A Shameful Bargain.

On Wednesday evening, in the Dominion Parliament, Mr. Huntington-a barrister of twenty years standing, a Queen's Counsel, a mem ber of Parliament for thirteen years and formerly a member of the Exec utive Council-brought in a motion of which he had previously given notice, for an inquiry into all the facts connected with the contract recently conferred by Government on the Pacific Railway Company.
