THE MCCARTHY ACT.

M. C. Cameron, of West Huron Secures the Suspension.

A great surprise was in store for the House when the notices of motion were reached. Mr. Cameron (Huron) has had on the list since early in the session a resolution to be considered by the House in committee, declaring that the Dominion License Act of 1883 and its amendments, which have been declared by the Supreme Court ultra vires, should be suspended until a decision of the Judicial Committee of the Privy Council is obtained.

Sir John, fearing Mr. Cameron would proceed with the debate, at once gave his assent, and the House went into committee on the resolution to suspend the act, when it was reported, and, on motion, was read a second time and placed on the order paper for a third reading tomorrow.

This is a great extent Ontario's victory. The other Provinces in this case stood up well for their rights, but had it not been for the sturdy defence made by Mr. Cameron's Government, Sir John would have succeeded in throwing the liquor trade into confusion for several years, and that was the object he was striving for.
