BERLIN, May 24.—In the Reichstag yester-day the President read a letter from Prince Bismarck endorsing a telegram from the Italian Chamber of Deputies to Premier's Orispi congratulating him upon the reception accorded to King Humbert in Berlin. The President proposed that the House express its pleasure at the existing miversal peace and security ansing from the triple alliance. Baron Frankenstein, for the Centre party, concurred in the proposal with the reservation that the approval should not commit the Gentre party upon the question of the tem-poral power of the Pope.

Fresh Evidence Against Boulanger. PARIS, May 24.—The Boulanger Commis-sion has obtained more documents bearing on the case. The discovery of these papers makes necessary the summoning of additional

LONDON, May 24.—The relations between Russia and the Vatican are again strained. The Pope declined to nominate Polish and Russian bishops at Saturday's consistory.
