
THE SHIMMIE FISH-CLEANING MACHINE

The following description from the Pacific Fisherman of a new machine for removal of heads and fins being hand cleaned fish will read with interest in Victoria, particularly as the inventor is a former resident of this city. The fish-cleaning machine here represented is an absolute departure in mechanism from any other cleaner yet devised. It is thus constructed does the entire cleaning of the fish, where it drops in the elevator, absolutely and thoroughly in condition for the salting process. It should be added that the wheel, which is 7 feet in diameter, carries at each complete revolution 10 fish. The machine is entirely automatic and adjusts itself readily to the various sizes of salmon used for canning.

Manager Dudden, in whose cannery the machine was perfected and demonstrated, has the distinction this year of being the only cannery man on the Pacific Coast who did not make any money in the season, but who has made a large profit by reason of having implicit confidence in the Shimmie machine. The results have not only confirmed his judgment, but also effected him a saving of several thousand dollars. All practical canners will at once recognize what it means to be able to do away with a large portion of this, one of the most expensive and uncertain features of the business. Many thousands of dollars have been lost this season by canners on Chinese contracts.

U. S. ELECTRIC TRAMWAYS.

It appears that the most extensive use of street and electric railways is in the North Atlantic States, where the average number of miles per inhabitant in 1902 was 124; the Western States come next with an average of 74. The greatest increase in this respect is shown for the South Atlantic States, where the average was almost three times as great in 1902 as it was in 1890. The average number of miles per inhabitant for the entire United States has almost doubled during the twelve years. Of the total amount reported as paid in dividends, 28,787,857 dobs. was paid on common stock, the total net value of which was 662,700,281 dobs. This represents an average rate of 5.1 per cent on preferred stock, 4,301,284 dobs. is an average of 5.1 per cent on the 904,050 dobs. of stock on which dividends were paid. There were 124,942,000 dobs. of common and 42,984,000 dobs. of preferred stock on which no dividends were paid. In preparing the income account and balance sheet, the majority of companies charged the interest on their debt outstanding as paid. The total amount of interest was 45,738,961 dobs., equal to 4.4 per cent on the total amount of 992,700,281 dobs. of funded debt outstanding. There were 678 operating companies reporting a net income of 262,084,000 dobs., and 220 reporting a net deficit of 3,755,497 dobs. The percentage of operating expenses to net income for all the operating companies in the United States amounted to 57.5.

THE WEEK'S MINING.

Some discontent is expressed at the poor returns of the Le Roi mine for the past two months. In July a small loss was reported, and in August the estimated profits on shipment approximating \$100,000. The mine was but \$15,000. The water feature of the case however, is that quite the greater part of this profit was derived from old accumulations ore lying on what is known as the second-class dump, the 12,000 tons shipped from the workings yielded a profit of \$2500. The mine was seriously interfered with by the high water, followed by labor troubles. Nevertheless, it is thought that the yield will again show a further increase. Good returns have already been received from McKee, Birch, Wright, O-

level, but prospecting with diamond drills is being continued. As a result of thirteen years' crushing on some 350 tons of L.L.L. ore, which are being treated at the O.K. ten-stamp mill at Rossland, a recovery of 120 ounces is reported. The L.L.L. mine was recently acquired under leasehold rights, and like several other mines on which operations were suspended, but now being worked under the lease system, promises to become a profitable enterprise.

Shipments from the Granby mines, in the Boundary district, have now, for the present year, reached a total of over a quarter of a million tons, or rather over twice the aggregate output of all the mines in that territory for the nine months just closing. The next highest producer this year has been the Le Roi Copper Company's Mother Lode mine, with a record of approximately 90,000 tons.

Some apprehension was felt last week in the likelihood of further labor troubles at the likelihood of further labor troubles (Kootenay), and for a brief space some men actually refused to continue work. The grievance of the miners, however, was the spot at which the cars were examined for rock and dirt did not admit of their representatives being made to act as check-weighmen; that it is stated that neither the company's weighmen, nor the check-weighmen made by the men, have knowledge of who produces the coal or whose coal they are weighing, as the company has prevented the weighman from seeing the number of check run by the miner; and that a number of the cars, through carelessness or otherwise, in transit from the working faces to the railway cars are wrecked, a portion of the contents being thereby lost to the miner, where the company emphatically refuses to reimburse. Upon these grievances, however, being brought in a proper manner to the attention of the mine management, an adjustment was speedily effected and all possibility of a strike is now at an end. Meanwhile, the pay roll at the Crow's Nest colliery is steadily increasing, \$100,000 having been distributed last month in wages. In the Lardens district, a promising discovery of ore is reported to have been made on the Oregon, a claim near the Silver Camp, which now beginning to make heavy shipments, and is being very completely equipped with an aerial tram line, and concentration and chlorination mills. In the Lower Lardens, asbestos of good quality has been found.

At Camp McKinley the Waterloo mine continues to make a satisfactory showing, and under way at the past two months. Activity in the Ymir district continues, and production is steadily increasing. The Altin mine, under lease, shipped last week a carload of ore to Nelson, averaging 227 a ton. The E. C. Standard Company is building an aerial tramway at the Hunter V., and work is being resumed at the Porto Rico mines. A very promising strike has been made at the Mountain Con, the Slocan; an ore claim, which has yielded to 22 inches having been encountered, carrying high values in the form of grey copper and galena. The owners have already taken out 100 sacks of ore from the cutting. Preparations for extensive operations are now under way at the Ivanhoe. The manager is now at the Coast purchasing the machinery required for the new tram. A new wagon train will be built from No. 4 tunnel to connect with the main workings, to carry the clean ore blocked out in the upper workings. During the last week a rich seam of ruby and amethyst ore was struck by the E. C. Standard Co. No. 4, and the seam extends to the lower levels. There is no more sale to two years' supply ore blocked out.
