THE CENTRAL IDEA OF CIVIC REFORM.

Sheppard of the Grand Opera House that the theatrical managers all over America had united to refuse to perform any pirated presentation of a copyrighted play and the result was that playwrights were fully protected.

The decline in Street Railway stock to 75-80 on Saturday was no surprise to Toronto operators. It was a result of a good deal of stock being bought here and there at a ten per cent. margin.

The strength of the Ontario wheat markets is a puzzle to millers and dealers. White wheat sold on Saturday at 76c to 74c on this market, and at 80c to 78c in the west.

Banks during the week declared their semi-annual dividends, which are unchanged with the exception of Ontario, on which the dividend is reduced 1-2 per cent.

He told his attorneys that he knew the murderer of Blanche Lamont, but that he would not name him. He informed his lawyers that when he ascended the pulpit, he saw the body of Blanche Lamont, and that he saw the murderer.

TO STOP THE HYAMS TRIAL

REMOVED APPLICATION FOR THEIR RELEASE FROM WASHINGTON.

Mrs. Hyams Now in a Toronto Private Hospital—The Crown Will Seek a Decision from the Full Court as to Granting Evidence Concerning Insuring Her Life.

The trial will open on Tuesday, Nov. 6, before Judge Ferguson, and the amount of new testimony will be introduced, which will extend the case beyond the 15 days it occupied at the first hearing.

The Crown officials are busily working up evidence, with a view to introducing testimony as to the attempt to insure Mrs. Hyams' life. An application will be made before the Supreme Court during the week to admit this evidence.

Should the decision be favorable to the defence, and in the event of an acquittal of the twins on a charge of murdering Wells, they will be prosecuted on a charge of conspiring to murder Mrs. Harry Hyams.
