Washington, July 18.—Martin M. Mulhall was excused late this aftermoon until Monday morning on the ground that he was tired after a week of continuous testimony. The committee held a session togish to hear the testimony of S. W. McLave, of Paterson, N. J., now a candidate for Congress, and with whom Mulhall claimed he worked throughout the campaign of 1910, when McLave was running against Wm. Hughes.



GIANT DREDGE FOR THE ST. LAWRENCE WITH AYRSHIRE CATTLE

Will Be Put to Work in the Well Known Quebec Breeder North Channel - Eighteen Million Cubic Yards Must be

Ottawa, Ont., July 18.—An additional dredge, to be one of the largest in the world, will shortly be placed in the North Channel of the St. Lawrence, beiow Quebee, by the Department of Marine and Fisheries, with the object of hastening the work of deepeuing the channel. Representations have been made by the Quebee Board of Trade that as larger vessels are being placed on the St. Lawrence route the work of dredging the channel ought to be advanced with as little delay as necessary, it is estimated that eighteen million yards of material must be taken from the channel between Isle of Orleans and Goose Cape in order to obtain a uniform depth of 35 feet in a channel a thousand feet wide. So far three million cubic yards have been taken out and it is expected that the dredging of the remainder will be finished in four years.
