

CHURCH SERVICES:

St. Mark's Church, Vesuvius—Morning service 11 a.m., and Holy Communion the first Sunday in each month. Afternoon service 3:30 p.m. On all other Sundays, except when a fifth Sunday in the month occurs—evening service 7:30 p.m. Choir practice, St. Mark's, every Saturday evening.

North End School—Service 11 a.m. the third Sunday in each month.

Beaver Point School—Service 11 a.m. the fifth Sunday in the month, whenever there are five Sundays.

St. Mary's Church, Fulford—Morning service 10:30 a.m. second and fourth Sundays in each month. Holy Communion on the fourth Sunday of every second month. Evening service the first Sunday of the month 7:30 p.m.

Home Sunday School—Children prepare Sunday School lessons in their own homes. Bible questions are given in Parish and Home Instruction and examinations at their homes every two months.

Ladies' Church Guild—Meets once a month.

DECEMBER.

✓ Rain, rain, rain—all through November

J. C. Scovell arrived home from England on the 21st ult.

The Ladies' Guild meets at Mr. Wilson's house Friday, December 1st.

Llewelyn Wilson arrived home from Lake Bennett on the 7th ult., and Walter Stevens and C. Atkins, from Atlin, on the 12th.

Mr. H. W. Bullock is having brick piers built under his residence in place of the former wooden supports, and is also building a cottage for his farm man.

Messrs. Cecil Abbott and Ernest Crofton are settled in at the former's home on Ganges Harbour. Mr. Crofton has given up his sea-faring life and is applying himself to farming.

Jimmy Robertson, of North End, was reported drowned off a raft on the Yukon, but it is hoped the report is a false one, and that ere long he may be back again to Salt Spring.

Weather report for October—Kuper Island: Mean temperature 47.8; maximum, 68.9 (on 4th); minimum, 28.0 (on 13th and 14th), mean proportion of bright sunshine, .29; maximum .860 (on 12th); days completely clouded, 12; rainfall, 5.00 inches; hoar frost on 12th, 13th and 14th.

October, 1896, the rainfall was 3.04 inches; 1897, 2.62 inches; 1898, 4.23 inches; this year, 5.00 inches. Next issue we will give November for the four years; it has probably beaten the record.

This month, four years ago, there was talk of erecting a Public Hall, and of opening a new school at the Divide; old Mrs. Macdonald and Mrs. Ed. Lee had just died. Mr. and Mrs. Collins and family had just arrived on the Island.
