Political corruption, deep and wide-

spread, as The World stated yesterday,

is the cause of Spain's joining the ranks

of the decaying nations. We are not

unacquainted with political corruption

nor are our neighbors to the south; but

Spain is and has been for many years

years honeycombed with it. The revenues

of the country are farmed out; the tax-

collectors extort all they can from the

taxpayers and keep what they like out of

what they extort; government supplies

are rotten and worthless; the navy is

badly equipped, and the votes for ships

and for the army are milked and plun-

dered at every band; money raised by

the state is raised by a system of pawn-

broking, and pawnbrokers dictate to the

King and to the cabinet. Civic virtue

is the rarest plant that grows. Spanish

law and Spanish justice are the same.

Spain is a land of many brave men

ready to lay down their lives for their

country; but national honor and pride

should be of such a stamp and charac-

ter as would keep political corruption al-

ways in check. There is and ever has

been civic virtue among the people who

live under English institutions sufficient

to put down the political corruptionist

whenever he appears to be getting too

powerful and too grasping. There is a

large measure of rough political virtue

in our people when an emergency arises,

and woe to the schemer on whose luck-

less head the wrath of the citizens falls.

But political virtue of this kind is slow-

unknown in Spain or in her unhappy

colonies.

A SANATORIUM FOR TORONTO.

There is a movement under way among

some members of the medical fraternity

to establish a sanatorium for consump-

tives in the immediate vicinity of To-

ronto. When Mr. Gage's project was

before the public in its preliminary

stages the question was discussed

whether the sanatorium he proposed

establishing should be located near To-

ronto or in Muskoka. Many advocated

the former site, but the balance of the

argument appeared to be favorable to

Gravenhurst, which was accordingly

selected. The Muskoka country is no

doubt unexcelled as a location for such

an institution, but it is equally true

that plenty of admirable sites for a san-

atorium can be found on the high lands

in the neighborhood of Toronto. Without

raising a controversy as to the merits

of Gravenhurst and Toronto from a

sanitary point of view, it may safely

be affirmed that a sanatorium in this

locality would be greatly in the public

interest. The success of the institution

at Gravenhurst is a guarantee that its

duplication here would be a great public

benefit. Propinquity to the centre of

population is an argument of weight,

and the selection of a location for almost

any kind of an institution, financial,

commercial or sanitary. Patients would

often be induced to go to an hospital,

accessible to their friends, when they

would refuse to isolate themselves in a

institution involving a long railway
