Resolved unanimously, As the opinion of this meeting, that the continued exaction at the Crown Land Office of the high rates of duty on Timber and Logs cut upon Crown Lands for the last four years, notwithstanding the repeated applications of the Lumberers and Merchains engaged in the trade, to the Imperial and Colonial Governments, for a return to the low rates, has been the cause of much dissatisfaction, and has led to much embarrassment and distress in this portion of the Province, and are far above what those engaged in the manufacture and export of Timber and Lumber, have found they could afford.

Resolved unanimously. 
