# Shot Gallieni

Passengers on the French liner La fayette, which arrived in New York today, say it is generally believed in Paris that General Gallieni, "the savior of Paris," was killed by a traitor.

The story as told by the passengers s that a French officer was sent back from the front under charges of atmost vital importance to the Germans. He was taken into a private room by General Gallieni for examination. Those outside the room heard a shot nd rushed into the room, where they ound the general fatally wounded, hot by the accused officer.

This story is known to everybody in Paris, say the passengers, but the French War Office will neither affirm nor deny it. An official from the War Office was on the liner. He is Gustav Heslouis, and is here to purchase supplies. When he was asked about the memorial to the late Field Marshall death of General Gallieni he merely shrugged his shoulders and would neither affirm nor deny the story.






