

A CANADIAN PROBLEM

An extraordinary case that has come to the attention of the Associated Charities of Winnipeg shows in a very clear light some of the difficulties which are met with in assimilating the varied elements brought into Canada by immigration from the old world.

The time worn vice crusade, the religious revival, the ostrich-like sticking of the public head into the sand of ignorance, must be eliminated. It is to be a campaign of sanity, to be carried on in a careful manner. There is no sensationalism in its purpose and there can be none in its results."

The Winnipeg Tribune tells the story of this particular case, showing that a very drastic, and would practically place very low standard of morality exists among some of the immigrants, and that a radical change must be made before they are converted into desirable citizens. From a Ruthenian village in Galicia a man who had a wife and two children eloped to Canada with a woman who had a husband and one child. The pair came to Winnipeg eight years ago and lived as man and wife. They now have three children. Five years ago the women's real husband left his ward a vast increase in individual liberty. years ago the women's real husband left his little boy in charge of its grandparents and followed his wife to Winnipeg. His legal wife, who had come to Canada hoping to be reconciled to her husband, was forced to put her two children in the Children's Home and go to work to support herself.
