BYE-LAWS OF THE INCORPORATED DIOCESAN CHURCH SOCIETY.

1st. At all meetings of the Society or its Committees, before entering upon business, the "appointed prayers" shall be said.

2nd. His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor for the time being, if a member of the Church of England, shall be respectfully requested to be joint Patron of this Society, with the Societies for the Propagation of the Gospel, and for Promoting Christian Knowledge.

3rd. The Bishop of the Diocese shall be President of the Society, and no alteration shall be made in the Bye-Laws, nor any proposition be adopted by the Society or Executive Committee thereof to which his dissent shall be expressed, until the same shall have been submitted to the next Annual general meeting of the Society, and if such alteration or proposition be again adopted at such other meeting, it shall then take effect notwithstanding such dissent.

4th. The Archdeacon of Nova Scotia shall be the first of the Vice Presidents, whose number shall be limited to seven. There shall be also a Secretary, an Assistant Secretary, and a Treasurer.

5th. All members of the Church are invited to unite with the Society as Subscribers; and every Clergyman licensed by the Bishop, and all Lay-members of the Church of England subscribing not less than Five Shillings annually, or Ten Pounds at one payment, shall be members of the Incorporated Society, and entitled to vote at all meetings of the same. But no Subscriber shall enjoy any of the privileges of an Incorporated Member, whose subscription is more than one year in arrear. The annual subscriptions shall be considered due upon the first day of January in each year.

6th. The Executive Committee shall consist of the President, Vice Presidents, Secretary, Assistant Secretary, and the Treasurer of the Society, who shall fill the same offices in the Committee; of all Clergymen licensed by the Bishop of the Diocese; together with twenty Laymen to be chosen as here-

after provided; and such other members of the Society as may be chosen by the Local Committees, according to the ninth Bye Law.

7th. An Annual meeting of the Society, open to all its members, shall be held at Halifax in the month of October, or at such time as the Executive Committee shall appoint; at which meeting the vacancies in the Executive Committee shall be filled up, the Secretaries and Treasurers shall be elected, and any vacancies in the number of Vice Presidents may be filled up at the pleasure of the Society. A Special General Meeting may be called at any time when the President, or, in his absence, two or more Vice Presidents, or the Executive Committee, shall consider it desirable to appoint such Special General Meeting.

8th. The Executive Committee shall meet monthly during the year, with the exception of July, August, and September; and a Special Meeting may be called by the President, or in his absence, by a Vice President.

9th. The Members of the Church in every part of the Province, are invited to co-operate with the DIOCESAN CHURCH SOCIETY, by forming Local Committees under the direction of their respective Clergymen, either in each Mission or Parish, or in more than one Mission or Parish united, as shall be deemed most convenient, and in strict accordance with the designs and Rules of the DIOCESAN CHURCH SOCIETY. Every Rural Local Committee shall have the power of appointing any one member of the Society to be a member of the Executive Committee. It is recommended to the Local Committees to forward their funds, as they may be collected, to the Executive Committee, who will faithfully apply them to the general objects of the Society; but when the Local Committees desire it, they shall receive Books at cost and charges, to the amount of one-fourth of their remittances, or the said one-fourth may be placed in the hands of the Endowment Sub-Committee, for the benefit of the Parish or Mission where the money was contributed.

10th. The following objects shall more particularly engage the attention of the Society, as soon as their means may enable them to afford such attention:—

- 1.—Provision for Clergymen.
- 2.—Missionary visits to neglected and destitute places, under the direction of the Bishop.
- 3.—Assistance to the Endowment of Parishes.
- 4.—Assistance to the erection and enlargement of Churches and Chapels belonging to the Church of England, in peculiar or extreme cases.
- 5.—Supplies of Books and Tracts published by the Society for Promoting Christian Knowledge, and such other Books and Tracts in strict conformity with the principles of the Church of England, as having been first carefully examined and approved by a Committee of Revision, to be appointed by the Executive Committee, shall then have received the approval of the Executive Committee; and, lastly, the written approbation of the Bishop.

- 6.—Assistance to the erection of Parsonage Houses.
- 7.—Assistance to deserving young men, desirous of being qualified for the Ministry of the Church, but requiring aid in pursuing their studies at the Collegiate Establishment at Windsor.
- 8.—Aid to Sunday and other Schools, in which due attention is paid to instruction in the principles of the Church of England.
- 9.—Encouragement to the instruction and training of respectable Teachers for Sunday and Daily Schools.
- 10.—Upholding, by all possible and proper means, the Collegiate Establishments at Windsor.
- 11.—It shall also be one of the objects of the Society to provide for the Widows and Orphans of deceased Clergymen, and for superannuated and incapacitated Clergymen; but no part of the Society's funds shall be appropriated to these objects, except such as shall be specifically given and paid into the Society therefor.

To these objects, generally, the contributions will be applied; while those who desire it may have their individual contributions scrupulously confined to any one or more of these objects. And as some Members of the Church, who are not unmindful of the great spiritual wants of their own neighborhood, still feel constrained, in pious gratitude for the blessings they enjoy, to allot something, however small, from the means with which a gracious Providence has blessed them, towards the spread of the glorious Gospel among the nations which still sit in darkness—

11th. This Society will gladly receive and forward to the Society for the Propagation of the Gospel whatever sums may be given for the conversion and instruction of the Heathen; to which object such sums will be strictly confined by the East India Committee of that Society.

12th. The Accounts of the Society shall be closed on the 31st December in each year, and shall be audited in one month from that time, by auditors to be appointed by the Executive Committee.

13th. An Annual Sermon shall be preached before the Society. The Preacher, time, and place, to be appointed by the President.

14th. At each Annual Meeting of the Society, the first five on the Executive Committee shall go out of office; but all or any of them shall be eligible for re-election. The new Members shall be first proposed and seconded, then elected by ballot and placed at the bottom of the list.

15th. None of the above Bye-Laws shall be altered, except at a General Meeting of the Incorporated Society; and a full year's notice of a proposal to change any of them must be given previous to the meeting at which the proposed alteration is to be effected.

O merciful God, who hast made all men, and hatest nothing that Thou hast made, nor wouldest the death of a sinner, but that he should be converted and live, have mercy upon all Jews, Turks, infidels and heretics, and take from them all ignorance, hardness of heart, and contempt of Thy Word, and so fetch them home, blessed Lord, to Thy flock, that they may be saved among the remnant of the true Israelites, and be made one fold under one Shepherd, Jesus Christ our Lord who liveth and reigneth with Thee and the Holy Spirit, one God, world without end. Amen.

K.—“That members be at liberty to apply for Books at non-member's price, for any purpose; but that no member be at liberty to apply for Books, on the terms of the Society, except for his own use and distribution, or for sale to the poor, or for the use of charitable institutions with whom he is locally or parochially connected; and that a printed copy of this Rule be annexed to the printed form of application for Books.”

REPORT.

MANY inconveniences seem to have attended the issue of the Report of the preceding year, after the Annual Meeting of the Society in October. These the Executive Committee hope in some measure to remove, by publishing its Report at an earlier season. If the present experiment be found to succeed, the month of May will, in future, be considered the regular time for its publication.

It is hoped that this change will be generally satisfactory to the country Parishes, *whose convenience is especially considered*, and that the timely distribution of the Report will enable every Local Committee to send in its annual return before the appointed time, viz., March 31st in each year. The necessity of punctuality in making these returns will be apparent, if they are to be included in the Report.

Under the present arrangement the Report will contain the Society's accounts up to the end of the preceding year, together with an abstract of the proceedings of the Executive Committee since the last Report was issued. It will also contain a notice of the returns sent in by the several Parishes and Missions before the 31st of March next preceding, and the lists of subscribers accompanying these returns, (thus affording a pretty near estimate of the Society's prospects for the year in which the Report is issued,) together with such other information connected with the Society as may be thought useful or interesting to Churchmen generally.

The Committee have the satisfaction of stating that the income for general purposes during 1860 was larger than in any former year—amounting to £977 8s. 2d.; and it is to be observed that this sum does not include the fourths of remittances retained for the endowment of Parishes, amounting to £222 1s. 4d. more.

WIDOWS' AND ORPHANS' FUND.

The W. & O. Committee have reported that although there are still several Parishes where collections for this fund have been omitted, yet they have been more generally attended to than in the previous year. The amount received during 1860 was :—

The total amount at present belonging to this fund is about \$10,600.

The Committee have therefore felt themselves warranted in increasing the pension to £35 per annum, and they confidently hope that before long it may be still further increased, provided the Parishes make their collections generally and regularly.

A recommendation to lengthen the time during which orphans may draw the pension, is now before the Society, to be considered at its next meeting.

There is still but one pension paid from the fund.

SUPERANNUATION FUND.

The Executive Committee wish still to keep this object of the Society before the minds of Churchmen, and they hope soon to be able to recommend to the Society rules for its management, and to take active measures to increase the fund, that the plan may go into operation.

ENDOWMENT OF PARISHES.

To this fund there has been added £510 7d., of which £222 1s. 4d. is the amount of fourths reserved by the Parishes; £206 5d. has been sent to the Society in trust, the remaining £81 18s. 10d. is the interest of money invested for this fund, together with several small contributions.

There has been returned to Truro £86 8s. 5d., and to Annapolis £18 8s. 9d., being the amount of their reserved fourths, to be invested for the benefit of the incumbents. There has also been paid to the incumbents of Digby, Newport, Cornwallis and Horton £51 3s. 4d., as the interest of money held in trust.

CHURCHES.

During 1860 the Committee have paid the second moiety of a grant to the Church at Conquerall, £5; the first moiety to Country Harbor, £6 5s.; and the second to Lakelands Church, £12 10s.; in all, £23 15s.

The remaining £71 10s. has been paid to aid in the support of Missionaries at the following places, where the salary did not otherwise amount to £150 per annum, viz.: Weymouth, Newport, Sydney Mines and Rawdon.

There is at present one vacancy in the usual number of Missionaries to whom the Society pays £50 per annum.

The Rev. J. Breading, who for many years has worked with unwearied patience and zeal on the rough coast of the Eastern Shore, has retired to a less toilsome scene of Missionary labor. His place has been supplied by a younger man, and the Executive Committee have made a grant of £50 per annum to the Mission toward the support of their clergyman. Mr. Breading has sent to the Society an account of his efforts for the spiritual good of the fishermen who people that Mission, an extract from which is appended to this Report.

The Executive Committee have also paid for printing the twenty-second Report, and for other usual and incidental expenses, £96 18s. 1d., leaving a balance in the Treasurer's hands of £374 13s. 8d., (equal to \$1498.74,) from which is to be deducted the balance of money voted for Missionary purposes, but not employed, £92 10s.; salaries to Missionaries, not called for in 1860, £220 10s.; unpaid grants to Churches, £27 10s.; vote to preacher of Annual Sermon in 1860, £5; bill for the use of Temperance Hall in

EXTRACT FROM THE REPORT OF THE REV. J. BREADING, BEAVER HARBOR,
EASTERN SHORE.

This Mission is of wide extent and somewhat indefinite limits, containing about 1,950 souls, of whom about 1,120 are Church members, young and old. The communicants number 108. There is a glebe of 87 acres belonging to the Church, but at present unproductive; also, a parsonage house, the value of which, to the occupant, is about £20 per annum. The people contribute in general about £43 10s. a year to educational purposes.

The number of baptisms by the Missionary in 1860 was 76; burials, 16. In the Mission there are four Churches finished, and the frame of a fifth on the site, beside which there are 11 stations attended by the Missionary.

The services in the Churches are, once in every third Sunday. Two stations regularly served every Sunday.

The numbers present vary, according to the locality, from 20 to 150, and are represented as very attentive.

The Missionary paid 451 parochial visits in 1860. The number confirmed at the last Episcopal visit was 51. There are four Sunday Schools, but much difficulty is found in procuring persons qualified to conduct them in some parts of the Mission.

There are also 5 day schools in connexion with the Church, 3 of which are deeded to the D. C. S.

The Missionary (who has been obliged to leave this arduous duty) thus recapitulates his work in 1860:—

RECAPITULATION.

By the hand of an over-ruling and preserving Providence I have been mercifully spared to see the close of the past, and the commencement of the present year, in which I have been graciously sustained in health and vigor, notwithstanding all the fatigue of body and anxiety of mind requisite to be called into action in attending to the daily duties of this extensive parish. For these favors and all others I desire to thank God, and still take courage to work on, even unto the end of my pilgrimage, trusting that I am not laboring in vain in the vineyard of my Lord and Master. As far as I am able to judge it is steadily progressing. As a proof of this, I find a greater interest is now taken in parochial temporalities by the young people, which was not the case formerly; and I feel persuaded, as the wants of the parish are being more developed, the younger portion of it will come forward to sustain its character. Many I know, that once never gave a mite to the Diocesan Church Society's fund, now do it cheerfully. Into this duty of giving a part of their substance, wherewithal the Lord hath blessed them, they require to be gently led, by degrees,—to reason with such as refuse or do it grudgingly as to the propriety of giving, by which, I venture to affirm, they will soon be induced to take a deep and lively interest for their Church, into whose bosom they were admitted at baptism. I would further state, for future encouragement, that the Eastern Shores of this diocese are to become one of the strongholds of the Church. At present, our noble Church Societies are doing a great work for them. Let that work be continued, in humble reliance on the wise Shepherd of the Church universal, then, ere long, greater and better results will likely follow. Never let us "despise the day of small things."

Parochial Visiting.

In this department of duty I am always engaged every time I leave home for any out-post service. These visits resemble the good seed strown around; much of it takes deep root in a fertile soil,—being watered from above, brings forth spiritual fruit. Many an opportunity I have had, during my residence on these shores, of testifying to the fact. Many a soul has been blessed; many a heavy, guilty-laden sinner, relieved; many a despairing one cheered, by ministerial visiting. God alone shall have the praise. I will mention one instance of this. A poor afflicted female member of the Church, residing at Marie Joseph, was for years bowed down with bodily ailment and spiritual grief—laboring under a severe nervous affection and other complaints. While the surveying vessel *Gulnare* happened to be lying in the Cove I solicited Dr. Stratton, surgeon of the ship, to visit her. His opinion was that she might continue in that painful state some few years, but, in all probability, it would soon terminate her mortal career. My principal object in visiting this afflicted one was to induce her to seek the Heavenly Physician for the cure of her sin-sick soul. Her only reply for some time was, her sins were great and she did not think they would be pardoned.—adding, the evil spirit was continually tempting her to destroy herself, and often she had to be narrowly watched, less his Satanic influence should prevail. Still I went on praying by her side every time I visited her, and, at leaving, I urged her to pray, too, when I would be absent. It was a difficult task to begin, but at length, being moved by a higher and holier power, she did so. Our prayers, I am sure, have been answered. She still lives, not a sufferer, as formerly, but,

comparatively, a hale woman,—and, what is more, thankful ; still a *praying woman.*

I will relate another case to show that parochial visiting is abundantly blessed. "He that soweth shall reap, if he faint not." A venerable female member of the Church, having attained the age of fourscore years, living at Necum Cheugh, once strong and active, now weak and blind, welcomes with many endearing words the Missionary as he passes to and fro, and stops for a time to read to her in English the precious Word of Life, which she, before she was deprived of natural sight, used to read in German. Much thankfulness is expressed by her for this little piece of service of reading, praying and speaking to her of a Saviour's love, enough to gladden his or any other heart which takes delight to administer comfort in sacred things to the poor and blind.

Deaths in the Parish.

And these have not been a few, among the old and young. In attending funerals, the Missionary invariably takes the opportunity of addressing those assembled on the uncertainty of life, and the necessity, at once, of preparing to meet God. He finds this method very serviceable, because some will attend a funeral that are seldom or never seen at public religious ordinances. But among such events as these, and the most appalling, is one among many others which happened in the Fall, to William Geddes and his crew, five in number, (*all Churchmen.*) Full freighted, returning from the Labrador, whither they had gone for a load of fish, (doubtless with joy and thankfulness,) when, lo ! they were suddenly overtaken by a tremendous storm, which soon engulfed them into a watery grave. But Geddes was a man daily serving his Maker, by sea and on the land, busy or not busy—therefore the Missionary may venture to affirm death had no terrors for him ; and his faith was such that he could safely commit his dear ones—though destined to embrace them no more on earth—into the hands of that Being who declares He will be "a Father to the fatherless and a husband to the widow."

Absent from the Parish.

I was absent from my Parish, on furlough, three Sundays in travelling to and from P. E. Island, and remaining there a short time, to attend to my own private business ; but my lack of service was supplied by Mr. E. Ansell, a divinity student of King's College ; also, two Sundays, necessarily taken in attending Synodical meetings in Halifax. At other times I was busily employed in the duties of my ministry.

Collections.

These are made every Sunday in my Churches, whenever there is service performed therein. They provide for contingent expenses. The Diocesan Church Society collections have been begun, but are not yet completed, as

Fisheries.

These have proved very unsuccessful to our Shore fishermen, which has left many of them in needy circumstances. I sincerely hope it may please the Giver of all Good to crown their efforts favorably whenever the time comes again to follow their weary, anxious employment.

Sunday and Day Schools.

This department of duty continually occupies my most prayerful thoughts and attention, because to see the rising generation growing up without a suitable education is invariably a sure sign that they can never fill any honorable, responsible position in society in which knowledge is required. And what is more important? To such it becomes difficult for the minister of Christ to impart the truths of our holy religion. Our schools, at present, are few in number, but those in operation have not only week-day but also Sunday teaching therein. Miss Tidmarsh's Sunday School, at the Narrows, is, I rejoice to state, in a most flourishing condition; and how can it be otherwise, having such a pious individual at its head. The same demonstration may be applied to the Sunday School at Salmon River.

Hoping the foregoing Report and observations may meet the approval of the Bishop and the Diocesan Church Society, whose servant I have the honor to be, I submit them with all due respect.

FROM THE REV. THE RECTOR OF SHELBURNE.

The interest of Churchmen is certainly being aroused in behalf of the Church, and they are seeing every day more clearly the absolute necessity of doing something for its support; and I really think this Endowment Fund has done more to open the eyes of the people to this necessity than any movement that has ever yet taken place in the Diocese. It certainly is not all that we could have wished, but still it is a great thing, and we must have faith in the Great Head of the Church sufficient to assure us that He will make all things work together for its good, and that He will cause even the wrath of man to praise Him. Let each do what he can, and leave the rest in God's hands, and then assuredly we may hope for the best.

FROM THE REV. J. FORSYTHE, TRURO.

The number of our people in this parish is but small, yet I believe they are quite willing, according to their means, to do their part in every good work. Their motto seems to be "Progress;" and I sincerely hope it may continue to be such. In 1859 our contributions to the Diocesan Church Society were

Besides, they have had a variety of local objects to attend to. They are not, however, weary in well-doing, and I have no doubt they shall know the truth of the Divine promise, "In due season ye shall reap, if ye faint not."

FROM THE REV. H. STAMER, MISSIONARY AT HUBBARD'S COVE.

Enclosed I send a list of names and subscriptions to the Diocesan Church Society from the Mission of Hubbard's Cove, amounting to £19 12s. 3d. This, I am happy to say, has exceeded last year's remittance by £4 17s. 9½d. I had, as on last year, to spend a fortnight going from house to house soliciting subscriptions, and a very unpleasant occupation it is for a clergyman to be continually asking for money; but, in this instance, a good deal of the unpleasantness was removed, as the several sums, for the most part, were given willingly. At the time I was collecting for the D. C. S. I opened another subscription list, to pay a debt of £120 due on the parsonage house, and after a few days I succeeded in getting on this paper 108 names, with subscriptions sufficient to pay off the debt in less than six years.

- 4.—The supposed cost of the building, the progress it has made towards completion, and amount of contributions on the spot in money or labor.
- 5.—The frequency and regularity of the proposed services in the Church.
- 6.—That all the sittings are to be free.

It is the wish of the Executive Committee that no Clergyman should, when building a Church, rely upon aid from this Society without first ascertaining whether it is in the power of the Society to grant any assistance.

All grants to Churches are made in the following terms, namely : That the first moiety be called for within one year, and the second within two years from the date of the grant. The first moiety may be obtained when the exterior is finished, the second when the interior is finished.

"The Endowment sub-Committee receive and hold any money given in trust to the Society for Church purposes, and pay over the annual interest arising from the same, when invested, towards the furtherance of the special object for which it was given."

"It is the opinion of the Executive Committee that it is the intention of the fifth Bye-law that the annual payment of five shillings to the general objects of the Society constitutes a member, but that any person may devote his money to any particular object which is recognized by the Society."

Form of Legacy.

"I give to the Diocesan Church Society of Nova Scotia the sum of _____, to be applied to the general purposes of the Society." And the receipt of the Treasurer of the Society shall be sufficient discharge for the same.

All donations of Ten Pounds and upwards are funded, and the interest only applied to the general purposes of the Society."

"The Society will not make its usual grant toward the payment of an Assistant Missionary appointed to a separate cure, unless the people there consent to pay *toward the Endowment Fund of their Parish or Mission* all the proceeds of whatever glebe lands may be in that parish."

At a meeting of the Executive Committee, October 19th, 1855, the following resolution was adopted :

"That in future all subscription lists received before the 31st March, in each year, will appear in the next forthcoming report, while those received after that date shall be omitted."

At a meeting of the Executive Committee, April 18th, 1856, it was directed :

"That if reservations and special donations are not mentioned at the time when the contributions are sent in from the Local Committees, the whole amount will be considered as devoted to the general interests of the Society."

The attention of the Local Committees is particularly requested to the above resolutions.

At a meeting of the Executive Committee in February, 1857, it was resolved:

"That in future but one sermon be preached before the Society at its Annual Meeting, and that the sum of £5 be offered to the preacher towards defraying his travelling expenses."

At a meeting of the Executive Committee, February 19th, 1858, it was

Resolved, That in future all applications for aid from this Society be proposed at one meeting of the Society and considered at the next."

PUBLIC MEETING.

A public meeting of the Society was held in the Temperance Hall on the evening of Tuesday, April 2, 1861.

The chair was taken by the Right Rev. the President at half-past 7.

The Hall was well filled by members of the Society, who appeared to take a warm interest in the proceedings of the evening.

After prayers, the Bishop addressed the meeting, giving a brief statement of the present position of the Society and its future prospects.

The first resolution was moved by J. R. Mosse, Esq., and seconded by A. M. Uniacke, Esq., D. C. L.:

"The Society desires to express its gratitude to Almighty God for the blessings which have accompanied its general labors, and particularly for the measure of success which has attended the effort to provide a permanent Endowment Fund for this Diocese."

The second resolution was moved by Henry Poole, Esq., and seconded by A. M. Cochran, Esq., M. P. P.:

"That while thankful for the improvement of our own Society, it is matter of gladness that recent events have inspired the hope that a 'great door and effectual' has been opened for the propagation of the Gospel in other lands."

A vote of thanks to the Bishop for his conduct in the chair, was moved by the Hon. Judge Stewart, C. B., seconded by J. Bourinot, Esq., M. P. P., and unanimously passed.

After singing the Doxology, the meeting was dismissed with the Episcopal benediction.

RULES OF THE WIDOWS' & ORPHANS' FUND.

The following is the 11th object of the Diocesan Church Society :

"It shall also be one of the objects of the Society to provide for the Widows and Orphans of deceased Clergymen, but no part of the Society's funds shall be appropriated to this object except such as shall be specifically given and paid into the Society therefor."

1st. In accordance with the above, the Society will open a special account for this object, to be called "The Widows' and Orphans' Fund." This fund shall be formed and consist of all subscriptions, donations, legacies, and other contributions, given and paid to the Society for this special object, and of all premiums received under these rules, and of all benefits arising therefrom; and this fund shall be held and applied to and for this particular object, and none other.

2nd. A standing sub-Committee of seven members shall be appointed, in whom, together with the Secretary of the Diocesan Church Society, (who shall be paid as Secretary of this sub-Committee,) shall be vested the whole management of this matter.

3rd. The Diocesan Church Society undertakes to pay, out of this Widows' and Orphans' Fund, the pensions which become due under the following rules.

4th. Every Clergyman of the Church of England within the Diocese wishing to avail himself of the benefits of this fund, shall, within six months from the 10th October, 1855, or within one year from taking orders, or from his admission into the Diocese, apply to the Secretary for a certificate of pension, and shall pay the annual sum or premium therefor, as hereafter mentioned.

5th. Any applicant, after such period of time, shall only be permitted to receive such certificate at the option of the sub-Committee, and upon such terms as they shall direct.

6th. The following shall be the rate of the yearly sum or premium payable by every clergyman applying for a certificate, according to his age at the date of his first application; it being understood that any parish or congregation contributing to the fund more than £2, then the excess be counted toward payment of the premium of the minister or ministers for that year:

7th. If any Clergyman marry the second time he shall pay the annual sum or premium for the age he may be when he marries the second time.

9th. If any person fail to pay the amount of his premium within forty days after the payment becomes due, all claim to the pension under his certificate shall be forfeited, and the same shall thereupon become null and void. But if he desire to have his claim to the pension renewed, it shall be in the power of this Committee to readmit him on such terms as they see fit.

10th. Permanent removal of the Clergyman from this Diocese to any place beyond the limits of British North America or the United Kingdom, except with the leave of this sub-Committee, expressed in writing, or under such conditions as they may impose, forfeits all claim to the pension.

11th. If any Clergyman shall go beyond the limits mentioned in Rule 10th, without the leave of the sub-Committee, he shall forfeit all claim to the pension.

12th. The widow of every Clergyman who shall have paid the annual sum or premium (subject to the above exceptions) shall receive a pension of £25 per annum during widowhood.*

13th. If at any time it is the opinion of the sub-Committee that the state of the funds will safely warrant their doing so, they shall have power to increase the amount of the pensions.

14th. If the widow die or marry again before the expiration of ten years from her husband's death, the child or children of her deceased husband shall receive the pension for the residue of the ten years. But no part of the pension shall be received by those children who have arrived at the age of sixteen years, if males, or eighteen years, if females, while those who are still under those respective ages will receive the full amount of the pension.

15th. If the wife die before the husband, his child or children shall, at his death, receive the pension for not more than ten years, under the above limitation as to ages.

16th. The pensions shall be payable half-yearly on the 1st day of January and the first day of July in each year, and shall commence on the first of these days which shall happen after the decease of each person holding a certificate, and terminate on the first of those days which shall happen after the death of the widow or child, or the happening of any other event by which, under those rules, such pension is to cease.

17th. The Clergy of Prince Edward's Island shall be entitled to participate in the benefit of this fund on equal terms with the Clergy of this Province.

18th. The certificate to be granted shall be in the following form, under the seal of the Society and the signature of the Secretary; and on the back thereof or annexed thereto shall be printed the above Rules.

19th. None of the above Rules and Regulations shall be altered except at a General Meeting of the D. C. S., after a full year's notice of the proposed change.
