

The excursion to Fredericton on the steamer "Boothby" yesterday was much enjoyed, the slight detention at Long Island not interfering with the pleasure. The accident caused a delay of only a few minutes.

The case of Brophy, charged with stabbing his brother on Sunday, has been postponed until Saturday. The wounds are not serious.

A horse belonging to Mr. Case, of Parisville, and driven by a young man to whom it had been hired, dropped on the road, near Musquash, yesterday. When policeman Wm. Evans attempted to arrest a boy on Smythe street, last night, the woman and other friends of the lad contrived to drag him into the house, Evans following and retaining his hold of the prisoner. After getting in, the whole party were pushed down the cellar stairs and the prisoner rescued. In the scuffle Evans's hand was badly bitten by one of the women. The boy could not afterwards be found.

A Handsome Gift.

Capt. Charles Lawrence, of the bark Chebeco, now lying at Robertson's wharf, has had a very handsome gold watch presented to him by the British Government. The testimonial is given as a reward for the generous conduct of Capt. Lawrence in rescuing the crew of the British bark Virginia, of South Shields, Eng., in lat. 40.30, lon. 30, during the month of February, 1874. Capt. Lawrence was then master of the Windsor brig Lilly. The watch bears a suitable inscription.

The Chebeco of which Capt. Lawrence has just taken charge, is a fine new bark belonging to Windsor. She is loading deals for Liverpool and is con signed here to John Melick, Esq.

Shipping Notes. Steamers - The City of Portland, hence for Boston, left Portland at 7.30 a. m. to-day. Point Lepreau, May 25, 9 a. m. - Wind N. W.; light, foggy, raining.

The bark "Frederic" - fifty of her crew - Capt. Patterson of the ship Elizabeth, at Quebec from Liverpool, reports having on the 14th inst. sighted a bark to leeward with signals of distress flying, bore down on her and found her to be the Favorite of Liverpool, for Miramichi, in a sinking condition, the Captain and crew, who had taken to their boats, came on board the Elizabeth. Shortly afterwards transferred four of them to the bark C. Hall, of Yarmouth, bound for Miramichi on the 7th inst. in ballast, to load lumber for Great Britain.

Rescue for Gallant Services - The Marine and Fisheries department, at Halifax, has received instructions from Ottawa to present \$10 each to Messrs. John Hayes, Thos. Hayes, Joseph Higgins, Chas. Thomas and Frederick Venn, all of Herring Cove, for their noble effort to rescue the crew of the brig, Helen, which was wrecked near that place last January. The men went out in the height of the storm, in a scow boat, and rowed over a mile to the wreck; but

when they reached it the crew had got ashore in their own boat.

A bold highway robbery. Wm. Smith, of Smithtown, above-mentioned, appeared at the Police Office this morning with the story of a bold robbery committed on him last night. He arrived in the city by the evening train, having some \$200 in a wallet in his pocket. He says he was perfectly sober, and is not at all a drinking man. He came to town for the purpose of paying a note and as a long-coming bill, and it was also his intention to secure a servant girl for his family. After reaching St. John he took a walk to the Three Mile House, and at once started to walk there by the Railway track. It was then between 10 and 11. When he had passed the Round House he noticed three men sitting down near the side of the track, and had scarcely time to think ere he was attacked by them, backed down and tied by his own braces to the rails. He was searched and the pocket book, with the \$200, was found in the breast of his coat. Nothing else was taken and after robbing him the three men ran off, leaving him still tied to the track. After about half an hour's hard work he succeeded in getting himself free and returned to the city. He does not know his assailants and would be unable to identify them. This morning he bore the appearance of having passed a very restless night and his eyes were much swollen. He desired drinking anything and accounts for his appearance by the anxiety to which he was put by the hour to walk through the darkness to the Three Mile House is not apparent, and though he may have lost the amount mentioned, his story is doubted by many who have heard it. Why three men should be him to the track and do nothing but relieve him of his pocket book is another strange feature of the case. Smith is about 35 years old and has a family.
