## REPORT OF THE COUNCIL

### FOR THE YEAR 1893

The last annual exhibition was held in Montreal in the Gallery of the Art Association. The rule as to the exhibition of pictures previously shown was suspended owing to the necessary hanging of some works intended for the Chicago Exhibition. The total number of persons visiting the Gallery was about four thousand, the conversazione on the night of opening being attended by five hundred. Several pictures were purchased by the Academy and placed in the National Gallery, Ottawa. The sales in all amounted to over fifteen hundred and seventy six dollars.

At the annual meeting Robert Harris, R.C.A., was elected President. The other officers were re-elected.

The voting for the vacancies declared in the list of Academicians resulted in the election of John Hammond, painter, of New Brunswick, and D. B. Dick, architect, of Toronto,

The following were elected Associate painters:

F. A. Verner, London, England; E. Dyonnet, Montreal; W. Cruickshank, Toronto; E. Wyly Grier, Toronto; Ernest Thompson, Toronto; Mrs. H. M. Reid, Toronto; Miss M. A. Bell, Almonte.

During the past year grants for the support of Art Education in various cities were made by the Council as heretofore.

A selection of pictures for the Columbian Exhibition was made by a Committee appointed by the Dominion Government. The sum devoted by the Government to defraving the expenses connected with the Exhibition was not entirely sufficient to do so, even with much gratuitous The collection filled two rooms work which was done. in the Fine Art Building. There being no guarantee fund and the sum devoted to the purpose being so limited, it was found impossible to make a collection of the most important paintings produced in Canada for some years past. This the course adopted by other countries, in our case had to be abandoned. The Exhibition thus necessarily was of the character of those annually held here. It was, however, so marked an advance on what would have been possible in Canada some years since that it was felt to be gratifying to those taking an interest in the state of our Art. Five of our painters were awarded medals by the jury.

The Council at its last meeting declared vacancies for two Academician painters.

The next Annual Exhibition will be opened 29th March next in Ottawa, which for many reasons seemed to the Council the most suitable place.

The accounts of the Academy for the past year are submitted.
