SECRET FOR TAMING HORSES.

The horse-castor is a wart, or excrescence, which grows on every horse's fore-legs, and generally on the hind legs. It has a peculiar rank, mosty smell end easily pulled off. The ameniacal effluvia of the horse seems peculiarly to concentrate in this part, and its very strong odor has a great attraction for all animals, e pecially cannot, and the horse hinself.
