I. His Excellency the LIEUTERANT GOVERNOR OF NOVA SCOTIA, for the time being, and the Societies for the Propagation of the Gospel, and for PROMOTING CHRISTIAN KNOWLEDGE shall be respectfully requested to be the Patrons of this Society.

11. The Bishor of the Diocese shall be the PRESIDENT of the Society, with a control over all their proceedings. His approval shall be necessary for the completion of all important acts of the Society, and especially for the revocation or alteration of any of the standing rules, and for making any addition to them.

III. There shall be two or more VICE PRESIDENTS, of whom the Archdeacon of Nova Scotia shall be the first; a SECRETARY, an ASSISTANT SECRETARY, when necessary, and a TREASURER.

IV. There shall be a Standing Committee, consisting of the Officers, all the Clergy, and as many Laymen as it shall be thought convenient to choose at the Annual Meeting of the Society. The Lay Members shall continue in the Committee for a year, or until other Lay Members be chosen in their place; and any or all of them may be re-elected. Seven of the Committee shall be a quorum, provided four of them be Laymen.

V. The Society shall be open to all Members of the Church; all of whom shall be invited to unite with it. Ten pounds, paid, at any one time, shall qualify a person to be a Member during his life; and the payment, in advance; of any sum, however small, shall qualify a person to be a member for a year.

VI. The Members of the Church, in every part of the Province, shall be invited to co-operate with the Diocesan Society, by joining Committees of it, which shall be formed, under the direction of their respective Clergymen, either in each Mission or Parish, or in more than one Mission or Parish united, as shall be deemed most convenient, and in strict accordance with the design and rules of the Diocesan Society; and it is recommended to the Committees to forward their funds, as they may be collected, to the General Committee, who will faithfully apply them to the general objects of the Society; but when the Local Committees desire it, they shall receive books, at cost and charges, to the amount of one-fourth of their remittances.

VII. There shall be one General Meeting of the whole Society, including any Members of the Local Committees who can conveniently attend, on such day and at such place as the President may name, of which due notice will be given, with an invitation to every Committee to send at least one Clergyman and two Laymen to represent such Committee, and with a recommendation that each Committee shall meet at some convenient time, immediately before the General Meeting of the Society, that any necessary suggestions may be offered to the representatives of the Committees for their guidance at the General Meeting. And a Special General Meeting may be called at any time and in any place, when the President, or, in his absence, two or more Vice Presidents, shall consider it desirable to appoint such Special General Meeting.

VIII. The objects to which the attention of the Society shall be directed, shall be, generally, those which have engaged the two great Church Societies, in England, for the Propagation of the Gospel, and for Promoting Christian Knowledge, and none other.

IX. The following objects shall more particularly engage the attention of the Society, as soon as their means may enable them to afford such attention:—

<sup>1.—</sup>Supplies of Books and Tracts from the stores of the Society for Promoting Christian Knowledge, and none other, except in cases where other Books or Tracts, in strict conformity with the principles of the Established Church, and particularly adapted to local circumstances, shall first be carefully examined and approved by a Committee of revision, to be appointed by the General Committee,—the approval of which General Committee shall be necessary in the next place,—after which, the books must likewise receive the written approbation of the Bishop.

Missionary visits to neglected and destitute places, under the direction of the Bishop.

3.-Upholding, by all possible and proper means, the Collegiate Establishments at Windsor.

4 .- Assistance to deserving young men, desirous of being qualified for the Ministry of the Church, but requiring aid in pursuing their studies, at the Col-legiate Establishment at Windsor.

5 .- Aid to Sunday and other Schools, in which due attention is paid to instruction in the principles of the Established Church.

6.-Encouragement to the instruction and training of respectable Teachers for Sunday and Daily Schools. -Assistance to the erection or enlargement of Churches and Chapels belong-

ing to the Established Religion, in peculiar or extreme cases. 8.—Assistance to the erection of Parsonage Houses.

9.—Provision for Assistant Missionaries.

10.-Assistance to the Endowment of Parishes.

To there objects, generally, the general contributions will be applied; while contributors, who desire it, may have their individual contributions scrupulously confined to any one or more of these objects. And as some Members of the Church, who are not unmindful of the great spiritual wants in their own neighbourhood, still feel constrained, in pious gratitude for the blessings they enjoy, to allot something, however small, from the means with which a gracious Providence has blessed them, towards the spread of the glorious Gospel among the nations which still sit

X. This Society will gladly receive and forward to the Society for the Propagation of the Gospel, whatever sums may be given for the conversion and instruction of the Heathen-to which object such sums will be strictly confined by the East India Committee of that Society.

XI. Books and Tracts will generally be on sale, at cost and charges :-- and whenever, in particular cases, a deviation from this rule is desired, it must be considered by the Standing Committee, and only permitted when recommended by them and approved by the President, or, in his absence, by two or more of the Vice Presidents.

XII. All Meetings of the Society and of the Committees shall be opened and closed with the prayers used by the two Societies in England, adapted to our situation under the direction of the Bishop.

The following Resolutions in reference to Church Schools, were drawn up by a Sub-Committee appointed for that purpose on the 17th of March, 1848; and adopted by the Society.

Resolved, That the General Committee of this Society having reconsidered the regulations under which the Grants to Church Schools shall hereafter be allowed,

- It has been determined that the Schools already aided shall receive their usual grants for the current year; and that in future no Schools shall receive assistance from this Society but such as comply with the conditions following:
- 1.—That the School House be erected on ground, the title of which, with the buildings and appurtenances, is duly secured to the S. P. G., the Bishop of the Diosese, or the Church Corporation of the Parish.
- 2.—That the Church Catechism be taught in the School, and other religious instruction given in accordance with the principles of the Church, and under the direction of the Missionary.
- 3.—That he application for aid to Day Schools shall be considered at any Meeting of the General Committee, unless the Parish or Disfrict shall have subscribed and secured in addition to any public aid, at least the sum of £40, towards defraying the salary of the Schoolmaster.
- 4.—That any Parish or District complying with the foregoing conditions shall be entitled to receive one fourth of the sum, subscribed and secured as above, from the funds of this Society, so far as its means will allow.
- 5.-That all grants to Schools shall be deemed and considered to be annual.
- 6. AThat every application shall contain the following information:

The following Resolution was passed at the General Meeting held on the 8th of March, 1848:

Resolved.—That the District Associations shall have the privilege of choosing Members of the General Committee resident in Halifax, as their Representatives in the General Committee.

At a Meeting of the General Committee on the 2nd of February, 1849, it was Resolved.

"That this Society employ at least six Clergymen to minister as Assistants in larger Missions, where from the extent of the mission it is impossible for the resident Pastor to render adequate service. That the Society will allow 250 to each of these Clergymen, so soon as a similar sum shall have been adequately secured by the People of the Mission."

With reference to the above Resolution, it was Resolved on the 17th August, 1849—

"That no part of the funds of this Society shall be paid under that resolution until the fixet and each subsequent quarterly payment of the £50 to be provided by the People in such cases, is actually paid in advance to the Treasurer of the Local Committee."

At a General Meeting of the Committee on the 21st February, 1850, the following propositions were received and adopted at the suggestion of a Sub-Committee appointed to take into consideration the subject of Endowment of Parishes in this Diocese—

"I That as the preceding steps (selative to endowment), can only be regarded as preparatory to the object had in view, your Committee would suggest that in order to the actual commencement and prosecution of endowments, a certain annual sum out of the general income of the Society, to whstever amount or proportion may seem fitting to the Society, may be set apart toward the Endowment of Parishes, to be granted by the Standing Committee in such sums as may be proper, and to whatever Parishes exert themselves to raise a larger sum than that granted by the Society, towards their own endowment."

Secondly—" That special grants be made by the Standing Committee to any Parish that shall raise a sum of money toward its own Endowment, to such amount as the funds of the Society will admit."

Thirdly—" The Sub-Committee would beg to recommend to the General Committee the appointment annually of an Endowment Sub-Committee, to consist of Seven Members, to whom the care of the funds contributed for Endowment consist of Seven memoers, to whom the care of the runus contributed for kindowments may be entrusted; and that as little change as possible be made in the members of such Sub-Committee to be so appointed, or only such change as may seem from time to time advisable, in order to ensure uniformity and permanence of action; that the sub-Committee shall make an annual Report to the General Committee of the sums intrusted to them, which may be published in the general report of the Society."

### REPORT.

THE motto chosen for the first publication of this Society was "Behold how good and pleasant it is for brethren to dwell together in unity."

One of the primary objects of its founders appears to have been, the promotion of unity among the children of our beloved Church; and, to use their own words, "the knitting together of Pastors and people in closer bonds of mutual affection and regard." Through the blessing of Almighty God we trust that this truly Christian desire has not been utterly disappointed.

The idea of membership in a Society striving for one great and holy object conveys to the mind a feeling both of responsibility and pleasure.—Of responsibility while we admit that we are individually accountable for every word uttered in its deliberations; for advice and assistance given to its objects; and for the amount of exertion we have constantly made in its behalf—of pleasure while we reflect that we are one of an united number who perhaps before our time of incorporation were labouring in the good cause, and who after our day of toil is over will still continue to forward those objects which we have approved and cherished.

We delight to think that while absent from them the same spirit pervades their proceedings which we have loved to promote: and that although absent in person our heart unites with theirs in the earnest desire of advancing the welfare of our fellow mortals.

While we sincerely regret the cause of his absence, we are gratified by the conviction that his sympathies are with our endeavors, and that his prayers for the welfare of this Society are not omitted.

Of others who have rendered much and valuable service to the D. C. Society, one is at rest from earthly labors where he receives the reward of his diligence; another is about to transfer his attention to a different sphere of usefulness, and we pray that blessings may attend his efforts.

We offer to him our most humble and hearty thanks that he has so far graciously blessed our labors. We desire to express our sense of His protecting care which is manifested in the steady and regular increase of this Society, with regard to its numbers, its funds, the confidence with which it is regarded, and, we hope, its general usefulness.

Its arms are now extended to all parts of the Province. Every where an interest is taken in its proceedings. Everywhere it is held in affectionate esteem, and looked upon with feelings of confidence. From all the Local Committees which have been formed in the several missions we hear of the increasing attention which is given to this Society; while many testify by their contributions that their interest in its operations is not diminished, and that they are ready both with will and deed to further the good cause which it has undertaken. We have much pleasure in noticing the interest which it has awakened among the students of Kings College, Windsor, who have as a body contributed to our funds through the Rector of that parish.

Through the channel of this Society the bond of unity is strengthened throughout our land; while the weak are aided by their stronger brethren in those things which tend to their mutual welfare.

We also record our thanks to the Almighty that we have been enabled, through the increase of our means, somewhat to extend the objects of this Society, while we humbly and confidently rely upon his gracious assistance to accomplish those intentions.

One further object to which this Society has turned its attention is the provision for assistant Clergymen in the larger missions.

In many places the increasing duties of the Missionary make it impossible for him to attend to the spiritual wants of all his people, and to nourish the good seed already sown throughout the widely extended flock over which he presides.

Churches have been built whose doors would be but seldom opened if some encouragement to local exertion should not be offered by this Society.

We hope that the day may not be far distant when in every Church within the Province divine service may be performed at the least on every Lord's Day.

It has therefore become one of the objects of our attention to provide in part for the support of assistant Missionaries, where corresponding exertion is made by those who are to receive the benefit of their ministrations.

An account of the expenditure for this purpose will be given by your Committee, in its proper place.

We cannot pass on from this subject without gladly expressing our sense of the gratitude we owe to the Parent Society in England for the prompt and generous manner in which it has assisted this effort and aided the tottering steps of its offspring by promising to unite with the people, and this Society, in bearing equal portions of the expense thus incurred.

To the Society for the Propagation of the Gospel in Foreign Parts, we are already under greater obligations than we can express, and it has added this also to its past benefits. Our only relief beneath the weight of their kindness is the reflection

"That a grateful mind
"By owing owes not, but still pays, at once
"Indebted and discharg'd;"—

We also pray for the assistance of our heavenly Father in the furtherance of another object, from the prosecution of which we hope that much and permanent good will accrue to our Church.

The conviction has for some time been upon the minds of the Churchmen of this Province, that the day is not far distant when the support of the Church among us must depend principally, if not wholly, upon local exertions.

The necessity of providing against that period has been more evident than the means of meeting the demand.

With the view however of anticipating, and in some measure lightening, the burden, the standing Committee of this Society, at the suggestion of a valuable member, turned its attention toward the endowment of the Church. A Sub-Committee was formed to take into consideration the best means of effecting so desirable an object. Upon whose report it was resolved "That the endowment of the Church should be one of the objects of this Society."

But as so grave a matter required mature deliberation, no permanent plan was agreed upon. It was however unanimously "Resolved, that each Parish or Mission should have the option of receiving back one fourth of its remittance, in Books as at present, or of applying such one fourth to the endowment of their own Parish or Mission."

It was also agreed "that special benefactions made by any parish, mission, or individual, should be encouraged by such a grant from the funds of this Society as the General Committee may deem the state of the funds will admit of."

Several missions have already taken advantage of the former resolution to establish a permanent, though small endowment, toward the support of their Church.

We must also notice that among the resolutions adopted by several Local Committees, were some expressing approbation of this movement toward endowment.

We are all aware that the support hitherto granted by the Society for the Propagation of the Gospel in Foreign Parts, must before long be in a great measure withdrawn, owing to the increasing demands on its munificence.

By adding to its former objects, provision for assistant Missionaries, and partial endowment of missions, this Society has taken a great and decided step toward that high position which it seems destined yet to occupy.

It appears to be thus quietly and gradually preparing itself to fill the place, and follow the steps of the parent Society, and to relieve it of those responsibilities which it has so long supported with regard to the Church in this Province.

It is our hope that the high and noble aims which this Society has in view, will tend to increase and retain the confidence of all Churchmen; while they mark the visible and permanent effects of its exertions, and the decided stand which it is assuming with regard to provision for our Church.

We have reason also to expect that these movements will give a fresh stimulus to the exertions in every mission. They will perceive that by the present combination and timely effort, so desirable an ob-

jest will be easily accomplished, and the honorable burden rest gently on our shoulders. So far as it is at present possible to judge, this expectation will not be disappointed.

To support these great undertakings, there is need of much and continued exertion, of labour and self-denial on the part of both Pastor and People. Certainly much has already been done, and many have cheerfully responded to the call made upon them by the Diocesan Church Society, yet the resources of the Province for such purposes have not yet been fully called into action. Our hope is that the wider aims and broader views which the Society has adopted, will induce many to increase the support already afforded.

Toward this subject your Committee would especially direct your serious attention. For such objects we earnestly solicit the assistance, the sympathy, and above all, the devout prayers of all the faithful, that our heavenly Father would "establish the work of our hands upon us."

### EXPENDITURE.

The Committee would turn your attention to the Expenditure of this Society during the past year.

BOOKS.—The amount expended in Books during the past year is £99 15 24d. Of this sum £88 15 24d. has been returned to the Local Committees as the fourth part of their several remittances, returnable in Books according to a rule of the Society.

the Depository is not duly appreciated, because they are not fully known; and that it is desirable that some means should be adopted in order to make their usefulness more fully understood.

VISITING MISSIONARIES.—During the past year £388 15s. has been granted under the second object of this Society.

The two travelling Missionaries who have been for some time supported by this Society are still earnestly and diligently employed in the districts assigned them by the Bishop of the Diocese.

As a proof of their success it may be remarked that the inhabitants of one district which is poor and widely extended, are not only making application for another Missionary among them, but have actually offered £40 toward his maintenance.

For the support of these pioneers in the Church, the Society has paid £368 15s. The sum of £20 has also been granted to the Venble the Archdeacon to defray the expense of missionary visits by the Rev. H. Y. Porter in Cape Breton during 1848 and 1849.

CHURCH SCHOOLS.—This Society has granted during 1849 £25 toward the support of Schools in which due attention is paid to instruction in the principles of the Established Church.

There appears to be at present no School receiving aid from our funds.

Owing to the various embarrassments which have occurred in carrying out the Society's designs in this direction, and the numerous and pressing calls from other quarters on its resources, the Committee fear that little further progress can at present be made in this most useful part of our work.

The Rev. the President of Lunenburg Local Committee, alluding to our past labours, writes "it will be satisfactory to know, that the grants so liberally made in former years, are yielding good interest of the right kind. That is, the Churches which I have been enabled to build, are well filled by numbers, who would but for the Society's aid, be new without the comforts and the blessings of regular service on the Lord's day. Who can estimate the amount of good that is thus effected, even by one small grant toward the erection of a little 'Church in the Wilderness.'

STUDENTS AT KING'S CODLEGE.—The sum granted during the past year to this object of the Society is £105.

The two students who have for the past three years received aid from our funds, have finished their Collegiate studies, and are making further necessary preparation for the fulfilment of those intentions toward which they sought assistance.

Two more are now receiving some aid from the funds of this Society, and are preparing themselves for admission into Holy Orders.

It is our duty again earnestly to draw the attention of all Churchmen to the Collegiate establishments at Windsor.

Should the threat of withdrawing the Provincial grant be carried into execution, it will be incumbent on all children of our Church to make strenuous exertion for the support of an Institution, where the religion of Christ is recognised.

ASSISTANT MISSIONARIES.—The Society has but lately turned its attention to the partial support of assistant clergymen in the larger missions. This object was announced in the Report for last year.

The offer of this Society to grant £50 yearly where an equal sum is made up by the People, has been in several places thankfully received by both missionary and congregation.

Not much has indeed been thus expended. But this is owing rather to the want of laborers in the vineyard, than to unwillingness or inability on the part of the people to do their duty. In two places the money is now lying, ready to be paid as the first quarter's instalment to any assistant missionary whom they can obtain. One missionary, when making application for assistance in this object, writes "I am prepared to relinquish £50 of my own income, and to enter into any engagements to that effect, that the standing Committee may think necessary." The Parent Society in England has mest generously assisted these efforts by granting another £50.
