departure the Domestic and Foreign Missionary Society suffers the loss of a faithful member.

The Reverend A. J. O'Loughlin received Holy Orders late in life, but was spared for many years to do good work for the Church in several Parishes,—but more especially in North Gower, of which he was Rector at the time of his death.

Mr. W. T. Benson, M.P., was a loyal and liberal member of the Church, whose loss will be felt in the Diocese as a whole, but more particularly in the Parish of Edwardsburg, in which he resided, and where his sudden death causes a blank which cannot be readily filled.

COMMITTEE MEETINGS.

CANON .—ON COMMITTEE MEETINGS.

Whereas the Canon on the Keeping and Auditing of the Synod Accounts provides that the auditing of the Synod Books of Account shall be completed within three weeks after the close of the Synod's financial year on April 30th: whereas the meetings of the Committees of Synod during that period seriously conflicts with the duties of the Clerical Secretary in respect of matters pertaining to the said Audit: and whereas it is expedient and desirable that the statements submitted to the Committees at their regular meetings should be the audited statements of the previous half-year:

Be it therefore enacted—

1. The regular meetings of the Standing Committees of Synod shall be held half-yearly in the months of May and November, during the week commencing on the Sunday which falls on, or next after, the eighteenth day of each of those months respectively.

2. The Board of Diocesan Missions shall meet at 10 A.M. on Wednesday of the said week, and shall have precedence over other Committees until its labours are concluded.

3. The other Committees shall meet during the said week according to a programme to be prepared by the Clerical Secretary, subject to such postponements as may be rendered necessary by the precedence granted to the Board of Diocesan Missions.

4. The mover of the resolution with reference to which any Provisional Committee has been appointed shall be deemed to be the Chairman of such Committee, unless and until other provision be made, either in the resolution itself, or by the Lord Bishop, or by the said Committee.

5. A special meeting of any Committee of Synod may be summoned by the Lord Bishop at his discretion, at such time and place as his Lordship shall direct.

6. Those provisions of the several Canons of the Synod which are inconsistent with the enactments of this Canon are hereby repealed.

PATRONAGE OF RECTORIES, ETC.

The Rev. Rural Dean Lewis withdrew the following motion of which he had given notice to the Executive Committee :—

4. The Registrar is and shall be the proper custodian of all grants, conveyances, wills, or parts thereof in any way relating to land or property granted, conveyed or devised for the benefit or use of the Church of England in this Diocese. He is also, and shall continue to be, the proper custodian of all completed or filled up parish Registers. He is and, so far as may be, shall be the historiographer of the Diocese, and the proper custodian of the archives of the Diocese and of the several parishes therein.

5. It shall be the duty of all Rectors, Incumbents, Churchwardens, Trustees, or other persons having legal custody of any grants, conveyances, or wills, or parts thereof in any way relating to land or property granted, conveyed, or devised for the benefit of the Church of England in this Diocese, to transmit the same to the Registrar, to be by him taken in charge as the proper custodian thereof, and to be placed in the Diocesan vault for proper and safe keeping.

6. It shall be the duty of the Registrar to enter in the books so provided the date of every such grant, conveyance, or will, and the names of the grantors or testators, and of the grantee or devisee; also, a short description of the property, and a memorandum of the trust or object of the grant or devise.

7. The Registrar shall from time to time prepare under the direction of the Bishop, the Licenses, Induction Mandates, and Letters of Orders, from the Bishop to Clergymen appointed to parishes, and keep a correct record of the same, and on request issue such License, Induction Mandate, or Letter of Orders, to the Clergyman in whose favor the same is made out, and for so doing the Registrar shall be entitled to charge the following fees, viz:

For License	\$2.00.
Induction Mandate	8.00.
Letter of Orders for Deacons	4.00.
Letter of Orders for Priests	6.00.

The License, Induction Mandate, and Letter of Orders so granted shall be the official License, Induction Mandate, and Letter of Orders. But this section shall not take effect till after the decease or resignation of the Rev. Canon Bleasdel, Bishop's Chaplain.

8. The Registrar shall keep a book (to be provided for him by the Synod) in which he shall enter the official acts of Synod requiring registration, and of the several Dignitaries and Clergy, and of the officers of Synod; also, a short description of the boundaries of the Diocese and of the several Arch-deaconries, Rural Deaneries and Parishes therein; also, a list of Clergy of the Diocese from time to time, showing such changes as are made therein and giving a statement of the respective dates of the admission of the said Clergy into their different Orders, and a list of the different parishes, missions, or stations in which they may have served.

9. It shall be the duty of all Rectors, Incumbents, and Churchwardens from time to time to transmit to the Registrar all Parish Registers which have been completed or filled up, and the Registrar on receiving the same shall deposit the same in the Synod vault, and shall duly acknowledge the receipt of such Registers.

10. It shall be the duty of the Registrar from time to time, on application being made therefor, to grant under his hand and the seal of the Diocese a Certificate of the entries of Births, Deaths, or Marriages entered in such Parish Registers or any of them, and for every such certificate he shall be entitled to charge and receive a fee of fifty cents, and such certificate shall be *prima facie* evidence of the fact therein stated or set forth.

11. Canon IX, entitled "For the Registry and Safe Custody of all Deeds Relative to Church Property," is hereby repealed.

AMENDED CANON ON DISCIPLINE.

The Chancellor moved the confirmation of the following Canon, to be numbered Canon XXXIX:—

Canon XXXIX.—To Amend Canon VIII (For the better enforcing Discipline in the Church and for the Administration of the Diocesan Court).

I.—That all that portion of Section 2, down to and including the words "so offended," be struck out, and the following words substituted:

"2. Every Priest and Deacon holding the License, or any office or charge, under the jurisdiction of the Lord Bishop of the Diocese of Ontario, shall be liable to trial and punishment, as hereinafter provided, for any crime or immorality; for drunkenness, profane swearing, or any other scandalous, licentious, or disorderly conduct; for any wrongdoing or wilful neglect in the discharge of the duties of any office or position of trust to which he may have been appointed by the Lord Bishop or Synod; for discontinuing the exercise of his Ministerial office without lawful cause or leave of the Lord Bishop; for ceasing, without permission of the Lord Bishop, to perform service in or at the church or churches within the Parish, Mission, or charge to which he shall have been appointed; for exercising any lay profession or occupation unconnected with his sacred calling, without the sanction of the Lord Bishop; for the disuse, after notice from the Lord Bishop, of Public Worship or of the Holy Eucharist according to the offices of the Church; for the infringement, after notice from the Lord Bishop, of the rubrics of the Book of Common Prayer; for schism, or separating himself from the Communion of the Church; for heresy, or teaching or maintaining heretical doctrines, or for teaching or maintaining doctrines contrary to those of the Church, such teaching or maintaining being by way of writing or printing, preaching or public teaching, or circulating books containing such doctrine; for holding service in any other clergyman's church or parish, mission or charge, without such clergyman's consent; for permitting unauthorized persons to officiate in the church; for non-residence without leave of the Lord Bishop; for officiating at the services of religious bodies not in Communion with the Church of England; for any act which involves a breach of his Ordination Vows; for any violation of the provisions of the Statutes constituting the Synod, or of the Constitution of the Synod, or of any of the Canons, Rules, Regulations, and Resolutions of the Synod; for incapacity or neglect in the discharge of his parochial duties, whereby his usefulness in his parish or mission shall appear to be gone; or concerning whom there may exist scandal or evil report."

II.—That Section 3 be amended by striking out the words "Upon oath, or upon solemn affirmation, in cases where an affirmation or declaration is allowed by law instead of an oath, which oath, or affirmation, or declaration

respectively," and to insert in place thereof the words, "Under the declaration allowed by law which."

III.—That Section 15 be repealed and the following Section substituted:

" 15. That every witness who shall be examined in pursuance of this Canon shall give his or her evidence upon solemn declaration, as provided for by 'An Act for the Suppression of Voluntary and Extra-judicial Oaths.' "

Moved in amendment by the Rev. Rural Dean Carey, seconded by the Rev. Rural Dean Nesbitt,

That the confirmation of the amended Canon on Discipline be postponed to next Synod.—*Lost*.

SURPLUS COMMUTATION FUND.

On motion of the Chancellor, the following Canon was confirmed, and numbered Canon XL:—

CANON XL.—TO AMEND CANON XXX (SURPLUS COMMUTATION FUND).

That all the words after the word "Clergymen" in Section 2 of Canon XXX be struck out, and the following words inserted in lieu thereof:—"Who have been, or shall be hereafter, admitted into the Diocese since the aforesaid election, their seniority shall be regulated by the date of their first appointment. And should a clergyman have ceased to do duty within the Diocese, not being superannuated or having leave of absence from the Lord Bishop, yet continuing to reside therein, then on his resuming his clerical duties within the Diocese, under the authority or license of the Lord Bishop, the time during which he shall have ceased to do duty therein shall be deducted from his seniority. But in case of his having left the Diocese under a *bene decessit*, or without leave of absence, then, should the Lord Bishop again admit him into the Diocese, he shall be placed at the foot of the list."

FEMALE VOTERS.

Whereas there is no provision for the Clergy of this Diocese, should they become incapacitated by illness, age, or infirmity, be it therefore enacted:—

1. That a Fund be established to be designated the "Clergy Superannuation Fund."
2. That this Fund be constituted by sums received from the following sources, viz.:—1st. An annual collection to be made on the Thirteenth Sunday after Trinity, or on one of the two following Sundays; 2nd. Benefactions and bequests; and 3rd. Subscriptions of the Clergy as hereinafter described.
3. This Fund shall be controlled and managed by a Committee consisting of the Bishop and four Clerical and four Lay members of the Synod to be appointed annually by the Bishop.
4. Any Clergyman who has served 25 years in this Diocese, is in good standing, and has complied with the requirements of this Canon, and who has also reached the age of 65 years, shall be entitled to claim superannuation.
5. Any Clergyman of this Diocese incapacitated by age or infirmity, and unable by reason of such age or infirmity to minister beneficially to the Church, shall be placed on the list of Superannuated Clergy at the discretion of the Committee.
6. The Superannuation allowance made to any Clergyman under this Canon shall be in proportion to his length of service in the Diocese, due regard being had to the amount and condition of the Fund; such allowance not to exceed the sum of \$200 per annum for a Clergyman in receipt of an annuity

from the Clergy Trust Fund, and \$400 per annum for a Clergyman not receiving such annuity.

7. No Clergyman shall be placed on the Superannuated list unless he shall have paid annually before the 30th day of April in each year the sums on the following scale, according to the age at which he entered upon service in this Diocese under license from the Lord Bishop, the first payment to be made before the 30th day of April next after this Canon shall have come into force, or after the date of his being licensed by the Lord Bishop as a Clergyman of the Diocese. Provided that all Clergymen who were licensed or appointed in the Diocese at its formation shall pay \$5 annually.

2.—A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF MANAGEMENT OF THE DOMESTIC AND
FOREIGN MISSIONARY SOCIETY OF THE CHURCH OF ENGLAND
IN CANADA.

It was moved by Rev. Charles Hamilton, seconded by Hon. J. B. Plumb, That this Board do earnestly and respectfully request the Bishops to lay before their Synods at their approaching sessions a statement in reference to

(1st) The action of the Provincial Synod in creating the D. & F. M. S. of the Church of England in Canada and its Board of Management consisting of all the Bishops and of Clergymen and Laymen nominated by each Diocesan Synod.

(2d) The aim of the Provincial Synod in making this Society coextensive with the Church of England in Canada, so that every individual might feel that as a member of the Church he was a member of this Society and bound to promote by his prayers, his personal efforts, and his offerings, the missionary work of the Church, both in the Domestic and Foreign field.

(3d) The method adopted by the Board of Management in issuing annually at Epiphany a circular bearing upon Foreign Missions, and at Ascension-tide a circular bearing upon Domestic Missions, and in asking for an annual offering from each individual for each of these important objects.

(4th) The duty of every Clergyman to read the circular letters at the times

appointed, and to support them by sermons or addresses or personal efforts, and to afford their congregations, however feeble in point of numbers or wealth, the opportunity of making their offering and having it forwarded promptly through the Diocesan Treasurers to the Treasurer of the Board of Management.

(5th) The importance of prompt action on the part of the Clergy with reference to the circulating of the appeals both at Epiphany and at Ascensiontide in order that they may not conflict with appeals for Diocesan or Parochial purposes, and that the accounts of the Treasurer, which are closed annually on June 30th, may contain a full return from all the Dioceses and every congregation for each year.

(6th) The responsibility assumed by any Clergyman who undertakes to exercise his own discretion as to the best time for presenting these appeals instead of acting at the season adopted after a careful consideration of all the circumstances by the Board of Management on which all the Dioceses are represented.

(7th) The advantage which will be found to attend the appropriation and division of the offerings, whether for Foreign or Domestic Missions, by the Board of Management, who have the whole field in each case with all the latest information distinctly and fully before them, and who are accordingly in a better position to judge of the needs of each than the individual who may appropriate his offering simply from feeling or preference and not from a careful comparison of all the various circumstances which cannot be known to him.

(8th) The determination of the Board of Management in every case to apply the offerings of each congregation and of every individual as they may direct, although they would urge on *all* the advantage of entrusting the division and appropriation of their offerings to the Board, who are in a position to know thoroughly and weigh accurately the comparative needs and claims of all the Domestic and Foreign Missions.—*Carried.*

Book for the registration of the Official Acts of the Bishop, the Dignitaries, Clergy, and Officers of the Synod; (2) Books for the registration of Conveyances, &c., to and from the existing Parishes of the Diocese, with space for entering, in order, any additional new Parishes which may be created for years to come; (3) A Book for describing the boundaries of the Diocese, Archdeaconries, Rural Deaneries, and Parishes.

A circular letter was forwarded to the Clergy informing them of my appointment, and requesting them to forward to me the dates of their orders and licenses, and also any Deeds of Church property in their possession. A very general response was made to this request, but there are still some of the Clergy who have not taken any notice of it.

The Register of the Clergy is prefaced by an account of the Consecration of the Lord Bishop of Ontario, and a copy of the Patent appointing him—the last Patent issued by the Crown of England for the appointment of a Bishop elected in any self-governing colony. After this, space has been left for the registration of the Consecration of other Bishops in Canada, Confirmations by the Bishop, &c. Space has also been reserved for the appointment, resignation, or death of Deans, the Cathedral Chapter, the Chancellor, and Registrar, and a list of the Clergy who were in the Diocese at its formation, arranged alphabetically, as well as of those who were ordained by the Bishop, or received from other Dioceses—the latter according to seniority.

This Clergy List, it is believed, will be found very interesting, and as it will be laid on the table during the meeting of Synod, I would respectfully request the members of Synod to examine it, to see not only that their own record is correct, but that the record of other Clergy, who may either have left the Diocese or died, is also accurately stated. Any information which can be furnished by either Clergy or Laity regarding these matters will be thankfully received.

The Parish Register consists of three volumes, arranged alphabetically, and with sufficient space for new Parishes to be inserted for many years to come. It is proposed to give a brief sketch of the Parish, where this can be procured, as well as a list of the Churches and Burial grounds, with dates of Consecration; particulars regarding lands conveyed to and from the Parish authorities, or relating to their property; lists of Confirmations, and other statistics of general importance. In the Diocesan Vault a pigeon hole for each Parish, properly labelled, has been opened, and in these the Deeds and Papers belonging to each Parish have been placed, and can easily be found in a few minutes.

In his address to the Synod, at its last meeting, His Lordship the Bishop referred at some length to the importance of the Deeds of Church property being forwarded to the Registrar for safe keeping, and stating that in future he should require "from every Rector, Incumbent, and Missionary of the Diocese, a certificate from the Registrar that the Parish Registers (not in use) have been deposited with him" before he would accept any resignation

of a Parish or Mission. The result of this statement was the depositing of Registers from the Parishes of Wolfe Island, Carleton Place, St. Paul's Church, Fredericksburg, Adolphustown, Osgoode, Metcalfe and Cumberland, North Gower and Finch, St. Alban's Church, Ottawa, Napanee, Barriefield, and Bath.

Printed receipts were given for these books, while a printed label was placed on the outside of each book, stating the name of the Parish of which it is the Register, and the dates covered by it, while an entry of its receipt has been made in the Diocesan Parish Register, under the proper heading.

A printed form of certificate has been procured for the purpose of furnishing extracts from the Parish Registers to parties who may require them.

Nothing has yet been done with the Book procured for the purpose of preserving a record of the boundaries of the Parishes, &c., as my spare time has been more usefully employed in working up the statistics of the Diocese, which have been nearly brought down to the present time. When this is completed a beginning can be made upon the last named book, which, however, is not of any pressing importance. I am glad to find that the duties of the Registrar are likely to be accurately defined, Mr. James Reynolds, of Brockville, having given notice of a Canon for that purpose.

In conclusion, I may say that I owe much of the success which, I believe, has attended my efforts in arranging a system of registration for the Clergy and Parishes, to the able and valued advice and assistance of Dr. Henderson, Q.C., Chancellor, and of the Rev. Albert Spencer, Clerical Secretary, of the Diocese of Ontario.

2.—REPORT OF SEE HOUSE COMMITTEE.

The Committee appointed by the Synod beg leave to report:—

That no further progress has been made since last Synod in obtaining subscriptions for the erection or purchase of a See House. The amount already promised stands at \$2,500.

The Committee regret that this matter has not received the attention it merits. No one denies the fact that it is time some suitable residence was provided for the Bishop of the Diocese. When it is borne in mind that the Diocese is now in its 25th year, it does not seem creditable to its Churchmen that no attempt has been made to put the Diocese in the same position as the other Dioceses of Canada in this respect.

The Committee also regret that the recommendation of the Synod that the Bishop's house rent should be paid until a See House was procured, has not been complied with; and this omission, after the Bishop's appeal for assistance, owing to the smallness of his income, and its inadequacy, made

3.—REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON THE DIVISION OF THE DIOCESE.

To the Synod of Ontario :

The Committee on the division of the Diocese report the following scheme :—

1. That the present Episcopal Fund of the Diocese of Ontario be divided in the following proportions, viz: Two thirds to remain with the Diocese of Ontario, as hereafter to be constituted, and one-third to go to the proposed Diocese of Ottawa.

2. That the parts which are to constitute the new Dioceses be respectively required to raise, each, the sum of \$20,000, so that the new Diocese of Ontario shall have an Episcopal Capital Fund of \$61,000, and the new Diocese of Ottawa shall have a minimum Capital of \$40,000.

3. The Committee would also recommend, that the Bishop be requested to visit England, and make an appeal to the Church Societies, and otherwise, on behalf of the new Sees.

4. The Committee also suggest, as a means of raising funds locally, that the confirmation candidates of the Diocese be invited to contribute a minimum sum of 50 cents each, to be capitalized, for the benefit of the Fund, until the amount required be collected.

5. That a private appeal be sent to every adult member of the Church, together with an enclosed envelope, requesting a contribution of, at least, \$1 toward the Episcopal Fund.

I.—REPORT OF THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE.

2.—REPORT OF THE CLERGY TRUST FUND COMMITTEE.

The Clergy Trust Fund Committee beg leave to report that the securities of this Fund on the 30th of April, 1885, amounted to a capital sum of \$261,550, producing income to the amount of \$15,339.70. The charges against the Fund for the payment of annuities, expenses, and refund to capital, leave an estimated surplus of \$27.22. There were also at that date arrears of interest amounting to the sum of \$998.45.

3.—REPORT OF THE BOARD OF FOREIGN MISSIONS.

The Board of Foreign Missions have gratefully to record an increasing interest in the Church's missionary work outside the borders of the Diocese. The receipts in contributions from the eight Rural Deaneries, for the year ended April 30, 1885, have been \$2,374.48, comparing favorably with \$2,106.47 for the previous year. It is due to the Deanery of Carleton to state that the most gratifying increase of liberality has been shown by the members of the Church within this district, the contributions being raised from \$362.58 in 1884 to \$561.31 in 1885. But the Deanery of Frontenac still heads the list, contributing more than one-fourth of the whole amount collected. Appended is a statement of the receipts and appropriations for the year.

A WOMAN'S AUXILIARY ASSOCIATION.

The Bishops of Toronto, Algoma, Huron, with the elect (and since then consecrated) Bishop of Niagara, as well as our own Diocesan, cordially welcomed the formation of this organization, and it has been started under the full sanction of the Provincial Board. It is believed that the fact of securing the active sympathy and co-operation of our Christian women throughout the Diocese in the Church's world-wide missionary cause, will bring a blessing on all our work at home as well as abroad, tending to develop and foster a deeper personal love to the Saviour of sinners, and a deeper personal interest in all that promotes the maintenance and extension of His Kingdom. The Board would earnestly recommend to the favorable consideration of the Clergy the formation of branches of the Woman's Auxiliary in every parish. There can be little doubt that the establishment of such branches throughout the Diocese would constitute a bond of union between the Christ-loving women everywhere, who, we may be assured, cannot ever be indifferent to the honour and prosperity of the Church at home, while laboring for the spread of her manifold blessings outside our own borders.

The constitution of the *Woman's Auxiliary* has been drawn up by a Committee in Ottawa and approved by the Lord Bishop of the Diocese after consultation with a sub-Committee of the Board of Management of the D. & F. M. S., on whose report the Board authorized certain ladies to take the necessary steps for the formation of auxiliary organizations for the Ecclesiastical Province as well as for the Diocese. A copy of this Constitution, as it regards the Diocese, is herewith appended. It will be seen that it is the intention of the Woman's Auxiliary to prosecute their good work in entire harmony with our Diocesan Board, and we would now respectfully request a formal Synodical sanction for this important part of our Church's machinery.

It is scarcely necessary to remind the members of Synod that henceforth our responsibilities to the *Domestic Missions* of the Church of England, i.e., those in Algoma and the Northwest, must be immeasurably increased. Whether the late deplorable troubles have arisen in consequence of past remissness is not for us to say. But it is certain, that as the result of the ruin and devastation caused by the rebellion, from the presence of a large military force scattered about various parts of the Northwest, and from the inability of settlers and soldiers to provide for the support of Clergymen—now more than ever needed—righteous claims will be made on the Church in older Canada to give, even out of her penury, those spiritual consolations and hallowed means of grace, which her children have a right to expect and will gratefully welcome.

It seems, therefore, our bounden duty to avail ourselves of every agency to enable the Church to meet this emergency; and most providentially has this *Woman's Auxiliary* been formed just at a time when its aid was most required. Having its birth in the capital of the Dominion and in our own Diocese, and under the highest sanction, it may well claim all the support and encouragement the Synod can bestow.

To one other matter your Board would briefly call the attention of the Synod. The Day of Intercession on behalf of the Church's missionary cause has for some years past been one of the Rogation Days, or Ascension Day, and the Offertory collections made on that day have been a fruitful source of revenue. The recent action of the Provincial Synod in requesting a special collection on the Sunday after Ascension Day (the Sunday before Whitsunday when by our Diocesan Canon we have to make a special collection for our own Mission Fund), manifestly is injurious to all three claims. And, as a matter of fact, the Ascensiontide Day of general intercession has been universally found, for many reasons, inconvenient. So much so that the Convocations in England have decided to revert to December, and are now in communication through the Archbishop of Canterbury with the Prelates of the Church in the United States, to invite concurrence in the observance of some day such as the Eve of Advent Sunday or St. Thomas' Festival. It is probable that before the next meeting of our Synod, the assent of all Churches in communion with the Church of England will have been obtained to the observance of a day near the close of the year, and we would remind our Clerical and Lay brethren that our obligation as a Diocese to Algoma, to say nothing of the claims of Christ's missionary work elsewhere, may very properly be met by the offerings of our people on a day which, both as a duty and a privilege, should be observed by all who believe in Him who gave the command, to "pray to the Lord of the harvest," and promised that when we ask in His name, our Heavenly Father will grant His children's request.

THE WOMAN'S AUXILIARY TO THE DOMESTIC AND FOREIGN MISSIONARY SOCIETY.

Diocesan Constitution.

1.—This Association shall be called "The ——— Diocesan Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Domestic and Foreign Missionary Society of the Church of England in Canada."

2.—The objects of this Association shall be: To awaken missionary zeal among the churchwomen in the Diocese; to diffuse missionary intelligence; to raise money for missionary objects; and to encourage the formation of Parochial Branches throughout the Diocese.

3.—The officers of the Diocesan Branch shall consist of a President (who shall be the wife of the Bishop of the Diocese), Vice-Presidents (who shall be the Presidents of the various local branches), a Treasurer, a Recording and a Corresponding Secretary, and a Board of Management, consisting of ——— members, to be nominated by the Bishop of the Diocese.

8.—A special meeting of the Diocesan Board may be called at any time by the President upon the request of any three members of the Board.

9.—This constitution may be changed at any regular meeting of the Board by a vote of two-thirds of the members present, notice in writing having been given at a previous meeting.

By-Laws.

1.—The President, or one of the Vice-Presidents, shall preside at all meetings. She shall take the general supervision of the Parochial Branches, and urge the formation of such branches in all parishes of the Diocese.

2.—The Corresponding Secretary shall conduct all the correspondence of the Diocesan Branch, and furnish the Parochial Branches with all possible intelligence concerning the work of Domestic and Foreign Missions.

3.—The Recording Secretary shall give notice of all meetings; record the proceedings of such meetings of the Branch, and prepare an Annual Report.

4.—The Treasurer shall receive all subscriptions and offerings, and forward to the Treasurer of the Woman's Auxiliary such amounts, and for such purposes as may be determined by the Board.

4.—REPORT OF THE MISSION BOARD.

The Mission Board begs to present the following Report for the year ended April 30th, 1885:—

The Board has much pleasure in stating that its meetings have been well attended by the Clerical and Lay members, and that the interest taken by them in the direction and management of the funds at their disposal continues unabated.

For the past four years the Board has been gradually, and in many instances entirely, withdrawing grants from the older Missions which were considered able to maintain their own work, believing that such grants made to Missions with a prosperous and well-to-do population had a tendency to enervate them and make them non-selfreliant, when they were known to be as well able to support their own Church work as city and town Parishes. This action has been accepted in almost all cases cheerfully by the Missions affected, and in consequence the Board has been enabled to report from year to year, since 1880, Missions becoming self-sustaining, namely, Almonte, Bell's Corners, Camden East, Carleton Place, Hawkesbury, Huntley, Merrickville, Newboro, N. Gower, Osnabruck, Pakenham, Roslyn, Oxford Mills, Vankleek Hill, Pembroke, Arnprior.—16.

This satisfactory progress has allowed the Mission Fund to be spent on its more legitimate work of—1st, assisting Missions that are internally weak; 2nd, helping the subdivision of too large Missions; 3rd, *chiefly opening up quite new ground* hitherto neglected, where railway and other enterprises have opened the way. The following new Missions have been formed: N. Hastings, Clarendon, Maberly, Combermere, Clara, Lombardy.—6.

The Board regrets deeply that the funds at its disposal would not enable it to meet all the applications for this latter work of taking up new ground which were made during the past year. It was calculated that \$12,000 at least would be required for this year's operations, and it was recommended that previous to the holding of the Missionary meetings an appeal should be put forth in behalf of the Mission Fund, urging upon Church members the great necessity for increased liberality. A strong, vigorous, and touching appeal was accordingly issued, setting forth the progress of the Church in this Diocese, and its still increasing growth and expansion. The Board is much disappointed that the response has not been as successful as was anticipated, less money having come in than in the previous year. While the Board is thankful to God for all that has been contributed, it would earnestly impress upon the clergy that no efforts should be spared by them to bring the subject of increased liberality in the cause of Missions before their people, so that they may be educated—for it is an education—up to the standard of the Church's requirements, and brought to feel and understand the great responsibility that rests upon every member of the Church to do his utmost to maintain and extend the kingdom of our Blessed Lord, in this portion of the Church committed to our care.

SUSTENTATION FUND.

The Board desires to inform the Synod that the bequest of the late Mr. R. P. LaBatt, amounting to \$2,500, together with \$500 of the accrued interest, (the amount of which paid over to the Synod is \$627.50), has been added to the Capital of this Fund, which now amounts to \$34,500. The income of this Fund is transferred to the Mission Fund.

This Fund is at present liable to a further claim of \$360 from the widow and orphans of a Clergyman of this Diocese, lately deceased. Should this claim be presented, the present yearly expenditure must be estimated at \$2,420, or \$317.50 more than our estimated revenue. A comparison of the balance sheet of this Fund, made on the 30th April this year, with that made on the corresponding date last year, may seem to tell a more encouraging tale, showing, as it does, that the capital (including, of course, cash on hand) was \$870 better than it was last year. But when it is noted that a large proportion of this increase was abnormal, being derived from—1st, a thank-offering of \$100; 2d, a special appeal for increased offerings on the fifth Sunday in Lent, resulting in an increase of \$308 over that of the previous year; 3d, arrears of Clerical subscriptions and interest thereon, paid in on account of the amendments to the Canon, amounting to \$221.22; and when it is further noted that owing to a change in some of the investments and a consequent reduction in the rate of interest, there is a falling off of revenue from that source of \$55.61, it becomes evident that this comparison furnishes us but with little encouragement when estimating the income of the Fund for the future. Your Committee would therefore suggest that his Lordship the Bishop be respectfully requested to issue at the beginning of Lent in each year, a pastoral impressing upon the members of the Church throughout the Diocese the absolute necessity of largely increasing their contributions to this Fund, if all the legal claims of the present are to be met, and the possible contingencies of the future provided for.

II.—REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE ON CHURCH STATISTICS.

The Committee on Church Statistics beg to report as follows :—

1. They have to express regret that so large a number of parishes have not made their statistical returns for the past year. Out of 92 parishes, returns have come in from only 49. The Committee would respectfully urge upon the remaining parishes the importance of these returns being sent in at once, so that they may appear in the Journal of Synod.

2. Your Committee are of opinion that much of the seeming apathy shewn upon this subject is due to the fact that no proper records are kept from day to day, or from week to week, in the several parishes, of the various details upon which statistical information is sought. This omission gives the semblance of a formidable task to what would be a work of no great difficulty if the daily or weekly records were carefully kept. In addition to the registers of Baptisms, Confirmations, Marriages, and Burials, every clergyman should furnish himself with,—

(1) *A Parish List*, containing a careful enumeration of all the families and individuals belonging to his congregation or congregations.

(2) *A Visiting Roll* (which may be an ordinary pass book, easily carried in the pocket), containing the several households of his parish arranged in a list, with ruled spaces in which to record the several visits made to each during the year. The letter "V," written in a column opposite a name would denote an ordinary parochial visit; "S" would indicate a sick call, and "C" a private celebration.

(3) *A Preacher's Book*, containing the record of the services, sermons, and catechising, with the attendance at each.

(4) *A Communicant's Roll*, in which the attendance of each communicant should be recorded after a celebration.

Experience has shown that the keeping of such records is of material aid to a clergyman in the efficient working of his parish, enabling him to see at a glance both what he has done and what he has left undone, and keeping him thoroughly posted as to the state of his parish, and of the individuals who compose it. These records, with the Parish and Sunday School Registers, and the Churchwardens' account books, would readily supply all the information needed to compile the annual returns required by Synod.

3. The returns for the year just closed have been received too recently, and are still too incomplete to furnish suitable material for this report. Your Committee, however, beg to present, as examples of the practical use which may be made of these returns, a few facts elicited from the returns printed in last year's Journal.

(1) Under the head of "Congregational Statistics," returns were received from two-thirds of the whole number of parishes within the Diocese, viz., 61. The number of individuals reported as connected with these 61 parishes was 30,392, grouped into 5,960 families. If the 30 parishes from which no returns

were received, contain only a proportionate number of individuals, the startling conclusion is reached that out of some 80,000 persons within the Diocese, whom the Census reports as claiming to be Church people, only about 45,000 are known to the clergy or recognized by them as members of the Church. This brings the Synod face to face with two questions of great practical importance, which ought not to be lightly put aside: (1) Where are the remaining 35,000 Church people? (2) By what means are they to be reached? It does not, however, fall within the province of a Committee on Statistics to offer a solution of these problems.

(2) Only 48 parishes made returns last year, under the two heads of "Divine Service" and "Pastoral Work,"—24 from each Archdeaconry. These returns, when carefully studied, afford remarkable evidence of the zeal and efficiency with which the work of the Church is carried on by the clergy of those parishes from which they have been received. Your Committee are convinced that if all the parishes would send in full and accurate returns under these heads, the information to be gleaned therefrom would be such as to reflect great credit upon the Clergy of this Diocese as a body, and would tend to the diffusion among them of a spirit of generous emulation which would be productive of still happier results in the future.

(3) Returns of "Congregational Finances" were made last year by 45 parishes, viz.: 22 in the Archdeaconry of Kingston, and 23 in that of Ottawa, being about one-half of the whole number. A feature worthy of remark in these returns is the small number of churches which derive any income from pew rents—only four in the Kingston Archdeaconry, and two in that of Ottawa. Out of \$55,445.91 collected from the people for Church objects in these 45 parishes, only \$5,057.72 consisted of pew rents, shewing that, throughout this Diocese, the chief source of revenue for the work of the Church lies in the voluntary offerings of the people, contributed at the Offertory or by subscription lists.

(4) In the schedule of "Church Property," it is gratifying to note that insurance of churches and parsonages seems very general throughout the Diocese. Your Committee would respectfully direct the attention of the proper authorities to the few instances in which this wise precaution against serious loss by fire appears not to have been taken. It is also much to be desired that the few parishes which have not hitherto sent in their returns under this head, should do so before the printing of the Journal of Synod, which would then, in conjunction with the Journals of the 21st and 22nd Sessions, exhibit a complete inventory of the Church Property of the Diocese.

All of which is respectfully submitted.

I.—Auditors' Report.

1.—REPORT OF OFFICIAL AUDITORS.

The undersigned Official Auditors for the Synod desire to present their report:—

Messrs. Sargent and Scobell, the professional accountants, having carefully examined the books and accounts of the Secretary, have furnished certificates as to their being correct, and have presented balance sheets showing the receipts and expenditure for the several Funds.

The indebtedness to the Bank of Montreal from the Mission Fund on the 1st May last was \$1,496.38, but there was received by the Clerical Secretary on that day, after banking hours, the sum of \$98.25, which would reduce the debt to \$1,398.13.

Debentures of the County of Simcoe, amounting to \$7,000, are deposited with the Bank to cover the overdraft of the Mission Fund.

Having carefully examined all the mortgages, debentures, deposit receipts and other securities belonging to the several Funds, we found them in the proper keeping, those transferable by delivery being in the vaults of the Bank of Montreal in the joint custody of the Manager of the Bank and the Clerical Secretary.

The books and accounts of the Clerical Secretary are most satisfactory, and reflect the greatest credit upon him.
