THE COMMANDER OF THE FORCES requires the implicit Obedience to the following extracts of Barracks Regulations, which His Excellency has exhibited in the different Barrack Rooms.

No Officer, or Barrack Master shall, on any pretence without *Special Authority*, convert any Barrack Plan of the Barracks: and in order, that there may not be any mistake hereafter in any matter which concern Barrack Masters are hereby directed, to have the use for which each Room is designed painted on the door thereof, shall suffer Coals to be wetted, or Wood to be sawed, or split on the floors, or the floor to be injured by iron shall drive, or suffice to be driven, nails or holdasts into the Partitions or Walls, whereby the Paint or plaster to any racks or shelves in the Rooms, the Barrack Master, (who shall visit the Barrack Rooms once every two months) is hereby directed, *immediately* to represent the same in writing to the Officer at the head of the Barrack Department. The Commanding Officer of each Regiment or detachment shall be answerable that the Rooms, Stair Cases, Furniture and Utensils, shall be kept perfectly clean, and he shall not suffer that any Article of Barrack Furniture or Utensil be taken out of the Barrack, or applied to any other purpose than that, for which it was first responsible that the Kitchens, Stair cases, Galleries, Yards, &c &c are regularly swept and kept perfectly clean, shall direct, under the superintendance of the Officers, his Juniors, who shall be Quartered therein, and by


urity, convert any Barrack Room to any purpose, except such as it was intended for, in the original plan; after any manner which concerns so materially the preservation of His Majesty's Barracks, Barracks painted on the door thereof, and if any Officer shall make any alteration in any Room, or the floor to be injured by iron creepers or otherwise, or shall fix up shelves, racks, hooks or boards, or whereby the Paint or plastering may be injured or defaced, or suffer clothes lines to be fastened in Barrack Rooms once every two Months, and intermediately, at seasonable hours whenever he desires the Head of the Barrack Department, in order that he may report it to the Commander of the Forces, that the Rooms, Stair Cases, Cooking Houses, Yards, Avenues, &c. &c. as well as the Beds, Bedding Article of Barrack Furniture, denominated as fixtures be moved from the Rooms, or any bed that, for which it was first issued:—In Officers' Barracks, the Senior Officer in each, will be held responsible for the rooms, and by their Soldier-Servants.
