
Endurance tests have usually been made at speeds giving approximately 1,000 ft. per min. piston speed. Published tests of this kind demonstrate ability to endure long periods of hard work at one speed. They do not exhibit the properties of an engine when working at maximum output for long periods at all speeds covered by ordinary use of the engine.


Another feature of moderate speed tests is their failure to cause, relatively, great continued mechanical punishment of working parts. For example, it is well known that stresses due to reversal of motion of reciprocating parts increase, not as the speed, but as the square of the speed.
