INTEMPERANCEBREEDSCONSUMPTION

London, May 22.—Belief advanced by so many famous surgeons that intemperance is an active agent in the spread of consumption has found a

spread of consumption has found a powerful supporter to Sir William Broadbent.

In a striking speech at a meeting of the National Association for the Prevention of Consumption at the Mansion House he declared that deficient food, overwork, stuffy rooms and alcoholic excesses were the principal factors in the progress of the disease, and then in impressive tones he emphasized his belief that the greatest and most potent of these was alcoholic excess.

Expectoration, he continued, caused it to spread more than anything clise. If the whole of the expectoration could be destroyed at one moment the disease would be stamped out. Spitting must be stopped by public opinion and by punishment.

Regarding sanatoria Sir William declared that they had been discredited by people expecting too much of them, but that they were nevertheless the principal means of curing disease.

At present they were only for the rich, but they should be made available for the poor.

After the Earl of Derby had declared that light and air would do more good than the most skilful attendance and treatment or the most careful concoction and nauseous drugs. Sir James Crichton Browne gave it as his opinion that the better feeding of schoolohildren would diminish the disease in the poor districts.

He laughed at the theory that consumption was incurable.

In 1902, he said, the disease claimed 50,000 victims, as against 57,000 in 1832 and 67,000 in 1832 and 67,000 in 1832 and 67,000 in 1832. This reduction had been brought about in spite of the increase of population and the overcrowding of cities.

DISINTERRED LUTHER'S BONES.

ious 'Churchmen.

Berlin, May 22.-The public has just earned with some surprise that the learned with some surprise that the mortal remains of Martin Luther were disturbed a few years ago.

When the Schloss-Kirche in Wittenberg was renovated by orders of Emperor William I. search was made under the altar for the coffins containing the bodies of the great reformers. Martin Luther and Philip Melancthon, which were supposed to lie there.

Melancthon's coffin was actually found, but the old emperor, on being informed of the discovery, gave strict orders that nothing should be touched and no further investigation was made. The work of renovation proceeded slowly and was not completed when the present emperor ascended the throne.

Before the church was reopened two men. impelled with the desire to know whether there was any truth in the old legend that Luther's enemies had disinterred his remains and reburied them in a neighboring unconsecrated field, disobeyed the orders given by the old emperor. One Sunday morning, early in the year 1892, the architect who had carried out the rebuilding of the church locked himself up in it with the sacristan, and the two determined to dig until they came across Luther's coffin, or convinced themselves that it was not there at all.

Their labor was not in vain, for they found Luther's coffin. The latter had almost rotted away, but the reformer's bones were laid in perfect order and were still in a fairly good state of preservation.


