RUSSIANS' VICTORY OVER TURKS CALLED A GREATER FEAT THAN VON MOLTKE'S

German Had Advantage of Numbers and Good Roads When He Defeated French in 1870—Russians, Outnumbered, Fought in Snow-clad Mountains.

London, Jan. 9.—The Times' Petrograd correspondent telegraphs as follows: "The military critic of the Russoslovo declares that the crushing defeat of the enemy at Sari Kaunisch overshadowed the achievement of General Von Moltke, when he overpowered the French army in 1870."

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INDUSTRIAL COMMISSIONER TELLS OF YEAR'S WORK

Result of Combined Efforts of His Department and Trade Board Shown in Report. Gordon Philip, London's industrial commissioner, has issued the following statement: I have been requested by the executives of the board of trade and industrial bureau to, as briefly as possible, summarize some of the more important promotional activities of the board of the city as a whole, which have been undertaken since the city council, in the latter part of 1913, enlisted the cooperation of the businessmen of the community in plans for civic advancement.

Helped Smaller Industries. Assisted some smaller industries to establish here, which in the past had been unable to do so. Organized patriotic citizens' meetings on Monday, August 21, in the Masonic Hall, at the address of London's most eloquent speakers.

Organized a conference at London and suitably entertained the mayors of twenty cities, delegates and council representatives (March 26 to 28, 1914). Prepared, for the first time in years, a complete list of London's factories and manufacturing concerns.

Organized a "Made-in-London" exhibition in the store windows and streets of the city during Old Boys' week, in which the majority of merchants and manufacturers gave hearty co-operation.

Prepared and issued thousands of pamphlets to inquirers and others sent forth by London's manufacturers and exporters.

Prepared twelve handsomely-framed photographs of London's streets, parks, public utilities and industries, which were exhibited in Toronto—the town planning and advertising conventions.

Secured cover and inside space in "Opportunities in Ontario" for 10,000 copies of which will be distributed by the Dominion Government at the Panama Pacific Exhibition this year.

Brought Excursions Here. Secured through the cooperation of all railway lines entering London and the London Street Railway, certain privileges to facilitate excursion parties to Springfield, which brings thousands of large excursions to London during the summer months.

Formulated a plan to assist technical and vocational training, which, with a standing committee, and the indorsement and co-operation of the board of education and the approval of the Provincial and Industrial School Inspector, will be inaugurated here for the purpose of interesting boys in their life's work.

Prepared publication showing trade opportunities for London manufacturers in the United States. Assisted foreign families to reunite in London, adding 67 new citizens to the population and resolving the comparative trade openings which have found market in this city, and direct communications from Canadian trade commissioners and British consuls throughout the world, to whom lists of local manufacturers were forwarded with request for specific information regarding trade openings.
