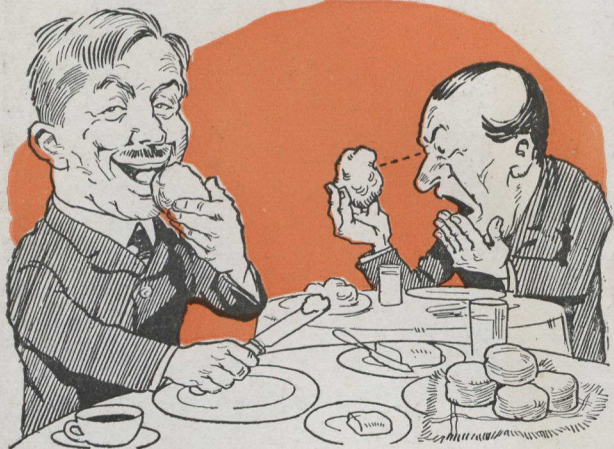

“MADE-IN-CANADA CAMPAIGN”

For the year ending November, 1920, Canadians imported goods valued at \$1,345,582,300 as against \$920,082,927 for the previous year, an increase of purchases from other countries amounting to \$425,499,373.

Of the total, \$927,564,711 worth, or over 68 per cent. came from the United States. On those imports Canadians paid exchange reaching as high as $17\frac{1}{4}$ per cent. (On December 21st, 1920, exchange reached a record, when the Canadian dollar was only worth $81\frac{7}{8}$ cents in United States funds). Canadians are still sending their money to the United States and paying heavy exchange in spite of the fact that thousands of Canadian workers, who are willing and able to produce the most of these imports, are out of employment because Canadian factories are running part time or closing down because they lack orders for goods. The unemployed men and women and their families are being supported at the public expense, involving an additional burden to taxpayers.

If Canadians united in a resolve to buy Canadian-made goods as far as possible instead of imported goods, most of the problems of trade depression and unemployment would be quickly solved.

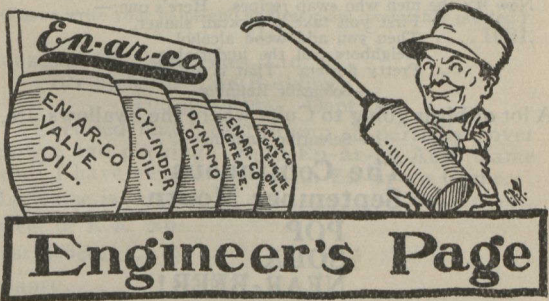

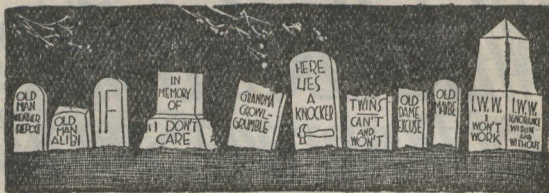

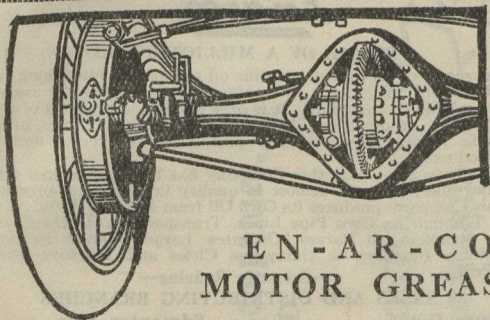
