Boy Drowned

OVER TRESTLE BRIDGE.

A son of Mr. Thomas Linegar, the well known truckman, was drowned in a tragic manner over the trestle bridge in the West End yesterday afternoon. The river in this section is generally swollen after heavy rains and the current would take a man to his death. The boy, it is thought, fell over the bridge but no one knows why he went out there. This bridge is only for trains not for pedestrians. A little girl named Mignonette was the only witness of the tragedy. She called out when Patrick O'Brien, a truckman, jumped into the water just as he stood and tried to get the boy but he had gone below the surface and the turmoil of the river was such that it discoloured the stream so much that he could not see the little body. When the matter was reported to the police Const. Patrick O'Neill with a jigger took the child off the bottom after a short search. One of the most intelligent men in the force, Const. O'Neill, gave first aid and tried to restore animation. For fully an hour he worked on the boy but the lad was dead when taken out of the water. When the body was brought home a sad scene occurred. Mr. Linegar is a man who in a few years cleared one of the finest parts of the Blackhead Road. Always honest and industrious he well deserves the title of a pioneer in this section.
