HON. JOHN COSTIGAN.

The Honorable John Costigan, Minister of Inland Revenue, is the only member of Parliament representing a New Brunswick constituency, who has been continuously in the House of Commons since Confederation. This fact of itself is sufficient to give him a certain distinction in Parliament, quite independent of his labors which are of a high order and calculated to make him prominent in any public position to which he may aspire. Mr. Costigan was born at St. Nicholas, in the Province of Quebec, on February 1st, 1853, and consequently now in his fifty-fourth year. He received his education at the college of St. Ann's, and soon afterwards removed to New Brunswick, taking up his residence in Victoria County. By descent Mr. Costigan is Irish, but his early associations and his education threw him much among the French, and fitted him to become the representative of both nationalities in the Legislature and in Parliament. In the Province of Quebec he is no uncommon thing to find a public man who can speak both French and English with equal fluency and ease, but this is an accomplishment in which Mr. Costigan we believe stands alone among the members of Parliament for New Brunswick. Mr. Costigan at an early age gave evidence of those solid intellectual qualities by which he was distinguished in later years. But he took no conspicuous part in public affairs until 1871, for election to the Legislature of New Brunswick. His constituents and was elected. At the time the Tully government was in power in New Brunswick and it continued until some changes of personnel took place at the beginning of 1885, when it was defeated on the question of Confederation. Responsible government had been won and there was no burning question to disturb the harmony of the Legislature until the question of union with Canada became a political issue. Mr. Costigan proved a useful and industrious member of the Legislature and continued to represent Victoria County in that body until the summer of 1886, when he experienced his only defeat. He was a ready and persuasive speaker and on all occasions he addressed the House with attention and respect. But when Confederation became an accomplished fact, he saw at once that he could better serve in the House of Commons of Canada than in the Legislature which had been shorn of many of its powers. He therefore offered himself for election as the representative of the electoral district of Victoria at the first Dominion election in 1887, and was returned. He was re-elected for the same constituency in 1891; again at the general election of 1887; once more at the general election of 1892; and finally at the general election of 1893. This uniform success in the more gratifying because the constituency he represented was largely Catholic, French as both combined. Yet at the election of 1887 Mr. Costigan, although opposed by a Frenchman, was successful, and defeated his opponent even in the French parish, and went far ahead in the vote in the others in which the population was varied. On May 22nd 1882, immediately before the grand election of that year, Mr. Costigan was sworn in as Minister of Inland Revenue and has continued to hold that position.
