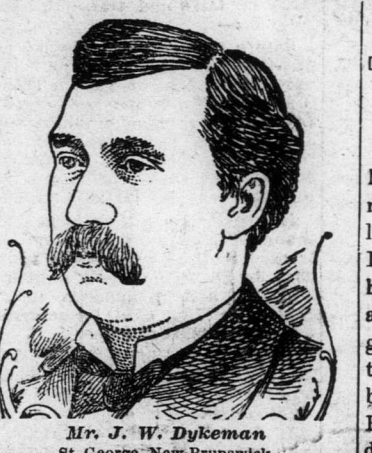

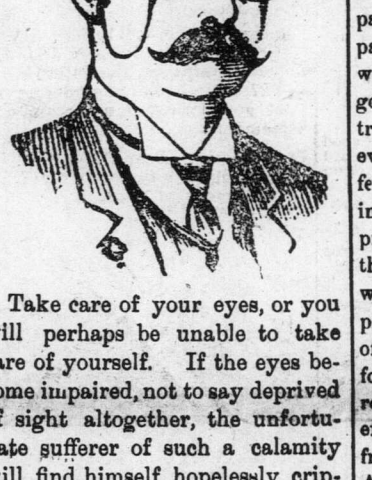

IRELAND. On the 18th ult. Very Rev. H. Henry, D. D., president St. Malachy's College, Belfast, received official intelligence from the Sacred Congregation of Propaganda of his selection by the Holy See as Bishop of the diocese of Down and Connor, in succession to the late Most Rev. Dr. McAlister.

SCOTLAND. On Sunday, 18th August, at High Mass in St. Mary's Cathedral, His Grace the Archbishop presided, and in all the Catholic churches in Edinburgh special services were conducted and sermons delivered anted to the occasion.

poor women bore their banishment with a patience equal to their other virtues, and the crew of the ship in which they were received, were penetrated with respect for them. They seemed to rejoice in the midst of their fatigues and dangers of the passage, as the occasion offered to them to alleviate minor misfortunes, in a country deprived until then of the effects of their benevolence.

In 1891 the Protestants of the Province of Quebec numbered one hundred and ninety-four thousand in a population of a million and a half, or less than one-seventh of the population.

In his new work entitled 'The Colonial Branches of the Firm of John Bull & Co.,' Max O'Rell pays this tribute to the Catholic clergy laboring in Australia and throughout the English-speaking world: 'One cannot but be struck on reading this list, by the progress made and the importance acquired by the Catholic religion in the English Colonies and the Pacific Islands. And yet there is nothing astonishing about it when one thinks how easy it must have been for those charitable and devoted priests—who consecrate soul and body to the poor and unhappy, and the education and placing out of their children,—to win converts among the struggling colonials, hungry for sympathy, and always ready to open their hearts, a life of privations and sacrifices. The life of these priests is so exemplary that the Australians of all creeds speak of them with the greatest respect; and when they indulge in criticism or jokes on the clergy, it is never at the expense of a Catholic priest.'

Preparations are being made by Catholics in Europe for the holding of an international Anti-Masonic Congress before the end of the year, Continental Freemasonry is the most dangerous enemy which the Church in Europe has to contend with at the present day. It is the most dangerous because it is the most insidious and because it yields so potent and so baleful an influence in social and political circles on the continent. Leo Taxil, at one time a rabid anti-clerical and Freemason, is one of the most ardent promoters of the projected Congress.

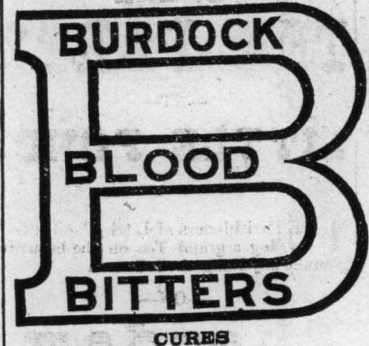
